Wisconsin Has 750 On Teacher's Pensions

MADISON, Wis., Nov. 8 (INS)—Wisconsin has 750 teachers retired on pensions under the state teachers retirement system with 550 of those receiving benefits under the old law enacted in 1911 and 200 under the law of 1921. At present there are 10,000 teachers contributing to the retirement system.

The teachers who retired under the old law have their choice of taking their payment under the provisions of either fund.

Under the present retirement system every teacher 20 years old or over, must submit to a five per cent deduction from the salary on every pay day. The money collected is placed in the state treasury in a special fund to the credit of the individual teacher and begins at once to earn interest, for the teacher at the rate that is being earned by the fund as a whole. Besides this the state makes a deposit on June 30 of each year to the credit of every retiring teacher. This deposit is based on the salary a teacher receives and also on the number of years he has been teaching.


