

Congress Confronted By Fiscal Dobbybrook

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House of Representatives today confronted the fiscal doings of the executive branch in a vote on a bill to cut off federal aid to states that do not comply with federal requirements for the use of federal funds.

The bill, known as the "Anti-Deficiency Act," would prohibit the President from spending federal money on any project or program if the state or local government has not complied with federal requirements for the use of federal funds.

The bill was introduced by Rep. James W. Thompson (R-Mich.) and is expected to pass the House in the next few days. It is expected to be passed by the Senate as well.

Rail Workers Get Pay Hike

WASHINGTON (AP) — The rail workers' union today won a 3.5 percent pay raise and a 10-cent-per-hour cost-of-living allowance in a new contract with the railroad industry.

The contract, which covers the period from July 1 to June 30, 1961, was negotiated by the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and the National Railroad Laborers' Union.

The new contract also provides for a 10-cent-per-hour cost-of-living allowance, which will be adjusted annually based on changes in the consumer price index.

Lynda To Be Wed At Sunset Time

WASHINGTON (AP) — Lynda Johnson and Warren G. Johnson today announced their wedding plans for a ceremony at sunset in the White House.

The ceremony will be held at 6 p.m. on Oct. 11, 1961, in the East Room of the White House. It will be the first time in 33 years that a presidential daughter has been married in the White House.

Lynda Johnson, 26, is the daughter of President Johnson and Lady Bird Johnson. She is currently serving as a volunteer in the White House.

Board 'Must' Keep Schools Open

Stenstrom Warns Of Legal Action

County School Board members face the threat of being removed from office if they fail to keep the schools open, School Board Attorney Douglas Stenstrom warned today.

Stenstrom and members of the board will meet in a special "workshop" session Wednesday night to plan strategy in the event the teachers walk out on Oct. 23.

Stenstrom told The Herald today the board is required to keep the schools open and any citizen can bring suit to make them (the board) do just that.

"Any board member can be removed from office who votes to close the schools," Stenstrom emphasized.

Stenstrom said it is his opinion that the board must pay teachers who do not resign, regardless if the schools are open or not and, that the board may be forced to go to court to carry through keeping the schools open.

The attorney recommends the local board join with other boards in bringing a suit on a statewide level to keep the schools from closing.

"It doesn't make sense to me for 67 county school boards to sue in 67 counties. Besides the expense to the taxpayers, we will have 67 court rulings which may be the same and, the result could be a legal entanglement which could play havoc with the present school system in Florida," Stenstrom said.

He urged an official ruling from Tallahassee before any court action is started.

Tucker Slapped On Budget

Staffing of Seminole County's portable hospital—in the event of a natural or man-made disaster—will be an obligation of Seminole Memorial Hospital, in the opinion of A. B. Peterson Sr., chairman of Seminole's board of trustees.

Peterson so commented this morning after it was learned yesterday the portable hospital, on loan from the U. S. Department of Health, will remain in Sanford.

Seminole trustees only last week authorized study of a new storage building which would include space for the portable hospital.

Sanford is losing its designation as a "high risk area" and is retaining its portable disaster hospital. These are pronouncements from Claudia Walker, health mobilization coordinator for the Florida State Department of Health.

Walker was in Sanford yesterday for a conference.

Move To Aid Mayfair Endorsed

Improvement of the present Mayfair Country Club facilities as a practical step in solving the golf country club problem confronting Sanford was endorsed today at a meeting of a special committee representing the Sanford Industrial Commission and the Sanford-Seminole Development Company.

Mike Wheelchel, owner of the present lease of the Mayfair property, told the committee that he had plans ready which would result in improvement of the present clubhouse and the construction of two tennis courts, a swimming pool and a handball court at a cost of about \$60,000.

After a wide ranging discussion of the needs for and the probable support of an entire new country club complex, the committee decided that a first move would be the endorsement of the Wheelchel proposal especially in regard to emergency reserve.

Anticipated revenues include cigarette tax, \$53,000 (up \$3,000 over the current year); utilities tax, \$28,000 (up \$3,000); franchise tax, \$9,000 (up \$600); road and bridge, \$5,028; fines and forfeitures, \$25,000 (up \$5,000); building permits, \$10,000; licenses, \$2,000; interest, \$500; miscellaneous, \$500, and \$28,000 carry-over surplus.
