Democrats protest ballot language

SANFORD — In an effort to change what they consider confusing language on the Sept. 10 Democratic gubernatorial primary ballot, Florida Democratic Party Chairman Bob Poe announced earlier this week that the party will seek emergency administrative action from newly appointed Secretary of State Jim Smith to change the ballot lan-

guage. Poe also said the party is considering legal action to change the confusing Democratic gubernatorial primary ballot language.

Party chairman says wording could result in another election fiasco

promised to take aggressive measures to address the Democratic Party's concerns.

Florida law allows a candidate for governor to run in the primary election without a designated lieutenant governor candidate as a running mate. Therefore, in absentee ballots already printed or sent out, the names of three Democratic candidates, Daryl L. Jones, Bill McBride and Janet Reno, appear with

Secretary of State Smith immediately the line beneath each saying, "Not Yet Designated."

> The problem is with the designation of the race. At the top of the section for Democratic candidates for governor, the wording states, "Vote for One Pair." Poe contends that this may lead voters to believe they should vote for two candidates rather than one gubernatorial candidate and the unnamed running mate.

Regarding costly changes, Seminole County was saved by the bell. Election Supervisor Sandra Goard explained that the county had ordered 6,500 Democratic absentee ballots. Only those going overseas were to be sent out Tuesday.

"What we'll do," she explained, "is insert what Secretary Smith has supplied us, and that should take care of any problems."

She said the other Democratic ballots have not yet been printed, and therefore the additional notations can be added without any difficulty.



"At college, you learn all about the different teaching methods, but they don't teach you about the simple things," Scheffer said. "For instance, they don't teach you how to take the children safely to lunch or to the clinic. There's also a lot of paperwork they don't tell you about in college." The two new Idyllwilde Elementary

School teachers were finishing some of that paperwork several minutes before their students arrived Monday morning. During an impromptu planning session, the teachers had to figure out how each student would get home at the end of the day.

Scheffer and Rhodes are two of three new kindergarten teachers at the Sanford school.

All-women work crew begins construction on Habitat for Humanity house

The weather cooperated beautifully recently as Linda Chapin, director of UCF's newly created Metropolitan Center for Regional Studies, officially gave the order to more than 30 women volunteers to raise the first wall on Habitat for Humanity in Seminole County's Women's Build 2002.

The all-women work crew began construction last month in

preparation for the wall-raising event at the future homesite of the "Betty Smith" family, located at 353 Daisy Ave. in Oviedo. The family's real name is being protected due to an abusive situation.

Joining Chapin were Diane Parker, president of the Seminole County-Lake Mary Chamber of Commerce and chairman of Women's Build 2002, and Shannon Hori of WESH NewsChannel 2, who co-emceed the morning's pro-

gram. Parker's daughter Sally, an accomplished young singer, closed the program with "The Star-Spangled Banner."

Many of Oviedo's dignitaries were on hand to help celebrate, including Oviedo Mayor Tom Walters, and councilmen Tom O'Hanlon, Dominic Persampiere, and Robert Dallari. In all, more than 70 VIP guests were welcomed to the celebration by Seminole Habitat's board chair Colin

Galloway.

This is Seminole Habitat's third women-built home. Nationally, more than 350 of Habitat's 100,000 homes were built by women crews since 1991, and 47.5 percent of those homes were built in partner-ship with women heads of households.

"This homebuilding project is a great opportunity for women to get together for some fun, fellowship, and - most important - to

offer some help to another woman who's in a tough situation," said Linda Chapin. Diane Parker agreed, and added, "I believe so strongly in the work to house lowincome families accomplished by Habitat for Humanity here in Seminole County, and around the world. I am also thrilled to be a part of this very special women's build that helps women accom-

Within 12 hours after my letter appeared in your column on May 30, I received a dozen phone calls and numerous e-mail messages. Two days later, letters started arriving.

Dear Abby With only my name and hometown, your readers tracked me down to tell me they had located copies of "The Desert Battalion" on

various book-search sites. One man had a copy he was kind enough to send to me; another had one because he was a personal friend of Mrs. Edward G. Robinson's and had actually accompanied the battalion on several trips to visit the troops in 1943-44; and a lady from San Diego named Betty called to say she had been one of the original battalion!

Amazingly, Mrs. Robinson's granddaughter also called. We talked for an hour about her grandmother's reminiscences of the battalion. We plan to correspond further.

I was able to order a copy of the book, which I have given to Mom; received another as a gift; and learned much about Gen. Patton's secret "Camp X" near Palm Desert, Calif. The Desert Battalion was the only civilian group to go there or know about it.

It's been an amazing experience, thanks to you, your readers, and the U.S. Postal Service, which delivered many letters to me addressed only with my name, city and state! DAVE KOHL, WEST LINN, ORE.

The Central Florida Zoological Society, Inc. has approved a \$1 admission fee increase and membership rate increase that went into effect Aug. 1. Admission will be \$8 for adults, \$4 for children 3-12 years, and \$5 for seniors, a nominal increase. Membership levels under the voting level will increase by \$10 and voting level will increase by \$25.

Admission rates have not increased since 1995. Memberships dues have remained the same since 1992 with the exception of the senior membership level, which was revised in 1996. "These remaining lots are located in Heathrow's last neighborhood, which we recently developed," DoBosh said.

But he's not ready to call it quits yet. DoBosh said Heathrow Land Co. plans to do themselves one better - in Lake County.

"At Heathrow Country Estates, we are putting 20 years of experience into designing the perfect luxury rural community," DoBosh said.

Located at S.R. 46-A and S.R. 46, Heathrow Country Estates is a smaller community, with only 323 home sites, but it could rival Heathrow in luxury appointments, including an 18-hole championship golf course designed by David Harman and homes that are priced from the mid \$300s to more than \$1 million.

DoBosh said he expects to start construction of the golf course and 100 home sites in the first phase at Heathrow Country Estates in the fall.

Fox & Jacobs plans new development in Sanford

The rapidly growing Fox & Jacobs Division (F&J) of Centex Homes has unveiled plans for two new residential communities in Central Florida - one in Sanford and the other in Kissimmee that was launched last month (July).

The two developments - the Preserve at Lake Monroe and Amberly Park in Kissimmee will total nearly 300 single-family homes when finished, but, more importantly, reflect the continued emergence of Centex' affordable housing division now in its fifth year of operations.

Last year Centex' F&J Division accounted for approximately 32 percent of the company's \$156 million in closed sales volume for its Fiscal Year (ended March 31, 2002) and is expected to have a greater impact on this year's sales efforts, says Division President Pat Knight.

In 2000 F&j accounted for about 18 percent of the company's Central Florida sales efforts and in 1999 it represented 13 percent.

"That's a substantial increase in a relatively short time frame but that's the direction we're tak- See Development, Page 5A

ing this division," says Knight. "F&J has carved out its own market niche and we plan to continue cultivating that niche."

Site development and presales are underway at Amberly Park, with model construction slated to start this month. Knight expects to break ground for the Preserve in late October, early November.



F&J will be introducing eight different one- and two-story floor plans on 50-foot home sites, featuring between 1,562 and 3,514 square feet of living area.. Pre-construction prices will range from the high \$120s to the \$180s.

Wetlands or conservation areas will surround approximately 50 percent of the homes. Amberly Park is a planned 89home community located at Boggy Creek Road and Osceola Parkway in Kissimmee. Amberly Park also will offer 11 different one- and two-story floor plans featuring between 1,562 to 3,515 square feet. Home prices will start from the \$130s and range to the \$180s.

Knight says that response to the new F&J development has been so strong that more than 200 prospective buyers already have been registered.

"F&J has had this kind of appeal since the division was launched in 1999," says Knight, "and why it will be playing a prominent role in our future homebuilding operations."

According to Knight, F&J has prospered because it addresses the affordable, entry-level segment of the housing market. It places a premium on squarefootage and cost, with home prices rarely topping the \$200,000 plateau. In most instances, construction is around \$48 per square foot. Large families are drawn to F&J because they are one of the few production builders offering five- and six-bedroom homes at moderate price levels.





The State Division of Elections is also undertaking emergency procedures for any ballots not yet printed to change the "Vote for One Pair" instructions that now appear on the primary ballot for Governor and Lieutenant Governor, to "Vote for One."

"We appreciate Chairman Poe's diligent efforts to bring this matter to our attention, as well as his willingness to work with us to develop a resolution," Smith said. "We hope that our prompt action will reassure Florida's voters concerning our unflagging efforts to make sure that every vote counts."



When it was time for the children to leave for the day, both teachers were prepared. As a result of their morning planning session, they knew which students were walking home and what bus numbers the others needed to find.





tice at their facilities. The intention of the law was to prevent hospitals from influencing doctor referrals to a hospital," Bair said. "If we could find a way to help them finance the malpractice insurance we would, but the Stark Law says we can spend no more than \$300 a year on a physician."

Smith said he believes the federal government needs to step in, not just to change the Stark Law, but to enact tort reform legislation to stem the annual increases for malpractice insurance premiums. If Congress is to debate the issue, then the campaign for the newly created 24th Congressional District offers insight into the arguments for and against tort reform.

The Tort Reformer

Florida Speaker of the House Tom Feency has long been a supporter of tort reform. During his days in Tallahassee, the Republican tried to enact legislation to limit the amount of punitive damages to victims.

"I think we have to set caps on damages," Feeney said. "I'm not talking about compensatory damages or out-of-pocket damages. You should be able to recover all of those damages, including the loss of ability to earn wages.

Instead, caps should be implemented on punitive or pain-andsuffering damages, Feeney said. He argues that punitive awards under the current system are arbitrary and based on emotion, not fact.

"The purpose for punitive damages is to discourage people from reckless or negligent behav-ior," Feeney said. "Is a quarter of a million dollars not enough incentive to discourage that type of behavior? If it's not, then no amount of money will be. Caps are the solution. It drives the trial lawyers crazy when you say that."

Feeney's Democratic opponent, Harry Jacobs, is a trial lawyer whose firm Jacobs & Goodman handles an array of personal injury cases. The Republican's comments may not drive Jacobs crazy, but he vigorously disagrees with Feeney.

"The insurance companies have done a wonderful job of blaming the trial lawyers for increases in premiums," Jacobs said. "That's simply not the case." Jacobs cites a Harvard University study that indicates in spite of sometimes large punitive awards, the number of instances of medical malpractice is eight times higher than the number of malpractice claims filed.

Jacobs would consider a malpractice tort reform bill if there were guarantees in the bill that medical malpractice insurance premiums would decrease "to a level that is acceptable to health care providers and remains at that level

"I'm not interested in a promise," Jacobs said. "It has to be in the language of the bill. It makes no sense for any American citizen to give up their right to redress without something in return. I want to know what the families get."

Comparing Costs

Jacobs contends that tort reform would not reduce the cost of medical malpractice insurance and said that premiums are fairly equivalent from state to state.

The studies I have read that compare those states with restrictive tort reform against those with less restrictive policies shows a

negligible difference in the cost of insurance," Jacobs said. However, a report by Medical

Liability Monitor showed that during 2001 premiums increased by 44 percent in states without caps on punitive damages, compared with a 12 percent increase in states with a \$350,000 cap. In California, which 25 years ago placed a \$250,000 cap on punitive damages, obstetricians and gynecologists pay between \$47,000 and \$58,000 for malpractice insurance. Doctors practicing those same specialties in

Florida pay as much as four times that much, with a low premium of \$108,000 and a high of \$209,000.

Jacobs also argues that medical maloractice insurers make a tidy profit and points to a 1999 survey by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners that reports malpractice coverage generates 14.2 percent profit while property/casualty insurance makes 8.2 percent profit.

ance companies," Feeney dissented. "If they were making a lot of

profits, you'd have more companies doing business in Florida. Instead, there are only two companies that offer medical malpractice insurance when just a couple of years ago there were 35."

Cooperation Required

Regardless of the numbers, Dr. Larry Alexander, medical director for Central Florida Regional Hospital, said doctors are "anger "You just can't blame the insur- and frustrated" at malpractice carriers and lawyers.

"They want to do what they

were trained to do, and that is practice medicine to make people better," Alexander said.


The blame game may help physicians relief a little steam, but scapegoating won't solve the problem, said Bair, the hospital's marketing director.

"This is the result of a lot of bad law making over the years, and it's going to take all of them -- doctors, lawyers, insurance companies and legislators - to sit down at the table and work out a solution," Bair said.





"I think it is the biggest class size-wise and probably the most talented," Kruczek said. "Only time will tell if that prediction will hold true. It has been a long summer, and I am glad that this day is finally here. We are excited and looking forward to evaluating these guys during two-adays."

UCF's varsity players reported Tuesday and two-a-day practices for the full squad begin tomorrow (Thursday). UCF will open the 2002 season August 31, on the road against Penn State.

THREE PROFESSIONALS

AMONG THE SIX ADDED TO HALL Three current professional athletes, including Pro Bowl quarterback Daunte Culpepper and PGA Tour winner Robert Damron, headline a list of six inductees in the 2002 class of the UCF Athletics Hall of Fame.

Two-time Super Bowl participant Shawn Jefferson, placekicker Scott Ryerson, volleyball player Renata Menchikova, and baseball player Tim Foskett round out the class that will be honored at an induction ceremony hosted by the Golden Knights Club at the Hyatt Regency Orlando International Airport Friday night Oct. 4.

"This is arguably the strongest class of inductees since the inaugural class," said Tim Leonard, Executive Director of the Golden Knights Club. "The induction ceremony should prove to be a wonderful evening for the inductees as well as the fans in attendance."

Culpepper was a unanimous selection for inclusion in his first year of eligibility. He played quar-terback at UCF from 1995-98 and set more than 30 school records as well as three NCAA records

during his career. He won the 1998 Sammy Baugh Trophy as the passer of the year in college football and was chosen along with Ricky Williams from Texas as the national Co-Player of the Year by the Sports Network. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings in the first round in 1999, and

was the starting quarterback for the NFC in the Pro Bowl in only his second year in the NFL. Damron played from 1991-94 before leaving to turn professional. He was a three-time honorable mention All-American and set the school record for the most wins in school history with five, including the prestigious invitation-only John Hancock All-American Tournament. He helped the team to two NCAA Regional berths and competed at the Regional as an individual the third year. He was the first from UCF to make it fulltime to the PGA Tour and the first to win a tournament there, defeating Scott Verplank in a play-

off at the 2001 Verizon Byron Nelson Classic. Jefferson played receiver 1988-90 and helped UCF reach the Division I-AA semifinals in 1990. He was drafted by the Houston Oilers in the 9th round in 1991, and currently plays for the Atlanta Falcons. He was a member of the New England Patriots' Super Bowl XXIX team and the Falcons' Super Bowl XXXI team. Now in his 12th year in the league, Jefferson has played in the NFL longer than any former Golden Knight. Ryerson played from 1980-83, earning All-

America honors in 1981 after leading the team in scoring with 62 points and kicking four field goals of 50 yards or longer. He set the school record for field goals in a game (4) and season (18), as well as 50-yard field goals in a game (2), season (4), and career (6). He is fourth on the list of career field goals with 32, and holds the school

record for points kicking in a game with 17. Menchikova played from 1995-97. She led UCF in kills and aces all three seasons while leading the team in digs in 1996 and '97. She is the career leader in kills (2,151), kills per game (5.85), and

digs per game (3.24). She owns the top five spots on the single-game kill list and the top two spots on the single-season kill list. She was a three-time first-team all-conference honoree and was named conference tournament MVP in 1995.

Foskett played from 1980-83. He became UCF's first All-American in baseball, doing so at the Division II level in 1983. He earned All-South honors in 1980, and also earned all-conference honors in 1983. He is the school's all-time leader in hits with 289, and is second only to UCF Athletics Hall of Fame member Tim Barker in career stolen bases with 92. He is also second in career sacrifices (28) and fifth in career batting average (.363).

The UCF Athletics Hall of Fame was established in 1998 to honor those individuals who, through their demonstrated athletics achievement or service, have distinguished themselves and the University of Central Florida. Nominees must be removed from UCF at least four years in the capacity they have been nominated in order to be eligible. The 16 current members of the UCF Athletics

Hall of Fame and a seven-member selection committee voted to determine this year's inductees after finalists were named. The selection committee, comprised of former UCF athletes, alumni association members, Golden Knights Club members, and UCF faculty and staff, chose 12 finalists from a list of nearly 100 nominees.

Hall of Fame bylaws state that each class should have no less than two and no more than five

members, but after the votes were tabulated the selection committee was deadlocked and chose to admit all six this year rather than split the class. The inclusion of this year's class brings to 22 the number of current members.

The induction ceremony begins with a reception at 6:30 p.m., followed by dinner at 7. The dress for attendees will be business attire. Tickets for the event are \$30 for Golden Knights Club members and UCF Alumni Association members, and \$40 for the general public. Corporate tables of eight are available for \$300. 

Main Street receives funds to boost budget

SANFORD - Officials from Sanford Main Street on Wednesday received a partial reprieve to the organization's imminent budget crisis.

Main Street is undergoing a reorganization following a series of contentious meetings in June and July. Infighting among the group's leadership about board member responsibilities and where Main Street should focus its efforts to revitalize downtown put the organization on the brink of disbanding.

Plans to update bylaws and overhaul the leadership structure are on track, and the full board of directors will meet Tuesday night to consider what action to take. While board members appear to have put their differences behind them, Main Street faces a money crunch that could hamper future activities.

Since its creation, Main Street has received the vast majority of its funding from the city of Sanford or the Sanford Community Downtown Redevelopment Agency (CRA). This year, the CRA agreed to a record \$90,000 in funding for the organization. Main Street used a large portion of this year's budget to hire Marlene Frith as executive director.

The CRA is in the process of hiring its own executive director to oversee redevelopment projects like drainage, power and lighting improvement along 1st Street and building a downtown parking garage. Those projects will consume most of the CRA's annual revenues, and funding for Main Street is expected to substantially decrease.

With monthly expenses at about \$5,000 per month and the fiscal year ending Sept. 30, some


