



WASHINGTON (AP) - A unanimous Supreme Court today declared that states cannot demand that newspapers give political candidates free space to reply to editorial at-

The court overturned a 61-year-old Florida law imposing such a requirement. The court said the law violates the First Amendment free press guarantee. Chief Justice Warren E. Burger wrote for the court, "The choice of material to go into a newspaper, and the decisions made as to limitations on the size of the paper and content and treatment of public issues and public officials - whether

fair or unfair - constitutes the exercise of editorial control and judgment.' He said the government cannot interfere with a news-

paper's judgment about what it publishes. In a separate case, the court ruled 5 to 4 that private individuals may sue news media for libel without proving reckless disregard for the truth, even when speaking on

The court thus refused to extend to private individuals the rule it has laid down for public officials and public figures. That rule requires that public figures prove reckless disregard for the truth by the media before they can sue for

John McLaughlin, addressing his comments to fellow Jesuit the Rev. Robert F. Drinan, D-Mass, said Monday that if Father Drinan is leaking secret material from the committee he should be disqualified.

### Impeachment Poll

NEW YORK (AP) - Pollster Louis Harris says 57 per cent of Americans questioned in a nationwide survey said they would favor the televising of impeachment proceedings if the House brings such action against President Nixon.

Harris said 37 per cent of those questioned in a survey earlier this month of 1,413 households said they would not favor the televising of such sessions.

### 'Cavalier' Gift

WASHINGTON (AP) - Sen. Robert C. Byrd, D-W.Va., says President Nixon's gift of a \$2 million helicopter to Egyptian President Anwar Sadat amounts to a "cavalier use" of tax dollars.

"The practice of foreign relations is at best a delicate art, and it occurs to me that efforts to purchase friendship in such a manner are questionable on their face," Byrd said Monday.

### Bill To Aid Farmers

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate has passed and sent to the House an open-ended emergency program of governmentguaranteed loans to hardpresed livestock and poultry producers.

Originally the Senate bill set a \$3-billion ceiling for the oneyear program, but this was eliminated shortly before final 82-9 passage. Also, a \$1 million limit on individual loans was cut to \$350,000 to make the legislation more acceptable to urban congressmen.

### Nixon Facing Mortgage

WASHINGTON (AP) - A White House spokesman says President Nixon is still working out how to meet a \$243,000 mortgage and interest payment due next month on his home in San Clemente, Calif.

Responding to reporters' questions, Deputy Press Secretary Gerald L. Warren also said Monday that Nixon has not yet paid additional 1969 federal income taxes listed by a congressional panel as amounting to more than

Warren said about the San Clemente mortgage and interest payment, due July 15: "I'm not sure how he's going to work that out. But I'm sure he'll meet whatever

Although the President is not legally obligated to pay the extra taxes for 1969-which the IRS said were underpaid-because a statute of limitations has expired Nixon said earlier this year he would pay them.

He has paid the 1970-72 taxes he was obligated to pay after an Internal Revenue Service audit of his returns

KHARTOUM, Sudan (AP) - Sudan's president ordered seven-year prison terms for eight Palestinian guerrillas convicted of killing two American diplomats and a Belgian envoy, then in effect freed them by turning them over to the Palestine Liberation Organization. A Sudanese court sentenced the guerrillas to life imprisonment Monday, but President Jaafar el Numairi immediately reduced the terms. An official source said the eight men were flown out of the country and delivered to the PLO in an unnamed country. They were convicted of killing U.S. Ambassador Cleo Noel, his assistant George C. Moore, and Belgian Charge d'Affaires Guy Eid at the Saudi Arabian Embassy in March 1973.

**IRA** Torture

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (AP) - Irish Republican Army terrorists imprisoned in Northern Ireland have tortured fellow prisoners in a hunt for "The Mouth," an informer who has betrayed at least eight guerrilla leaders in the past month, military sources reported today. Three IRA prisoners have been found tortured, the sources said. Prison and police authorities declined to comment on the reports. The hunt by the IRA's Provisional wing began a few weeks ago after the army captured two brigade commanders, half a dozen other top guerrillas and an IRA headquarters in a fashionable part of Belfast.

Mexican Price Freeze

MEXICO CITY (AP) - The Mexican government has ordered a price freeze on all basic consumer products until Jan. 1 in an attempt to check the country's 22 per cent inflation. It also agreed to study a labor demand to link wage increases to the cost of living. A spokesman for the president's office said the freeze would apply to clothes, shoes, household appliances and food.

Guru's Taxes Probed

DENVER, Colo. (AP) - Guru Maharaj Ji's Divine Light Mission is being audited by state and local agencies to see if purchases ranging from underwear to an oceangoing power boat were proper under the mission's taxexempt status as a religious organization. The Colorado Department of Revenue and its counterpart at the city and county level announced the investigation Monday.

At issue is whether the mission should have paid Denver's 61/2 per cent sales tax in purchasing its motorcycle and 56 cars and trucks. The fleet includes a Maserati, Rolls-Royce and three Mercedes-Benz autos reserved for the personal use of the 16-yearold guru. Tax officials said the exemption does not apply to indi-





With a threatened players' strike looming less than one week away, the two sides have been called together by federal mediator Jim Searce to continue contract talks broken off suddenly June 13 in New York. Other prime topics to be tackled at today's session are

the league's pension and insurance plans. The "freedom issues" formulated by the Players Association include abolition of the reserve clause, the option clause, the waiver system and a rule giving Commissioner Pete Rozelle the right to set the proper compensation for a club when one of its members plays out his option and signs with another team.

John Thompson, executive director of the NFI Management Council, bargaining agent for the owners, says the demands are excessive: "We are prepared to discuss modifications, not eliminations." Bill Curry of the Houston Oilers, president of the

Players Association, responded that "we have laid out our position and we are getting frustrated." The negotiations are slated tentatively to continue in Washington on Wednesday and Thursday, then return to New York next week.

The Players Association has announced plans to strike on July 1 if agreement on a new contract is not reached by
