# Prime Rate Pushed To All-Time High

NEW YORK (UPI) - Chase Manhattan Bank shattered previous interest rate records today by jumping its prime lending rate a full percentage point to 141/2 percent

Analysts said there was no previous instance when a major bank made a point-size increase in its prime rate. The full-point jump in the lending rate for major corporations indicated banks will push interest rates still higher in response to the tightening of credit by the Federal Reserve Board. The Fed over the weekend announced several moves intended to curb the nation's money supply in a bid to reduce inflation, including a 1-point increase in the discount rate - the rate charged by the Fed on borrowings by its member banks - and increased reserve requirements to stem speculation in the com-

it broke through the 12 percent mark. The previous high was set in the 1974 recession year. Since August the rate has climbed percentage points in less than four months. with the Dow Jones industrial average dropping more than 10 points in the first 30 minutes of trading.

#### Castro's Visit Causes

Concern Over Security UNITED NATIONS (UPI) — Cuban President Fidel Castro will address the U.N. General Assembly this week

on his first U.S. visit in 19 years — a guaranteed security headache for authorities. Coming about a week after Pope John Paul II, Castro will make his U.N. appearance either Wednesday or Thursday, a highly placed U.N. source said. "It will be one of the toughest security problems in the history of the

organization," the source said Monday. A State Department spokesman in Washington said there was "a firm decision" there be no private talks with Castro, even on the sensitive issue of Soviet troops in

There is concern about hostile crowds of Cuban emigrants and their supporters, with the problem of barring any of them from entering the building. Several thousand anti-Castro demonstrators massed outside the U.N. building last Friday.

#### Gold Halts Its Slide

By United Press International Gold halted its dramatic slide today by edging up in the London and Zurich markets, ending a decline in which it

lost \$13 dollars Monday. The metal opened at \$375 per ounce in London, up from Monday's close of \$374.50, and gained \$3 overnight in Zurich to open at \$375.50. In New York gold closed Monday

Monday's rush to sell gold was precipitated by the U.S. Federal Reserve Board's decision to support the dollar by increasing the federal discount rate, but analysts predict its continuing weakness if the Federal Board stands firm. Meanwhile, the dollar rose today in all leading money

#### 132 Lebanese Kidnapped

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) - A feud between the family of former Lebanese President Suleiman Franjieh and rightist Phalangists apparently escalated today with reports indicating at least 132 people have been kid-

At least 40 travelers - reportedly including seven members of Franjieh's family - were kidnapped on a highway in mountainous north Lebanon early Monday and Unconfirmed reports said as many as seven others may have been killed by the 30 unidentified attackers in Monday's incident. Police sources in Beirut said the fate of those abducted is still unknown.

#### Typhoon Rages, 6 Dead

MANILA, Philippines (UPI) — Typhoon Sarah raged erratically in the South China Sea today, leaving six dead and sending hundreds fleeing from their homes in the Philippines, officials reported. As the typhoon approached, a U.S. Navy tanker and a

#### Charges Filed Against Pilot

ATHENS, Greece (UPI) — Manslaughter charges were filed today against the pilot of the Swissair DC-8 that crashed and caught fire at Athens airport Sunday, killing

A spokesman for the public prosecutor said Capt. Fritz Schmutz, 45, a Swissair pilot for 18 years, would face charges of manslaughter by negligence, causing serious bodily injuries, and obstructing air communications. The pilot blamed surface conditions on the runway, but civil aviation sources said the plane had touched down almost halfway along the tarmac, "several hundred yards too far down for a safe landing."

#### Sweden Has New Leader

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (UPI) - Center Party leader Thorbjorn Falldin today became prime minister of Sweden, ending a three-week government impasse among coalition partners battling for the leadership and seats in the 20-member Cabinet. #### Senate Finance Committee Debates Windfall Profits Tax

WASHINGTON (UPI)- The Senate Finance Committee is wrestling with a major problem of its own making: how to pay for already approved tax credits costing \$30 billion more than the oil windfall profits tax would raise.

With pressure mounting either to cut credits or boost windfall tax revenues, several major fights appear certain this week as members who favor easing the tax on producers battle with colleagues advocating consumer credits for conservation.

The committee, hoping to complete work on the bill this week, must decide how much, if any, Alaskan North Slope oil to exempt from the tax. Sen. John Danforth, R-Mo., has sparked another certain battle by a proposal to lift the \$6.5 billion exemption for state-owned oil whose proceeds are used for public purposes — an important issue for Texas, Louisiana, and Oklahoma.

#### Stone Critical Of Carter

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (UPI)— President Carter has not done as much as he should to get the Soviet Union to withdraw its combat troops from Cuba, U.S. Sen. Richard Stone, D-Fla., the man who first denounced the troops' presence in Cuba, asserted Monday.

"We can use diplomatic, economic or technical ways and we don't have to announce them in a belicose fashion," said the Miami Beach Democrat in a speech before students of Florida Junior College. Stone said he doubted the veracity of reports that the Soviet troops had been in Cuba for as long as 17 years, and said his information shows the combat brigade of 3,000 Soviet soldiers arrived in Cuba just two to three years ago.

#### **Brown Defends Carter Moves**

MIAMI (UPI)—Defense Secretary Harold Brown says he is satisfied with President Carter's efforts to counteract the presence of Soviet troops in Cuba and regards the president's actions as a warning to the Russians. Although Brown said the United States has "convincing evidence" the Soviet troops have combat capabilities, he said Carter had "effectively neutralized the presence of the Soviet brigade."

Brown's remarks came Monday after he toured the new Caribbean Contingency Joint Task Force headquarters in Key West and then visited Miami and Jacksonville.

### Is U.S. Resolve **About To Crumble?**

A few weeks ago, President Carter told the American people that "we consider the presence of a Soviet combat brigade in Cuba to be a very serious matter and that this status quo is not acceptable." Two days earlier, Secretary of State Cyrus R. Vance declared that the United States "will not be satisfied" if the Soviet army brigade remains in Cuba.

It took less than a month for the administration's resolve to crumble in the face of Soviet intransigence.

Mr. Carter's televised speech to the nation the other night amounted to an acceptance of the continued presence of the brigade on Soviet terms. Now, the unacceptable has become acceptable. The world is left to wonder why the president

eschewed political and economic initiatives that could have squeezed the Soviets and provided them real incentives either to withdraw or at least disband the brigade. Instead, Mr. Carter outlined a series of actions remarkable largely for their impotence. Nothing in the empty "assurances" Mr. Carter said he received from Moscow will deflect the Soviets from their obvious desire to transform Cuba into an increasingly formidable fortress at the strategic mid-point of the Western Hemisphere.

The president plans to shuffle a few ships, planes and Marines around the Caribbean. These forces will conduct more frequent military exercises. And the electronic and photographic surveillance of Cuba, which Mr. Carter had foolishly suspended until this summer, will be increased — presumably to count troops and weapons whose arrival Washington seems helpless to prevent.

Otherwise, it's business as usual. The president reaffirmed his support for "detente," despite the fact that its observance seems confined Washington. He warned ominously of any return to the Cold War, although the Soviets appear never to have departed from it. Likewise, it escapes Mr. Carter's grasp that American interests and security were far less threatened during a time when this country acknowledged the Soviet threat and acted accordingly.

In sum, the Soviets have successfully breached the Monroe Doctrine which helped keep foreign fighting forces out of the Western Hemisphere for 150 years. In its place, Moscow has substituted a version of the Brezhnev doctrine which holds that Soviet military forces are free to act as they will in "fraternal socialist states" - in this case, Cuba.

And notwithstanding President Carter's warning that the United States would resist Soviet-Cuban intervention elsewhere in the hemisphere, his faltering response to the discovery of a Soviet combat brigade in Cuba will inevitably embolden Moscow and Havana to press their new advantage.

The settlement of the Palestinian question is the key to any hope of a durable peace in the Middle East. It was left to further negotiations a year ago at Camp David, where Israel agreed to return the occupied Sinai territory to Egypt in return for recognition of Israel's right to exist.

The deadline of May 1980 was set at Camp David for reaching agreement on the Palestinian issue. Every effort should be made on both sides to meet







#### Carter, Aides Cautious

#### On Brezhnev's Statement

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Carter and his top aides are indicating moderate interest but no great enthusiasm for President Leonid Brezhnev's offer to withdraw Soviet troops and tanks from Central Europe

"It's not quite as constructive a proposal as at first blush it seems to be." Carter told a nationally broadcast and televised news conference Tuesday. "I think it's an effort designed to disarm the willingness or eagerness of our allies to adequately defend themselves."

But he said both Washington and its European allies "are carefully assessing the significance of President Brezhnev's statement."

#### U.S. Warships Cuba Bound

NORFOLK, Va. (UPI) - Three Navy warships have steamed out of Norfolk for the U.S. naval base in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, for the biggest military reinforcement exercise there in a decade.

The exercise, part of a U. S. show of strength in response to the discovery of a 2,000 to 3,000-troop Soviet contingent near Havana, left Norfolk Tuesday carrying 1,700 sailors. The warships were to pick up 1,800 Marines in Morehead City, N.C., today and take them to Guan-

The exercise "is all part of President Carter's response to the Soviet troops in Cuba," said Senior Chief Roger Busby, a spokesman at the Norfolk Naval Base. "This will primarily be a demonstration of our ability to readily reinforce the base at Guantanamo Bay."

#### Cuban Exiles Plannina Castro Demonstrations

MIAMI (UPI) — Cuban exile groups in Miami say they will protest President Fidel Castro's visit to the United Nations later this week with a full-scale demonstration,

closing businesses and stopping work. Several anti-Castro groups are urging Miami's Cubans to close their businesses for a few hours during Castro's U.N. speech, stop work and stand in silence wearing black armbands when the Cuban leader begins his speech. Students are being asked to carry the Cuban flag to

### On Relief For Cambodia

. Word that Cambodian officials have agreed to accept international assistance to alleviate the famine spreading across their country is welcome

Fully half of Cambodia's decimated population of perhaps four million face starvation in a land successively ground to bits by civil war, a frightening brutal revolution, and, most recently, by Vietnamese invasion and occupation. The suffering of the Cambodian people has long since reached depths remarkable even in this bloodsoaked century.

The extensive relief program envisioned by the United Nations Children's Fund, the International Red Cross and a number of other humanitarian organizations could conceivably save two million

It is, however, far to early for anything other than the most cautious optimism. Until the recent agreement, it was apparent that Cambodian officials and their sponsors in Hanoi were quite prepared to sacrifice starving Cambodians if saving them meant compromising the expansionist ambitions of the Vietnamese Communists.

During two months of negotiations with U.N. and Red Cross representatives, the Vietnamese refused to countenance the presence of neutral observers need to administer the famine relief effort. In part, this reflected Hanoi's anger at the United Nations' continued recognition of the ousted Pol Pot regime as the legitimate government of Cambodia.

No doubt Hanoi also hoped to control the distribution of donated food and medical supplies as an integral part of its campaign to wipe out the anti-Vietnamese insurgents based in western and northern parts of Cambodia.

Mounting international pressure apparently forced the Vietnamese and their Cambodian clients to agree finally to an expanded U.N. and Red Cross presence inside Cambodia. It is anyone's guess how many Cambodians starved during this two-month negotiating desired. Judging from the evidence of famine in the capital city of Phnom Penh itself, conditions in the countryside must be truly horrifying. Tens of thousands may well have perished during August and September.

Significantly, U.N. and Red Cross negotiators were unable to presuade Cambodian and Vietnamese officials to put the terms of the aid agreement in writing. This may mean that the Vietnamese, whose 200,000 troops in Cambodia are beginning their anticipated dry-season offensive against insurgent forces, plan to interpret the verbal agreement in ways politically favorable to

Most assuredly, the Vietnamese will do everything they can to prevent any assistance from reaching civilians in areas controlled by guerrillas. It is also likely that the Vietnamese will bar U.N. and Red Cross access to areas involved in military operations. After all, any evidence of resistance undermines Hanoi's claim that its client govern-

ment in Phnom Penh controls all of Cambodia. The prospects, then, are for a famine relief program that will save lives in parts of Cambodia while the Vietnamese busy themselves with the task of killing guerrillas and starving the rest of the population into submission. The responsibility for the wholly avoidable deaths of these civilians rests directly with the cruelly cynical members of Hanoi's ruling politburo.



from the Christmas catalogs cascading America's mailboxes these days. Take one from a Texas firm, Sakowitz, for example. It offers a swimming pool shaped like Texas itself and filled with Perrier water for a metally \$127,174.32.

Like most of the catalogs, this one is filled more affordable products, but they are still on that are the earmarks of a prosperous society.
"If we're having a recession the stock market doesn't know about it," economic analyst Eliot Janeway told a friend the other day, a day on which the New York Stock Exchange traded more than 40 million shares. # Castro Arrives Amid Tight Security

NEW YORK (UPI) - Cuban President Fidel Castro came to America today for the first time in more than 19 years to address the United Nations and said "I'm glad to be in the United States."

Castro, who is expected to defend the presence of Soviet troops in Cuba in an address to the General Assembly Friday, flew into Kennedy Airport on a red-and-white. Russian-built Cubana airliner that touched down at 12:53

In an interview aboard the airliner, broadcast by the NBC television "Today" show, Castro joked about his

The interviewer suggested that what most Americans remembered about his last visit to New York City in September 1960 were his stay in Harlem and tales that members of his entourage plucked chickens in their hotel

Castro said with a chuckle that none of his aides plucked chickens in their hotel and, "I did not bring any chickens"

this time, although "Cuban chickens taste better than New York chickens." He said he did bring some lobsters "which I caught myself" in case he wanted to invite guests to dinner. Castro also said that he had been in New York in 1949 when he had no money.

"I still have no money," he said, adding that the only people to spend money on his current trip would be New York City authorities. "The police will spend money and the mayor's office, the city of New York." he said. Dressed in his uniform of olive-drab fatigues and smoking the ever-present cigar, Castro said he was glad to be here and got into a waiting car that took him to the

well-protected Cuban Mission to the United Nations. All along the route and especially around the Manhattan building where he is staying, hundreds of police and Secret Service men stood guard, part of the massive security precautions that included helicopters with special lights and police dogs that sniffed for explosives.

About 25 members of Alfa-66, an anti-Castro group, stood behind police barricades a block from the mission carrying signs reading "Castro Opens His Mouth, But Russia Does the Talking" and "Free Cuba Now." There were no incidents.

Secrecy surrounded much of Castro's two-day New York program, including all his activities today. But U.N. spokesman Rudolf Stajduhar announced Castro would spend most of Friday at the United Nations, starting with a 10:30 a.m. EDT meeting with Secretary General Kurt Waldheim and General Assembly President Salim A. Salim of Tanzania. The Cuban leader is to address the assembly an hour later.

# Lake Mary High To Cost \$3.23 Million More To Build

The entire cost to build the Lake Mary High School was estimated by Seminole County Superintendent William Layer at Wednesday's school board meeting at \$14,480,000 - \$3,237,000 over the base bid approved on Sept. 26. Layer said he was most "surprised" that a \$450,000 fixed equipment item was left out by the architect in the original bidding packet sent to contractors. Carl Gutmann, of the Sanford firm of Gutmann-Dragash Associates, said the firm "apologized" for the "misunderstanding" over the bid specifications.

Gutmann listed 11 items, totaling \$1,747,000, that were not included in the base bid awarded to Roger P. Kennedy, architect's responsibility to provide in the bidding packet that were left out were allowance items and the fixed

The allowance items for a signage and acoustical tuning system were left out because the state Department of Education would not accept any allowances on a general bid, Gutmann said. The fixed equipment was deleted to "allow time for cost effective research and coordination." Gutmann said. Pressed for time to get the plans to the state for advance funding by June 30, Gutmann said there was "no way" to discuss and design fixed equipment, such as complex scientific materials, before June 30. Layer explained there were "two deadlines for state funding," on June 30, and sometime in 1980. According to Layer, no school administrator since June 30 recom-

Colbert reported \$12,536,436 was borrowed for the Lake Mary project. Colbert concluded he thought the school district could afford the school during the two fiscal year periods involved with its building.
