SANFORD - Duoc Nguyen, too frail to stand on her own and needing support from her daughter Susan That, took an oath of allegiance Thursday to become an American citizen.

Nguyen, 78, was one of 395 immigrants from 62 different countries who took part in a Naturalization Ceremony at the Sanford Civic Center.

The polgnant event is sponsored by the Pilot Club of Sanford, arranged chiefly through the efforts of Patriotism Chairman Doris Stein. An American Legion Color Guard presented the flags. Sanford Mayor Larry Dale made a welcome.

"My mother is so very proud," said That, a NASA engineer who was educated at the University of Central Florida after coming to this country from Vietnam. "She was up early, ready to ride with me from Cocoa.'

The majority of the citizenship applicants arrived at the Civic Center an hour or

Volusia will handle coroner services for **Seminole County**

SEMINOLE COUNTY - In an effort to save money and offer Improved services, Seminole County has formalized an arrangement for Volusia County to provide all of its medical examiner needs.

The autopsy contract, which runs through September 2000, saves Seminole County the expense of building a new facility at an estimated cost of \$1.5 million, according to county officials.

Volusta County has been handling Seminole's medical examiner cases since October, 1998, on an Interim basis. Volusia's larger staff and facilities allow them to provide service at a lower cost.

"The big savings is in the capital costs to build a new morgue," said-Phillip Stalvey, Seminole County community services director, "Our facilities were basically inade-

Officials are projecting that 216 Seminole County autopsics will be performed in Volusia this liscal year, at a projected cost of \$313,200.

Seminole will pay \$1,450 for each autopsy performed. Fu-neral homes will pay \$30 for each cremation request. Volusia County is handling all examiner services, including using its transport contractor to collect bodies from Seminote County.

Seminole was able to afford one medical examiner, one morgue technician, and one forensic examiner. The county was renting space in Central Florida Regional Hospital in Sanford.

Volunia County has two medical examiners, a larger staff, and more high-tech facilities near Daytona, Stalvey

They have a state of the art complex and a larger staff than we do," Stalvey said. They're able to offer better service at lower cost. By doing this we're able to improve the level of service and save tax dollars,"

Tuskawilla parents lose rezoning battle

SEMINOLE COUNTY - A sca of red shirts filled the chamber of the Seminole County School Board on Thursday during a work session on rezoning elementary schools in the Winter Springs and Oviedo

Almost 200 Tuskawilla parents fought a losing preliminary battle with the board to keep their kids at Keeth Elementary School during public input on four plans presented for consideration.

The board, in a preliminary determination, however, voted 3.2 to move the children in question, leaving about 50 parents in the Winding Hollow subdivision satisfied with the decision.

More public input is expected at the next school board meeting on April 13, before a final vote by officials to adopt the plan they supported last night, which disperses students from Keeth to the Rainbow, Winter Springs. Lawton and Stenstrom elementary schools.

According to executive di-rector of elementary educa-tion, Geraldine Wright, board chairman Larry Furlong and board member Diane Bauer dissented in favor of a plan no more amenable to the Tuskawilla parents.

Furlong started the meeting with the question, "How many of you, in your decision to purchase your home or frent your apartment, had in mind the school your children would attend as a consideration?" All the parents present stood in unison.

The parents, however, take issue with the way the numbers are being manipulated, citing that future and not present attendance figures will more accurately distribute Please see Schools, Page SA

Chuluota residents hear Maloy speak

CHULUOTA - A town hall meeting with Commissioner Grant Maloy at the VFW Hall in Chuluota became heated Thursday during discussions of the CRG development off Snowhill Road, near the future Chuluota Bypass.

Maloy met with about 60 Chuluota residents in a town hall meeting sponsored by the Southeast Seminole County Voters Association.

Several residents expressed concern that the 364-home development, approved last month by the County Commission for up to four homes per acre, could lower their property values, harm the envi-ronment, and disrupt their rural lifestyles.

"It seems that the Commission just does what it wants to do regardless of how residents feel," Chuluota resident Bill Adkins said. "Where does this

Maloy said that the development is reasonable, and he does not believe it will harm the property values of neighboring residents.

"I try to look at whether a development will have a negative impact on next door neighbors," Maloy said. "If it will, I vote against it. It's important to protect the rights of property owners,"

The state is reviewing preliminary plans for the devel-opment, approved by the Commission last month.

North of the Chuluota Bypass, the Commission approved development of 2.5 homes per acre for the CRO development. South of the bypass, the Commission approved 3.7 homes per acre. Around Magnolia Lakes, the Commission approved homes per acre, county staff Please see Maloy, Page 3A



Construction of the development will not begin until the future. Chuluota Bypass is complete. Construction on the Chuluota Bypass is scheduled to begin in July, and there is

no planned completion date.

There is a planned public elementary school near the CRG development. The school is not funded to be built within the Seminole County School Board's current five-year plan.

Chuluota resident Bob Whitmer said the development would be a "stimulus for further urban growth," and that it is not compatible with some of the neighboring properties. He said the development would lower the value of large lots on the east, and a few on the west,

"If it starts a trend, every lot on one to five acres will be effected," Whitmer, who lives on a five acre plot, said. "That's the problem. A lot of homeowners like myself see this as a trend."

Several residents asked Maloy if it is possible to place a moratorium on further development. Residents also asked if they can start a petition drive to prevent zoning changes in their agricultural/rural area. Maloy said he would need to ask the

county attorney about that.

Maloy also addressed issues such as road construction, paving projects, and drainage problems with the residents. The county is initiating a project to pave dirt roads. Construction on Curryville Road is set for July/Aug., and the four-laning of County Road 419 is scheduled to begin in June.

During his "State of the County Address," Maloy said that he opposes extending the so-called "penny tax" when it expires in September 2001. It would take a vote by county residents to extend the tax, which has funding a 10-year road baseling project since 1991.

Maioy said he opposes the county subsidizing a proposed hotel/conference center on Sanford's lakefront. He said he is bothered by questions on whether Sanford or the County would take ownership of the conference center, and over "who would be responsible for the debt if this thing doesn't turn out."

"From what I've seen so far it looks like a real bad deal," Maloy said. "Very few details on it, yet we're chipping in \$10,000 on it [for a county feasibility study]."



The man who saved the game

He looked like God. And his detractors would say he acted

Kenesaw Mountain Landis wasn't your genial George Burns-type of deity. He was Old Testament. Moses would have recognized him right away on Mount Sinai, During his 25 years as high commissioner of baseball, players, managers and club owners alike feared him.

Autocratic and possessing patriarchal sternness, he restored integrity to the national pastime after the 1919 World Series scandal. He was known for his uncompromising stand against any conduct he regarded as damaging to the sport, and no one questioned his authority.

When he died in 1944 at the age of 78 (still the "czar" of baseball after nearly a quarter century). The Sporting News said of him: "At times he may have been arbitrary and selfwilled. But Kenesaw Mountain Landis put the fear of God into the game's weak characters. Just knowing that the whitemaned Landis was in the commissioner's seat kept them righteous.

Baseball under Landis was the cleanest during any time in the game's history.

Today we tolerate it when a big-league player spits in the umpire's face or saws his hat in half and fills the hollow part with cork to make the ball go farther.

Judge, the world of sports hath need of thee now. We need not only an ironfisted commissioner of baseball, but a commissioner of all sports who will crack down on the assaults, the drug use the greed and the hoodlum element that is taking over our parks and stadiums.

The bribes and graft and payoffs have now reached all the way up to the oncepristine Olympic Games ruled by Zeus--next to Landis, the most feared of the gods. But today "the Olympic

Games have become a sham." writes novelist Alexander Theroux after reading of the scandals over buying and selling cities vying for the 2002 Olympic Games.

Theroux recalls an afternoon in 1996 when the American volleyball team was playing Brazil for the Olympic gold medal.

"Players, red-faced and snarling at their opponents, were making obscene gestures all through the matches," wrote Theroux, "while parents up in the stands, waving their countries' flags, were shouting at every call, cursing not only the officials but the opposing players' parents.

If Landis had been there he would have ordered the guilty perpetrators into the patrol wagons and hustled them off to the hoosegow.

A rabid fan himself, Landis was the fans' commissioner. He wouldn't allow someone's disorderly behavior spoil an afternoon or evening's

have heard people say, How I wish I could have been there on the first Easter," "Wouldn't it have been great to have seen it for yourself, an eyewitness? They assume that their problem with the resurrection is being two thousand years away from it. If they could have run to the empty tomb themselves, they think that belief would be easier. Yet such a view denies the way in which the gospels tell about the first Easter. Was it easy for those who were eyewitnesses. Not really. They saw an empty tomb, but what did that mean? It might just as well have meant that someone had stolen the body of Jesus. The gospels report

the first Easter as an occasion for fear, disbelief and incomprehension. Easter is ike that. What we have here is not so much a problem of history, the gap between our time and the time of the first Easter. What we have here is a problem of faith. Not faith as blind belief in something. but rather faith as the ability to trust even that which we do not have the equipment to comprehend. The problem is not one of time, a gap between our modern time and their premodern time. The problem is faith in God's ability to work life from death.

It is asking a great deal of people like us to conceive of something so wondrous as resurrection.. Most of us think

on the basis of our experience. When we see something, we try to fit it within our past experience in order to make sense of it. Yet shall we make sense of the resurrection, since there is almost nothing within the range of our experience that prepares us for so great a mystery? We shall have to wait, to wonder, to be willing to receive it as a gift. The resurrection will have to be something God gives us, not something we attain through our earnest efforts to think clearly. It is a gift. We stand under it.

In our Lenten study, A skeleton in God's Closet, we learned some of the possible reactions that the world would have if it were thought that the body of Jesus were found an archeological dig. the chaos not only in the church but throughout the world made you think seriously about how the resurrection is foundation of Christian faith and without it the church would have no real reason to exist. There may be times in our lives when our faith grows unsteady, but thank God the faith of the church goes on even during our rough times and provides that firm foundation which never changes. Thank God for raising our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, and because he lives we shall live also. Happy Easter celebration.







Creditors are stuck with millions of dollars in debts when people file for bankruptcy. Companies looking for ways to make debtors cover those costs have resorted to a variety of tactics. One is reaffirmation agreements. These are contracts with consumers to repay -- or reaffirm -- debts that would otherwise be wiped off the slate once the bankruptcy process is completed. in return for making reaffirmation agreements, consumers may get to use their credit cards again. But debtors can't be forced to reaffirm their debts and they can't be required to pay if such agreements aren't made properly.

Bankruptcy expert Professor Karen Gross says that creditors have now found ways to go after debts after they've been discharged through bankruptcy. Gross explains that while it is illegal to hasale consumers over discharged debts, there's nothing to prevent debtors from voluntarily re-paying them. "All of this hinges on the meaning of 'voluntary.' What makes these (postbankruptcy) agreements par-ticularly troubling is that they do not have to be approved by a bankruptcy court. They're off the radar screen." said

Ward, and more than 3,00 re- get them to sign "voluntary" agreements, while others entice them with the temptation of new credit lines if they agree to repay debts that have been discharged in bankruptcy in order to get credit.

Creditors may also threaten to repossess expensive items like furniture, jewelry and ste-reo systems. But Gross says that even if they have the right to repossess, they wouldn't get much money for the items, so repossession is often an empty threat. 'Frequently the creditor just wants to scare the debtor into repaying the entire debt," said Gross.

If you have been repaying a discharged debt and want to know if the agreement is valid, contact the judge or trustee who handled your bankruptcy. You may be able to stop paying and get a refund for what you've paid. Report possible unfair or deceptive debt collection tactics to the court, your state attorney general and the FTC





Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, who was a poet, dramatist, novelist and scientist, claimed, "We are never de-

ceived; we deceive ourselves." At the bridge table, this might be true, too. There are some deals that look so easy. How can anything go wrong for declarer? Yet if a defender is in midseason form, he might spot a deceptive play to send South down a suicidal siding.

See if you can spot that deceptive defensive diversion in this deal.

After a crash-bang auction, South was in six spades. If West had had the sense to lead the unbid suit, the contract would have slipped silently under the water. Yet he picked the club ace. On surveying the dummy, West contin-ued with his second club to dummy's queen. (He knew his partner couldn't have a cashing ace, because South had

eschewed Blackwood.) Judging correctly that the clubs wouldn't be 3-3, declarer cashed the spade queen before trying the club king. It was his lucky day. South dis-carded his diamond loser, and West didn't have the missing trump.

That was easy, you are probably thinking. How could South have played otherwise? True, but now consider the effect of East's playing the club jack on the second round of the suit.

Wouldn't South continue immediately with dummy's club king? He would envision overruffing East, returning to dummy with a trump to draw East's remaining fang, and discarding his diamond loser on the club 10. Here, though, it would be West who ruffed the club king, not East.

If you cannot see a fair way to defeat a contract, try foul.



Americans are bowel-obsessed

DEAR DR. GOTT: If we are to believe the ads on TV, most

Americans are prone to constipation.
Is this true? Are laxatives harmful?
DEAR READER: Intensive media advertising certainly does seem to indicate that Americans smell bad,

indicate that Americans smell bad, don't eat enough junk food and are chronically constipated. Wrong, on all counts. Some people fall into these categories, most do not.

Non-prescription remedies for bowel dysfunction are a lucrative \$300 million-a-year business in the United States. No wonder Americans have been dubbed "bowel-conscious" by Europeans and by a panel of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

For the average American adult, bowel stimulants should not be used on a daily basis, and certainly no more often than once a week, because the intestine can come to depend on them. Moreover, the magnesium and phosphates contained in many laxatives can result in minimal imbalance that may cause fatigue, weakness and pulse irregularities. Stool softeners, although safe, must not be taken with

mineral oil, because they dramatically enhance the oil's effects. Mineral oil



itself can lead to nutritional disturbances by preventing absorption of certain vitamins.

People do not require daily bowel movements to remain in good health. For those individuals who have difficulty evacuating, vegetable fiber will usually correct the problem. These sources include fresh fruit, fruit juice, salads, vegetable roughage, bran and whole-grain products. Fiber supplements — such as Citricil, Metamucil and others — are often useful. Finally, high-potassium foods — such as raisins, apricots, prunes (and, most raisins, apricots, prunes (and, most important, hot prune juice) — will cor-rect constipation for most people.
