

Court Ruling May Be Sought

Legality Of Fuel Adjustment Fee Questioned

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)— The Florida Supreme Court will apparently be asked soon to rule on the legality of the controversial fuel-adjustment charge on electric utility bills.

After the Public Service Commission decided 2-1 Tuesday not to reconsider its Nov. 22 fuel-adjustment order, Atty. Gen. Robert Shevin and Public Counsel Frederick Karl said they were considering an appeal to the court.

"We are thinking very seriously about a basis for appeal,"

Karl said he would appeal if he believed there was an opportunity to overturn the order. The order made small changes in the procedures on the fuel-

adjustment charges now assessed on electric customers at a rate A court fight would also carry on the newly erupted feud betof more than \$700 million a year. It ordered monthly hearings for companies to justify any changes and eliminated all costs from the formula except the delivered price of fuel.

"I'm ready to vote so that possibly we can get this to court to remove a cloud from the fuel adjustment . . . from what some people say is a ripoff," said PSC Chairman Bill Bevis.

Bevis joined with Commissioner Billy Mayo in refusing Shevin and Karl's requests to reconsider.

Commissioner Paula Hawkins voted to continue a study of possible incentives for companies to bargain harder on fuel prices and to operate more efficiently.

"You are dabbling in something you don't know anything about," Bevis said of Shevin at the PSC meeting. "The attorney general ought to leave regulation of utilities to the Public Service

Trial counsel Jerry Oxner, who represented Shevin at the hearing, replied that Bevis' criticism was a sharp contrast to his political advertising before his election Nov. 5.

Bevis' ads duplicated a news story which said: "Public immediate halt to collection of fuel-adjustment charges, sup-

porting a move by Atty. Gen. Robert Shevin and Public Counsel Frederick Karl."

Bevis made the statement immediately after Shevin issued an opinion on Oct. 9 that fuel-adjustment charges were illegal

Gas Rationing Could Start As Early As Jan. 1, 1975

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (AP) - Gasoline rationing could be put into effect as early as Jan. 1 if need be, says the co-chairman of President Ford's Citizens Action Com-

"I don't think a positive decision has been made but Jan. 1 seems to be the time we'll have gas rationing," William J. Meyer, the co-chairman, told a press conference Tuesday.

Asked if he thought the Ford administration was giving serious consideration to such rationing and if it was a real possibility as early as next month, Meyer replied: "Yes." "The coupons are all printed up, in a vault and ready to roll," Meyer said, referring to the coupons printed last winter under the Nixon administration. Meyer, of Lansdale, Pa., is president of Central Sprinkler Corp., a subsidiary of the Fort Lauderdale-

Suspect Freed On Bond

MIAMI (AP) - Kenneth Burnstine, charged in a drugsmuggling operation, has been ordered to surrender his passport and pilot's license and to stay in South Florida The conditions of bond were set Tuesday by U.S. Magistrate Peter Palermo who allowed Burnstine to remain free on \$100,000 bond.

Burnstine, of Fort Lauderdale, was also ordered to stay away from private aircraft and airports and to report by phone five days a week to federal authorities, said Asst. U.S. Atty. Karen Atkinson.

Burnstine was arrested in Newport Beach, Calif., last week and had been held under \$250,000 bond. The bond was later reduced by a U.S. magistrate in California and Burnstine was allowed to post it in Miami, where he was indicted Nov. 19 by a federal grand jury.







Nuclear Power Risks Very Low

An easy way to develop a case of nerves these disaster put forth by people who want to scare us into a major reversal of national policy regarding peaceful application of atomic energy.

A freakish combination of failures in the safety systems at a nuclear power plant could disperse radioactivey for miles around and possibly "melt a hole in the earth all the way to China." Terrorists might invade an atomic power plant and threaten to blow it up. Nuclear materials might be stolen to make a primitive atomic bomb that could be used to blackmail an entire nation or the world. An accident in the transportation of plutonium could wipe out vast numbers of people.

What makes these conjectures so worrisome is that not even the most ardent supporter of atomic energy can argue that is is absolutely impossible for them to happen. Highly improbable, to be sure, but not impossible. The only nightmare ruled out flatly is that a nuclear power plant could explode like an atomic bomb. The laws of physics simply would not permit that.

We are left, then, with an assumption of certain risks as we push on with development of nuclear power. There is a tendency, especially among environmentalists trying to block construction of new atomic power plants, to overstate risks. The fact is, the risks they recite in their scenarios are on a par with the risk we all run of being hit on the head by a meteorite every time we step outdoors.

A two-year study of accident probabilities recently completed by Dr. Norman C. Rasmussen of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology shows that the frequency of a "core melt" accident with any measurable effects would be once in 1,700 years if there are 100 power reactors in operation, as there are hoped to be by 1980. Stated another way, the odds would be 300 million to 1 that a person living within 20 miles of a nuclear power plant might be killed by such an accident in any one year.

Statistically, that same person now runs a 4,000 to 1 risk of being killed in an auto accident or a 100,000 to 1 risk of being killed in an aircraft accident. We have lived with those risks since the car and airplane were invented, and our response has been to try to build safer cars and planes and learn

That is the answer to the scare-stories about nuclear power. We must calculate our risks accurately and in the context of all the risks surrounding us in the world - and see that they are nimized. This is being done in the minute examination of the safety features designed into reactor facilities, and in the general tightening-up that is now occurring in the handling and transportation of nuclear materials. The penalities for carelessness or dishonesty by anyone responsible for these materials must be severe.

Atomic energy is our one best hope for overcoming the limitations on the world's supply of fossil fuels. What threatens us is not so much the tremendous power it represents, but the danger that fear will prevent us from harnessing it in time.

Gaining A Nuclear Advantage

WASHINGTON (AP) - While proclaiming the arms race "capped," President Ford has boosted prospects that the United States will build bigger missiles to make sure Russia does not gain a major advantage in nuclear

Ford's statement Monday night that his new greement with Soviet party leader Leonid I. Brezhnev put "a firm ceiling on the strategic arms race" referred only to the number of weapons "delivery systems," principally missile

But the agreement provides no limitation on the size and lifting power, or "throwweight," of those missiles, or on the number of warheads A new family of Soviet missiles is reported

nearing installation, probably with multiple independently targetable warheads (MIRVs). These missiles are rated by U.S. intelligence experts as having between three and seven times the throw-weight of the American Minuteman missile. Some of these new Soviet missiles have been tested with six and eight warheads, compared with the Minuteman's three MIRVs.

U.S. defense officials repeatedly have voiced concern that by the early 1980s the Russian throw-weight advantage, translated into thousands of accurate nuclear warheads, could threaten U.S. missiles in their underground

Officials have said this would seriously weaken the U.S. striking force which is relied on

"If there is an inequity in throw-weight, that can be remedied," Ford told his news conference. "If we decide to go to a heavy throwweight, we can add a greater number of individual warheads," the President said. He indicated he would abide by U.S. military

With this kind of encouragement, defense officials are likely to push for a new missile system to replace the Minuteman, although a decision on what form that system will take still

A number of possible approaches already are being studied, including mobile missiles that could be fired from giant transport planes,

Mobile missiles would be very difficult for the Soviets to knock out in a surprise attack, compared with missiles in fixed silos. Although Ford said he plans to keep spending on strategic arms at about the present level, it is

difficult to see how a new missile system could be developed and installed without spending additional billions of dollars over a period of perhaps eight years. At one point, Ford seemed to be suggesting that there might be some reductions in U.S.

weapons programs. But he later clarified that by saying that the agreed limits on delivery systems would result in a cutback on the Soviet

To Avenge Officers Murder

MEXICO CITY (AP) - Mexico City's police department vowed today to avenge the death of five of its men gunned down by 15 stocking-masked terrorists who raided two local banks and made off with \$200,000.

Two other policemen wounded by the gunmen in the robberies Tuesday were reported in serious condition. A police spokesman said no arrests had been made, and the department had no clues to the identity of the bandits. Mayor Octavio Senties and Police Chief Daniel Gutierrez Santos stood silent guard for an hour in the early morning beside the five black coffins of the slain

More than 30 policemen have been killed in Mexico City this year in clashes with terrorists, but this was the largest casualty toll in one clash.

POLLY'S POINTERS Home Cleaning Foils Carpet Shrinkage

DEAR POLLY - I would appreciate it if you could tell me how to clean my pink bathroom carpet that is fitted wall to wall and has a rubber backing. I understand that if it is taken up and washed at a laundry if will shrink, so I would prefer cleaning it right on the floor - L.C.S.

DEAR L.C.S - You failed to say what type carpet you have but from your letter it must be a washable kind. A wet cleaning recommended for all types of carpet is to use a light neutral detergent such as is often sold as a special purpose cleaner for home laundering-not a strong cleanser used for woodwork and resilient flooring. Two heaping tablespoons of the detergent to a gallon of water should do the job with a minimum of risk. Apply sparingly so it will not penetrate to the rubber backing and dry as soon as possible. If you have an electric fan use it to speed the drying process. Repeated use of this detergent will cause quicker resoiling so do not do it too often. Shrinkage is always a possibility in wet cleaning at home but professional cleaners have equipment to prevent this. There are also a number of powered rug cleaners on the market if one prefers that method. We would be interested in knowing if readers who wash their carpets at a laundry have had shrinkage problems. - POLLY.



Ford Is Roasted At Sports Event

NEW YORK (AP) - President Gerald R. Ford presented a football award to comedian Bob Hope Tuesday night and then heard himself roasted as "the first American ever sent

Hope referred to the President's recent trip "to Japan, Korea and Russia — three places the Republicans carried in the las-

The President and Hope spoke at the 17th annual awards dinner of the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame, where Ford presented the foundation's Distinguished American Award to the comedian.

Before introducing Hope, the President compared the nation's economic crisis to football and said the American people must be careful not to lose their desire to win. "We are in a great struggle to maintain our economic well-

being," he said. "In the battle against inflation there are no playoffs or wait-'til-next-year. It's winner take all. Winning is a very small word. Let's be careful not to lose it." The President, who was center and captain of the 1934 Uni-

versity of Michigan football team, said winning is "the ultimate reason any of us have for going into a competitive sport. Ford joined in the laughter when Hope said the President was "very busy trying to find a way to veto Ohio State's trip to the Rose Bowl." Ohio State was selected to represent the Big Ten Conference in the Rose Bowl over Michigan, the President's

Hope noted that Ford was a center in his football-playing days _ i.e., bent forward over the ball _ and quipped that "a lot of guys on Capitol Hill would love to get him in that position


