SLAYER FAILS IN  
NEW ATTEMPT TO  
STAY EXECUTION

Court Denies Chesser Writ  
Of Supersedas Which Was  
To Have Delayed Death  
In Chair At State Prison

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Mar. 19.  
(INS)—Rufus Chesser, Negro  
convicted slayer of his sweet-  
heart, Sally Boyles, was denied a  
writ of supersedas by the State  
Supreme Court today which would  
have stayed operation of the death  
warrant calling for his execution  
during the week beginning Mon-  
day.

Demand of the supersedas was  
made in an opinion handed down  
by Justice Louis Strum. The Su-  
preme Court ruled that the de-  
cision of Circuit Judge George  
Gibbs at Jacksonville holding Chesser  
mentally normal was not an  
appealable matter.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 19.—(INS)  
The senate campaign fund in-  
vestigating committee today

inquiry into election scandals, the  
committee reached a crisis in its  
career at today's meeting.

Backers of the fiery Missourian

Chesser, originally slated to  
pay the Supreme penalty on Feb-  
ruary 18, received a stay of execu-  
tion from Circuit Judge Gibbs at  
Jacksonville a scant hour before  
the current was to have been turned  
on into his body at the state prison  
at Raiford. The stay was  
granted to permit time in which to  
investigate his sanity.

Judge Gibbs, after a hearing in  
chambers here during which he  
personally observed the youth, is-  
sued a ruling that Chesser was  
sane and revoked the stay of execu-  
tion which automatically brought  
back into force the death sentence.  
Governor John W. Martin then  
signed a new death warrant calling  
for Chesser's execution during  
the week beginning March 21.

Meanwhile Chesser's attorney  
waited before the Clay county circuit  
court from Judge Gibbs' sanity decision  
and obtained a writ of error  
this writing being made returnable  
on May 17 before the State Su-  
preme Court.

Preparations were made, how-  
ever, to go forth with the execu-  
tion next week despite the writ  
returnable in May and the youth's  
counsel, in a final desperate effort  
to further prolong Chesser's life,  
applied Thursday to the State Su-  
preme Court for a writ of supersedas  
to halt the carrying out of  
the death warrant.
