





#### Curve Or Illusion?

Is there such a thing as a curve ball in baseball or is a ball that appears to curve actually an optical illusion? This question has occasioned a great deal of debate among baseball fans, players and scientists. Both sides in the controversy are ready to offer a welter of evidence at the drop of

The most recent participant in the debate is an electronic brain. The computing machine records information on the speed of a thrown ball, weight of the ball, spin and deviation of the ball from a straight path on its trip from pitcher to catcher. The electronic brain comes up with an answer that supports the stand of those who say a pitcher can throw a curve. On the other side of the argument are a series of pictures which seem to show that the ball actually travels in a straight line.

Maybe a baseball doesn't curve in spite of the evidence of the electronic brain. Nevertheless it will be impossible to convince any major league ballplayer that the question is anything but academic. When a pitcher as good as Bob Feller is at his best it doesn't matter whether he is throwing curves or optical illusions. Call it this or that, it is still hard for a hitter to connect with the ball.




