## Bomb Toll High In Viet Capital

SAIGON (UPI)—Communist terrorists exploded two bombs tonight at a floating Saigon restaurant crowded with American and Vietnamese. Casualties were heavy. First reports said at least six persons were killed and a score wounded in the twin blasts. The dead were reported to include Americans.

Women and children were among the casualties. Earlier the Viet Cong announced the "reprisal" execution of a captured U. S. Army sergeant. The executed man was identified as Sgt. Harold George Bennett, 25, son of Mrs. Pauline Bennett of Perryville, Ark., who was captured in battle last December.

## Plane Slams Into Mountains 84 Die In Crash Near Marine Base

72 Marines, 12 Airmen Perish; Wreckage Covers 10-Mile Area

EL TORO MARINE BASE, Calif. (UPI)—A KC135 military jet air transport crashed and exploded in light rain and fog today, killing 84 persons—72 Marines and an Air Force crew of 12.

The plane, similar to the Boeing 707 commercial jetliner, slammed into mountainous terrain 4 1/2 miles north of here only minutes after taking off from the Southern California base at 2:48 a.m. in a drizzle.

Officials would give only the Honolulu as the plane's destination, but there was speculation the Marines were en route to Hawaii. The wreckage was scattered over a wide area approximately 10 miles from the exclusive beach communities of Balboa, Newport Beach and Laguna Beach. The crash struck at 2:48 a.m. in a drizzle.

## Plane Makes Forced Landing Near Lake; 4 Escape Injury

Two Titusville men and two boys aboard a Cessna 170 escaped any injury when a "dead stick" landing was forced at noon Thursday in a prairie one-quarter mile south of a Puzos Lake in southeast Volusia County.

Passengers, identified by Constable Irving Veloz of Ocala, the investigating officer, were Robert Floyd, 32, the pilot; Robert E. Moseley, 24, owner, and Floyd's sons, Edgar Jr., six, and Marty, seven.

The plane, out of Arthur Dunn Airport in Titusville, was on routine flight over the St. Johns River when engine trouble developed. Residents of the area reported hearing the engine sputtering and the motor finally going completely dead.

Veloz said Floyd executed what apparently would have been a perfect landing except that shortly after touchdown on the grass, wind and some water hole and was flipped upside down, coming to rest in some six inches of mud and water.

A fisherman in the area, Ted Jackson of Oviedo, was on the scene within minutes and assisted the passengers from the plane, bringing them out on his airboat to Lindsey's Fish Camp on SR 46.

Assisting in investigation, now turned over Federal Aeronautics for completion, were Seminole Deputy Fred Kelley and Steward Deputy Rodenhag.

Damages to the craft, which was insured, have not been estimated at this time.

## Legislators Back On Job To Try Again

TALLAHASSEE (UPI)—Big city lawmakers made their expected push for majority rule today as the Florida Legislature began a second repositionment session composed of passing a bill to end rural control of both houses.

There were reports the majority bloc will launch a drive, considered impossible by many, to actually pass a repositionment bill today.

Both houses convened at 11 a. m. and immediately to the job of adopting rules. A new air of optimism permeated the corridors, dispelling the gloom of 20 days of frustration and failure that ended when the old session expired Thursday.

Many legislators predicted that both legislative repositionment and congressional redistricting will be accomplished in time for the lawmakers to adjourn sine die next Friday and be home for good in time for a Fourth of July celebration.

The senators and 113 representatives have been on the job since April 5 when they convened for the regular 60-day session which did not consider repositionment at the request of the governor. On Friday they adjourned for a 60-day special session on repositionment, a session that ended in a stalemate.

## \$1.4 Million Flood Control Contract Let

JACKSONVILLE (UPI)—Greig, Gibson & Greig Inc. of Leesburg has received a \$1.4 million contract for construction of a navigation lock on the Kissimmee River, the Army Corps of Engineers announced today.

The lock is the last of six built as part of the \$44 million development of the Upper Kissimmee River in the Central and Southern Florida flood control project.

The project will take about two years to complete the lock and spillway, which will be about 90 miles south of Jacksonville.

The engineers also announced the award of a \$21,730 contract to Trupp Bros. Inc. of Coral Gables for construction of a 6.4-mile-long dike along the lower east coast 18 miles south of Jacksonville.

He was appointed city manager of Fernandina Beach in June, 1965, at an annual salary of \$9,200. He also served as city auditor and city clerk.

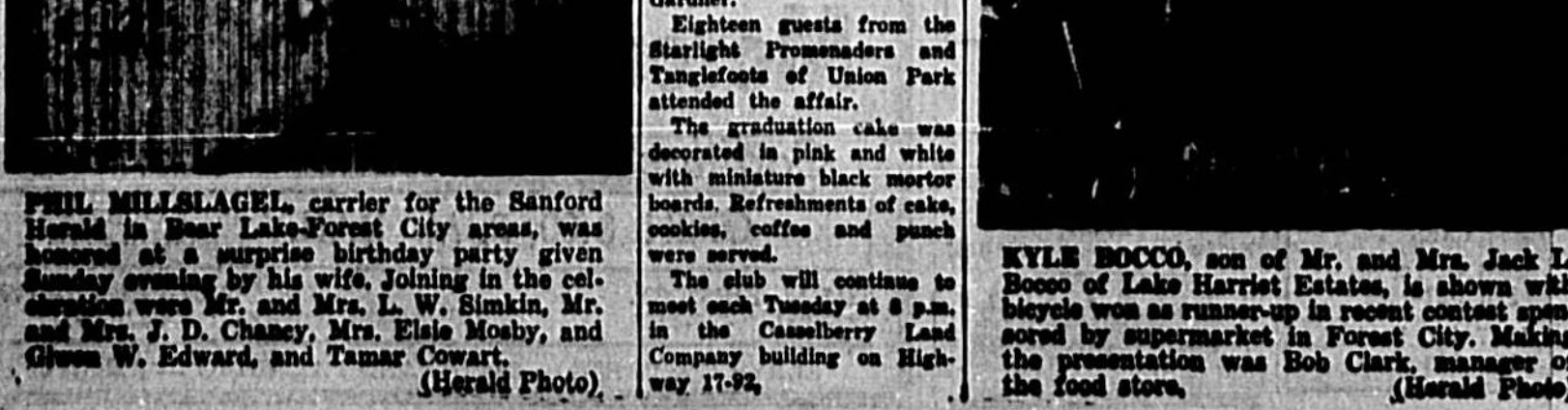

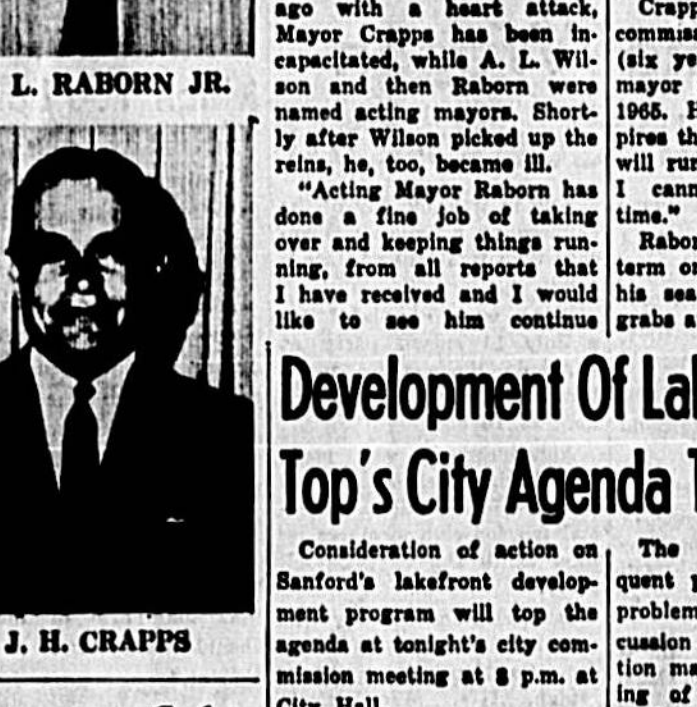

## Man Charged With Murder At Daytona

Under arrest are Lawson Davis, 22, charged with murder, and Jay Vaughn, 28, and James Burkett, 22, charged with being accessories to manslaughter. All three are from Orlando. Van Trunk told The Sanford Herald today.

Officials at NAS this morning refused to release any information regarding Murdy until next of kin had been notified. They said the slaying had been notified but the message had not been confirmed.

One NAS source said he believes the slaying was a hate crime. Murdy was a member of the Five and Seven Central Unit, a group of sailors who are known for their violent behavior. Van Trunk gave this account of the slaying, which took place at approximately 2:30 p. m. Sunday.

Several fights immediately broke out, and at this point, Van Trunk said, "Things got very confusing."

The boy died at 7:15 p. m. at Hurling Hospital on Daytona Beach. Van Trunk said he does not know the exact cause of death, but did say an autopsy would be performed in an effort to allow Murdy to be buried.
