The Prayer Of A Great American

BY IRVIN S. COBB

To my way of thinking, a red Indian who never learned to read or write or to speak English was one of the noblest characters our country ever nurtured. The more I hear of him the more convinced I am that for native genius and moral grandeur he is deserving of a place in our National Hall of Fame,

This man was In-mut-too-yahlat-lat, which may be translated as meaning "Thunder-travelingover-the-mountain." But among the whites he was more generally known as "Chief Joseph." He was the hereditary head of one group of the Nez Perces (nose-pierced) tribe. He was an orator, a statesman, a devoted patriot, and finally he was one of the finest natural military leaders America has produced. He was born about 1840, in what now is eastern Oregon. He dropped dead in front of his lodge in September 22, 1904. He was the last of the great warrior chieftains on this continent. Cyrus Town-send Brady called him the Indian Zenophon, the Red Napo-leon of the West. On a small scaled this unlettered savage duplicated many of the feats of strategy which gave to Stonewall Jackson an immortal glory.

Many of his saying became famous. For example these: "Look twice at a two-faced "Cursed be the hand which scalps the reputation of the dead;" "The eye tells what When he heard that his former enemy, General Nelson A. Miles had referred to him in admiration as "the whitest Indian that ever lived," the proud old captive sent back this word: "My friend is wrong. 1 do not wish to be known as a white Indian—that is an insult. would be known as the reddest ndian that ever lived—red skin,

red heart, red soul!" Chief Joseph's story was the same old story of white aggression. For years, using diplomacy and eloquence, he sought to save his tribal lands from white invasion. Growing desperate from repeated failures he

"This remarkable Indian had ong remembered as a military His small force which at no time numbered more than three hundred warriors, had retreated for nearly two thousand miles through an enemy country, carrying with then their squaws and children. They had met United States troops eleven different times and had fought
five pitched battles with them,
of which they had won three,

that is more remarkable when you learn that the total force opposing them was nearly two sthousand men."

Of his original band, Joseph had left at the time of his surrender only eighty-seven warriors, of whom forty were wounded, one hundred and eighty-four squaws and one hundred was the pathetic message he Ad-

"Tell your general that I know his heart. What he told me before-I have it in my heart. 1 am tired of fighting. Our chiefs are killed. Looking Glass is dead. Too-hul-hul-so-to is dead. The old men are all dead. He who led the young men (Joseph's brother Ollicult) is dead. It is sold and we have no blankets, no food. I want to have time to look for my children and to see how many of them I can find; maybe I shall fined them among the dead. Hear me, my chiefs, my heart is sick and sad. From where the sun now stands I will fight no more with the white man. He kept his word-Joseph always kept his word, even though the white men in their dealings with him made pledges only to break them. Never again did he lift his hand against the greedy conquering Caucasian. But he still fought-with his longue. He fought unceasingly to have the remnants of his tribe returned from Kansas,

to their own land. Under the title: "Chief Joseph's Own Story" a translation of his speech was printed in the North American Review and later was used by Brady in his book, "Northwestern Fights and Fighters," published and copy-righted by Doubleday, Page &



"We are all murderers at heart. Of course, I have never taken anyhody's life, but I have often read oblivary notices with considerable satisfaction. It just happens that circumstances have favored me.

"Look at the history of punishment. England used to kill man for picking pockets. They held their executions on a high hill so all could see and feel the deterrent effect. But there were more pick-pockets among the crowds purrounding the scaffold than at any other time.

"If capital punishment really prevented a crime we mould excute our murderers in the public square, on high hills or on top of our skyscrapers. Everybody should be required to attend. The schools and factories and business hours should be let out, just as they are on a holiday. The children should start right by seeing what we do to those who go wrong. 'Movies' should be taken and the front pages should be covered with delicious details of the murderer's last hours.

"As a matter of fact my experience shows me that the thought of capital punishment has the effect of making the criminal wary and cautious in covering up his deed. "Little John likes raspberry jam and he knows his mother has a jar on the top shelf of the pantry. When his mother goes out, he gets it and covers his face with it.
