Review Is Issued Of Florida Citrus Market Conditions

TAMPA, Nov. 23.—A review of Florida citrus sales in the eastern and midwestern auction markets for the week just closing, ending Nov. 19, with a brief summary of shipments affecting same, follows:
Florida interstate shipments by all carriers the preceding week (ending Nov. 18th) dropped 224 cars to a total of 1400, consisting of 990 cars oranges, 368 of grapefruit and 42 of tangerines.
Florida sales in all the auction markets this week reached a total of 701 cars, a drop of 76 under last week, with all varieties and packs registering substantial advances in price averages.
Oranges: There were 44 cars regular oranges in standard boxes sold for an average price of \$2.73 a box, 78 cars less than last week with the price up 29¢ a box. For the corresponding week last year they averaged \$2.78 and same week two years ago \$3.24. Other orange sales for the week were 26 cars Indian River oranges averaging \$3.47 a box, up 42¢ a box; and 40 cars two bushel Bruce boxes which brought an average price of \$3.02, an advance of 26¢ over last week. California orange sales totaled 70 cars for an average of \$4.03 a box, up 65¢.
Grapefruit: Sales of regular grapefruit in standard boxes amounted to 85 cars, averaging \$2.28 a box, a decrease of 19¢ cars and advance of 35¢ in price average. For the same week last week included 56 cars Indian
