













**BIRDS NOT SPEEDY SAYS MIAMI MAN WHO OUTFRANS THEM**

(By The Associated Press)  
MIAMI, Oct. 26.—Harold Bailey, local authority on birds, declares that after extensive investigations he is disappointed to learn that the speed of many Florida birds in flight is not as great as has generally been believed.

The automobile, Mr. Bailey states, is responsible for the contradiction of many statements regarding the flight of birds. On straight stretches of smooth roads and in a high powered car, Mr. Bailey has checked the speed of birds with his speedometer and expresses his surprise at their slow flight when hard pressed and exerting every effort to outdistance the car.

"Mocking birds, jays, cardinals and loggerhead shrikes cannot attain the speed of fifteen miles an hour," he states. "Our ground dove's best speed seems to be twenty miles and hour while mourning doves, Bob Whites and sparrow hawks average about twenty two miles an hour. While motoring along the canal banks, I found that heron flew around twelve miles while the sandpipers attained the speed of twenty. Meadow larks, blackbirds and many of the small birds cannot at best attain a speed of fifteen miles an hour."

**QUARANTINE LIFTED ON FLORIDA CATTLE FOR STATE FAIR**

JACKSONVILLE Fla., Oct. 26.—With receipt of the special order from the department of agriculture providing for the shipment of cattle of the non quarantine area for exhibition at the Florida State fair and Exposition here, Nov. 17 to 23, the last obstacle standing in the way of the live stock has been removed.

The Florida State Live Stock and Sanitary board has also issued rules and regulations covering the shipment of swine to Jacksonville for display at the fair.

With the lifting of the ban against the shipment of live stock into Duval county, the cattle show this year will assume the magnificent proportions of other years.

**WEATHER AND CROP CONDITIONS IN FLORIDA FOR THE WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 24, '22**

Temperature: The temperature averaged from 1 to 2 degrees above normal but the last day of the week was cooler than usual, a change that was much needed throughout the section. Sunshine: There was a high percentage of sunshine especially in the west and extreme south. The deficiency was marked in the northeast it was about the normal in the central division, diminishing southward. Rain (fall): The rainfall was much less than during the previous week, even in the south. The week was practically without rain in the west and except several locally heavy amounts in Jefferson and Baker Counties the amounts were unimportant over the northern division. The week's total exceeded 1 inch over portions of the central division in sections adjacent to the east and west coasts but inland the amounts were mostly light. The rainfall in the southern division, however, added to the unfavorable conditions that have prevailed for more than a month. Crops: Practically all truck crops will have to be replanted in the southern division, and the work is beginning wherever the soil is satisfactory. Low lands in the south are generally too wet and much are still under water although the condition of the soil improved considerably in some localities, and the absence of rain during the last days of the week added to the favorable outlook. Citrus fruits, avocado pears, and cane continued to be unfavorably affected on low lands where water is still found, and some citrus trees were damaged by flooded conditions in some localities in the south. The planting of tomatoes has been delayed in the south and south central counties, but the replanting of truck was advanced in the central portion of the section, the soil being in much better condition. Strawberries improved, but are much below the average for the season. The planting of oats progressed in western and portions in the northern division and the harvest of the last of the corn, hay, and peanut crops continued. The warm weather was unfavorable for the maturing of citrus fruits, moderate shipment obtained during the week.
