# Teachers learning skills to boost FCAT scores

SANFORD — Teachers in Seminole County schools are spending extra time this summer preparing to increase student scores on the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT)

Two dozen teachers from Midway and Hamilton elementary schools participated in all-day FCAT preparation sessions on Tuesday and Wednesday

Consultant Jack Foley was hired by Hamilton Elementary to host the sessions , focusing on the math section of the standardized test. Many skills tested in the FCAT are not scheduled in school text-

Preparation for the FCAT has become an essential part of lesson plans in classrooms throughout the state. Scores on the test are used by the state as a key portion. of grades given to schools under the Aplus education plan.

Some teachers have complained that the A-plus plan places too much emphasis on scores from the PCAT, forcing them to teach to a test. However, teachers at the workshop said they can still teach regular skills while preparing students for the

# Questions remain in shooting death

Police investigating the who, where, why in death of 18-year-old

SANFORD — Police are searching for clues as to why a Sanford man was shot and killed Wednesday evening

Hansen Jensi, Jr., 18, of 325 Springview Drive, was shot in the upper right chest by a small-caliber bullet Wednesday, and died from his wounds at Central Florida Regional Hospital.

Police are trying to determine where the shooting occurred and a motive for it. An autopsy will be performed today or tomorrow. Police have not determined whether the shooting was accidental or a homicide.

'We have been told a couple of different locations," said Cleo Cohen, spokeswoman

for the Sanford Police Department. "So far, we have been unable to locate the crime

Police searched for evidence in the area of County Road 46-A and Airport Boulevard Wednesday night. This morning, police also searched in the area of Windchase Apartments on 25th Street.

Police were called about 6:40 p.m., after Jensi had been driven to a 7-11 convenience store at Lake Mary Boulevard and Country Club Road, the police report said.

The driver, 23-year-old Elvin Rodriguez, spotted Jensi in the area of 1500 Windridge Circle and was attempting to take him to the hospital, but stopped to call police at the convenience store because of Jensi's condition, according to the police report.

Rescue workers had planned to airlift Jensi to Orlando Regional Medical Center, but his condition deteriorated, so he was rushed to Central Florida Regional Hospital, where he died.

# School officials pleased with Bush veto of impact fees cap

A program placing a cap on impact fees was vetoed. Tuesday by Governor Jeb Bush, to the relief of school officials and the chagrin of home builders.

To reduce impact fees charged on new houses, state lawmakers set aside \$50 million for the 15 Florida counties that impose them. However, under the legislation, the counties could never again raise the fees.

The bill was supported by lobbyists for the Florida Home **Builders Association and** Republican leaders in the state Legislature, who argued that impact fees raise the cost of new

In going against his own party, Bush said his action protects "the interests of all Florida taxpayers, not just those in select counties.

Impact fees are a key source of money for school construction. Five of the counties that charge impact fees are located in Central Florida, including Seminole, Orange, Osceola, Lake and Volusia.

Since July, impact fees raised \$5.1 million for Seminole County school construction.

"It returns local control to school districts for school impact fees," said Seminole County School Board member Larry Furlong. "He did the right thing. I give him a lot of credit, because he got lobbied very

heavily."
The \$50.9 billion state budget, which takes effect in July, includes funding increases for children, education, roads and the environment, as well as tax cuts of \$500 million. Meanwhile, for the second consecutive year Bush used the line item veto to climinate \$313 million in funding for local programs.

Bush called it "pure coincidence" that he matched last year's veto total. The former record of \$150 million had been set in 1988 by then-Gov. Bob

Martinez. Florida's school system will receive a record \$868 million increase in spending.





As you know, "More than kisses, letters mingle souls. For, thus, friends absent speak." John Donne wrote that more than 300 years ago. Nowadays, we don't send letters to mingle souls. We send I mail I'd much prefer a kiss to Email. Wouldn't you?

Most of us lay away warm letters to read them again - provided they are legible. Most of the letters I have laid away were written 30 or 40 years ago when penmanship was fine art and each artist had



on reading and 'rithmetic than writing nowadays. Our kids are smart but you wouldn't know it from their handwriting. Some will become doctors - and it won't matter. Better to have the right doctor than a doctor who can write

Sadly, as we get older and arthritic our handwriting deteriorates. Although some have more time to write, they've lost

their touch. Their letters require more time to read.

The nuns who taught me handwriting were very demanding. I was impressed at how well each of them did cursive writing on the blackboard. My favorite letter was the capital R. I'm still very good at the capital R. My capital G is giving me trouble, though

"We were taught the Palmer Method - push, pull, round and round. You used your arm muscles," she said. "I still practice the handwriting principles Hearned in elementary school at least most of the time.

Parents have kept the signatures of their children each year from the time they were taught to write. There are dramatic changes - usually for the better — as a child grows.

Apparently, a few regress. This is fine - they become doctors or attorneys.

Emerson said that when a man gave his handshake it was important the whole man accompanied the hand giving The same is true with a handwritten letter. The whole person should accompany the handwriting Otherwise, it's no better than E-mail.

Thank you for reading this column. I hope it inspires you to improve your handwriting skills — and to send someone an example of your caring. In fact. I'm going to sit right down and write myself a letter and make believe it came from you.

Although he was an experienced weapons handler, he forgot the first safety regulation: Inspect your weapon and be certain it is EMPTY. When he carelessly pulled

the trigger, the weapon fired. The bullet ricocheted off the bulkheads and over the heads of eight or nine of us shipmates. Miraculously, it missed all of us and providently wound up in the left upper arm of the gunner's mate!

During the gunner's mate's court-martial, the executive officer remarked, "So, you shot yourself. It serves you right! I hope you learned something."

He was reduced to third class, and at the end of that patrol was transferred off the ship in disgrace. The gunner's mate "learned something," all right — he learned that his shipmates could be cruel in their sarcasm for weeks after.

Continued from Page 1A ing achievement. Other factors include school attendance, discipline, and high school graduaion rates.

Scores on the FCAT are mong the measurements used to track student progress in elenentary, middle and high chool. Schools and teachers are then be held responsible for student progress

Starting in 2002, five percent of teachers' salaries will be based pon student performance.

Funding for the school recognition program under the state's -plus education plan will doue under the state budget. funds to give financial incenives to top ranking schools ncreased to \$60 million, comared with \$30 million last year.

However, the Florida repartment of Education only llows school-districts to spend he funding on facilities.

The grading system is part of he same education reform package that created a plan for parmts in schools receiving an "F" wice in four years to receive ouchers for private schools.

The six Seminole County elesentary schools that received D's" on the state's accountability report are taking steps to improve test scores and other areas where the state said the schools are weak.

Wicklow, Hamilton and Midway elementary schools had the lowest FCAT scores in the district in both reading and math. Pine Crest Elementary School received a "D" based on its FCAT scores for reading and

Idyllwilde and English Estates received "D's" based on Florida Writes! test scores.

Five of the six schools with "D's" in the state report are located in Sanford, while English Estates is in Fern Park.

In August 1999, a schoolbased After School Extended Day Program was developed for four of the six schools that received "D's." Several days per week, students receive tutoring from the time school ends until 5 p.m. The school district provides students with transportation to their homes

The schools participating in the extended day program include Wicklow, Hamilton, Midway, and Pine Crest elementary schools.

The Success For All reading program developed by Johns

Hopkins University has been implemented in Hamilton and Midway elementary schools. Although Winter Springs Elementary School did not receive a "D," it is also participation in the secondary. peting in the program.
Four of the schools -

Midway, Hamilton, Pinecrest, and Wicklow — have poverty levels above 70 percent. Idyllwilde and English Estates elementary schools have poverty rates of 48 percent.

Wicklow Elementary School has a 60 percent mobility tota, which reflects the number of ste dents moving in-and-out in a year. The remaining five schools with "D's" all have mobility rates ranging from 30-to-36 percent.

The six schools with "D's" also have high absence rates. For instance, 20 percent of Pine Crest Elementary School students were absent for 20 days or more last year. The state's is 8.7 per-

Hamilton, Wicklow and Midway elementary schools have absentee rates ranging from 10.4 to 11.7 percent. English Estates has an 8.3 percent absentee rate, while Idyllwilde has a 7.1 percent absentee rate.

The base officially closed on lune 28 of 1968, subsequently becoming what is now known as the Orlando-Sanford International Airport.





## Wells is struggling in his first NASCAR season

Cal Wells has been at this not quite a year yet, and he's learning every day just how big a challenge this sport can be for a rookie car owner, even a guy who has been in racing for so many years.

Wells started from scratch after he wound up with two important sponsors last summer when Proctor & Gamble's Tide brand and McDonald's both decided to make a dramatic change in marketing, dropping Ricky Rudd and Bill Elliott, respectively.

So far things haven't gone all that well for Wella and driver Scott Pruett, 40th in points after the Coca-Cola 600 at Lowe's Motor Speedway last

They missed three of the year's first six races, earned a front-row spot at Las Vegas, led 13 laps at Texas before getting shoved out of the way by Steve Park. Pruett's best finishes have been a 19th at Daytona and 20th at Talladega.

"If I'd known six months ago what I know now, I'd have approached things differently," Wells said. "If I were to do this thing all over again, I'd do it a lot differently than I have. I think I didn't so slowly enough in terms of learning the genre. NASCAR is a country unto itself.

"It's not that I came in with some ejocentric attitude, not that at all. I don't feel I underestimated the massive, massive challenge. But it is every bit as difficult as I expected it would be."

Grading his team's performance so far: "C-minus." And Wells as a car owner? "D-plus."

"Joe Garone is doing a good job for us as program manager and crew chief now," Wells said. "We've come a long way in a short period of time. But it all starts with me, and I could have been and should have been smarter.

"So I think Chip is going about it the right way. Buying into an organization, even with all its blemishes, is better than coming in and starting from

"I still have not met Ricky or Bill ... but I'm ours there could have been something put together that would have been a lot more intelligent between the two or three of us. They have areas that they are very, very strong in. But they've also got areas they're week in. Together we could have worked and been invaluable to each other.

"As it turns out, what they've got is great, a lot better than anything they could have put together with me. Elliott has a fabulous program [with Dodgs and Ray Evernham]. I've said the same thing about Ricky. But Elliott has really hit the big time. Still, Ricky's ninth in the points and he's finishing every weekend, and the car's not falling apart. Plus he's going home at night not worrying about a lot of things.

# SHOWDOWN

Dale Earnhardt Jr. and Matt Kenseth face off in a two-man battle for rookie of the year

Bhey entered the season as NASCAR's most heralded group of new talent. But about one-third of the way into the 2000 season, the most heralded rookie class in Winston Cup history has evolved into a two-man race.

Dale Earnhardt Jr. has won two races and The Winston, Matt Kenseth won one of Winston Cup's premier events, Sunday's Coca-Cola 6(N), and is leading the rookie points battle. Stacy Compton has become the darkhome, making every race and remaining in striking distance of the frontrunners.

Jeff Fuller is gone. Mike Bliss has switched teams, and Ed Herrier. Dave Blaney and Scott Pruett have struggled to make fields.

Earnhardt Jr. and Kenseth are the first pair of rookies to win on a superspeedway in the same season, the first pair since 1981 to both win in the same year and the only pair to both lead in a race that one of them won

Earnhardt Jr. was expected to be in the hunt, but no one predicted success would come so early. When he won at Texas Motor Speedway, even his team seemed slightly stunned. When he did it again at Richmond International Raceway, the celebration ran late into the night. Other drivers just shook their heads in wonder.

Then he bested the best in The Winston, Just 16 races into his Winston Cup career, Earnhardt Jr. has suddenly become a favorite. He entered the Coca-Cola 600 at Lowe's Motor Speedway in Concord, N.C., as one of the drivers to beat, but Kenseth stole his rookie thun-

How did this happen? The rookies started the season well, with all but Fuller making the Daytona 500. Then the separation began.

"It's a lot tougher than I thought," said Bliss, who has replaced Fuller in the No. 27 Pontiac after being released by A.J. Foyt's team. Coming from the Craftsman Truck Series], you think you put your pants on just like everyone else

Earnhardt Jr. quickly emerged as a contender.

"I thought it was going to take quite a while," he said. "I didn't expect to be this competitive this quickly. I figured it would happen toward the end of the year, if at all. We still haven't got a lot of consistency [four top-10 finishes in 13 races]. We've got to establish that to where if this team is going to be a contender in the future, we need to be consistent."

As the season has progressed, these rookies have addressed different problems. For Earnhardt Jr., there are scheduling constraints and the difficulty of balancing the demands of fans, sponsors and NASCAR. He has remained unchanged.

He still wears his beddy jeans and T-shirts in the garage, often walking past groups of fans without being recognized. He jokes about being

Earnhardt clearly is in a different class than the rest of the group. Not just in success and publicity, but in his demeanor and ability to handle

the constant press of questions. One night last week, he sat in the media center at Lowe's Motor Speedway, holding court about his stunning season and his pole position for the race. The next day, he sat quietly while his classmates assessed their seasons, briefly summarizing his own.

lie tried not to stand out. There seems to be no animosity in this class. They teased about comparisons - "Junior over there is stinking it up for us," Compton said and then concentrated on their own

Kenseth has been consistent, as expected, running well on a weekly

"I don't sit around and say we won this many races or whatever," he said. "I am always looking forward to next week and doing better. As fast as you can win one of these races and get noticed, you can fail twice as fast, and everybody will forget about it. I really try to keep everything in perspective."

Compton also has been consistent, qualifying for every race in the revamped Melling Racing team.

The Virginia native has made a smooth transition from the Craftsman Truck Series and appears the most likely candidate to take advantage of any stumbles by Earnhardt Jr. or Kenseth.

In the preseason, many expected Blaney to challenge Earnhardt Jr. and Kenseth, But Blaney has encountered problems in both qualifying and races

We're struggling more than I had hoped we would or thought we would," said Blaney, who has moved up from the Busch Grand National series.

"We are a new team. We've got all new people and a new, inexperienced driver. But I really hope the second time around on some of these racetracks, where we can look back at what we did, I think that will pick us up."

Facing different obstacles hasn't altered how the drivers view the rookie race

They understand the potential for future success that the group carries. Winning the rookie title would mean a lot to these guys.


