Ford Charged JUST HER STYLE R.F.C. Starts Pardon Dole PART OF A HARNESS FOR A MIGHTY RIVER Foreclosure By Wholesale

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 1.—(AP) -The National Labor Relations Board issued a complaint today charging the Ford Motor Company with unfair labor practices in its St. Louis assembly plant.


