Broil until they begin to brown. Turn over and sprinkle lightly with grated cheese mixed with a bit of cayenne. Broil until cheese melts. Serve garnished with finely chopped parsley.
Orange Surprise
4 medium-sized oranges
1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup cream
1/4 cup sugar
Few grains salt
1 pint strawberries
Cut a slice from tops of oranges and remove pulp and juice but keeping the skins intact. Strain juice and add slowly the milk, cream, sugar and salt. Freeze, stirring two or three times. Remove membrane from orange skins and place the skins in cold water. When ready to use, dry skins and put into each shell a layer of strawberries cut in small pieces, then fill almost to the top with the orange cream sherbet. Garnish with whipped cream, sweetened and flavored with grated orange rind.

Child Health Day To Be Observed Throughout Nation

JACKSONVILLE, April 30. (Special)—With the first annual Child Health Day since the close of World War II proclaimed by President Truman, Florida and the nation will observe May 1 as the country's 15th consecutive Child Health Day. Asking the country to give more thought and work toward the improvement of child health, the President called for "recognition that the health of American children, like their education, should be accepted as a definite public responsibility."

Dr. Lucille J. Marsh, director of the State Board of Health's Bureau of Maternal and Child Health, said that the celebration of Child Health Day is intended only to mark and emphasize the year-round work for the improvement of the health of children. It neither inaugurates nor culminates a child health program but draws attention to accomplishments and the continued need for better care of tomorrow's adults. Child health programs carried on through local health units with technical consultation furnished by State Board of Health personnel.

Some phases of child health directed through local health departments consist of medical examinations, screening tests for vision and hearing, dental examinations and immunization. The latter consists of immunizations

for smallpox, diphtheria and whooping cough - and tuberculin tests. Where there has been a rise in the family tests for children are advocated. Typhoid immunization is also recommended in later childhood if children are at all likely to come in contact with contaminated water, or milk supplies.

Child Health Day had its beginning shortly after World War I and tremendous progress has been made in the control of preventable children's diseases by bringing the importance of prevention into the home. One expert in child welfare and health has said of the inception of Child Health Day that "Science has the answer that can eradicate many ills and reduce the death toll if it can be interpreted into popular knowledge."
