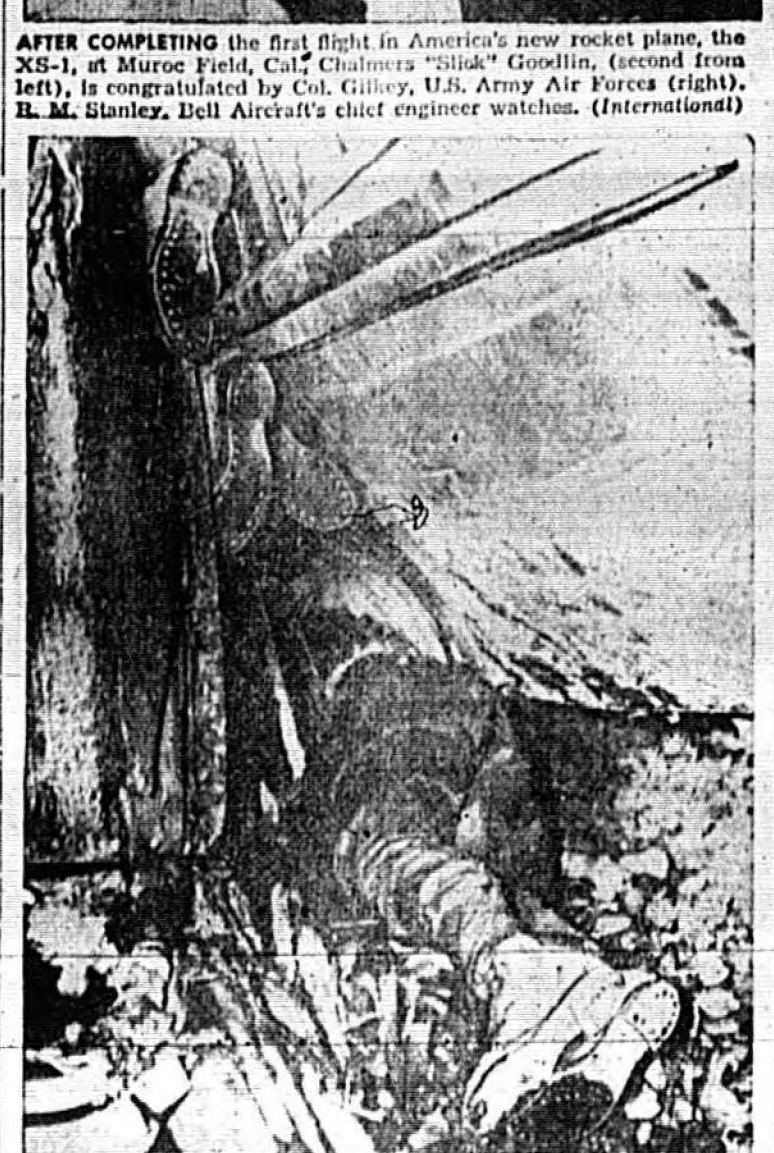

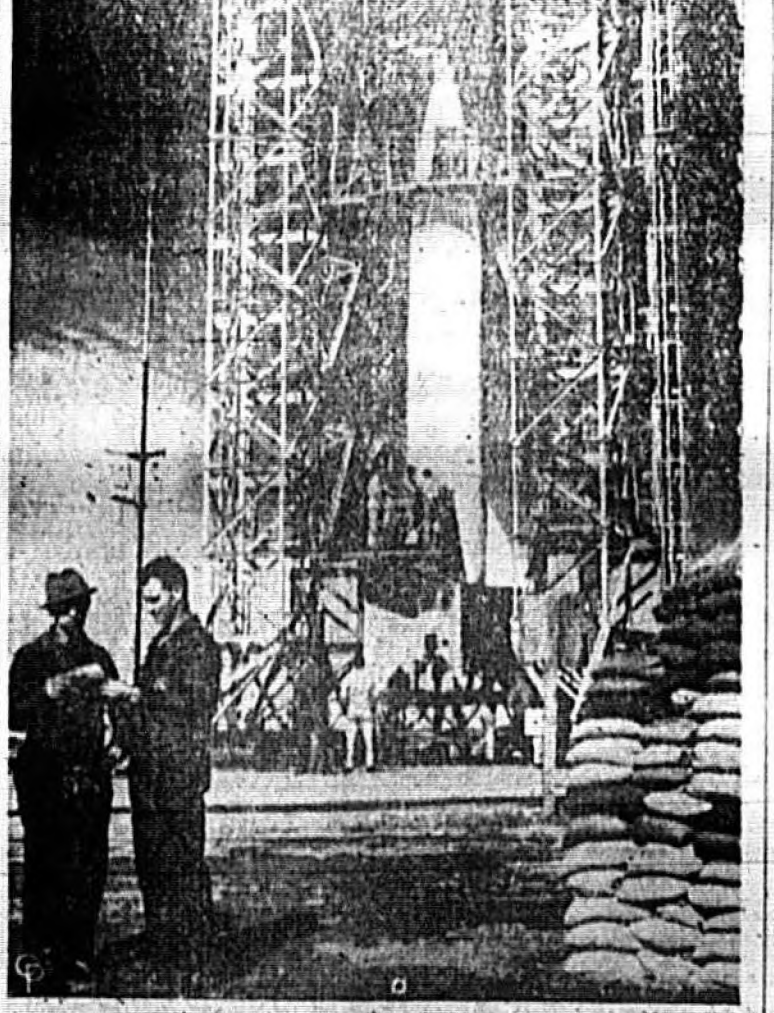

state, recall that their ambassadors and ministers from Franco Spain and that the Franco regime be barred from membership in any organization started by the United States having relationship with it.
The resolution was fought with vigor by some delegates and it is a foregone conclusion that it will not be followed by a vast majority. Whether it will have any effect in Spain is still too early to tell. The generalissimo is as defiant as ever. And in two rather violent speeches, Franco has warned that the world is in a situation of war which may be declared at any moment. We must be expected, in the opinion of the Spanish leader, while a materialist conception of life continues in the world.
Although Franco did not refer to the United Nations resolution, he complained of what he called the intense conservative propaganda which has been directed against his country by radio at the service of Communism and Free Masonry. As quite a few observers have noted, the Franco line does not deviate too much from that of Fascist or Nazism.
The reference to materialism is rather backward and will not get serious attention in the democratic world. The idea that idealism should be the creed of the people, while the Palangist and high class circles continue to wear their white fed and well clothed, is rather foolish in a country where the people belong to the feudal period.
In America, as in England and France, the general line is a better lot of the people in a very material sense. The accent still is on constant improvement of the standard of living. While it is conceded that there is a lot to be learned from the economic life of the people, it is no less certain that they cannot live by ideals alone.
The major criticisms of Soviet Russia is that its citizens have been sacrificed time and again for a distant ideal held by a Communist minority. This charge is as true as the fact that the people have little clothing and not too much food. They are being sacrificed to a remote ideal which will prevail until human nature changes completely.

While it is conceded that there is a lot to be learned from the economic life of the people, it is no less certain that they cannot live by ideals alone.

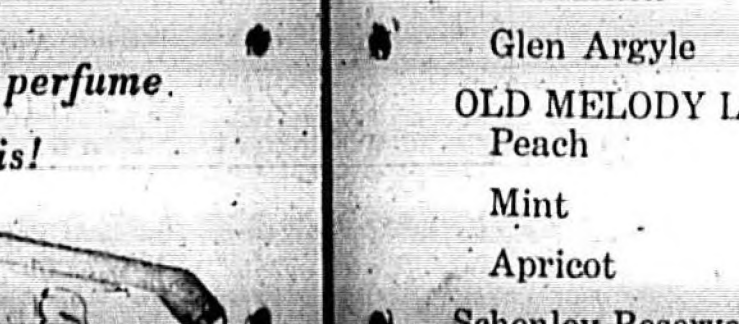

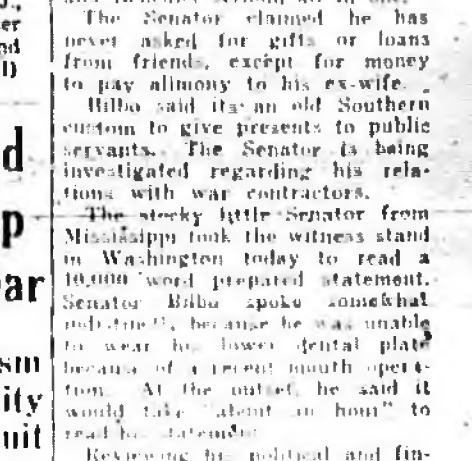
