



Casualties Of Art

Inventories of the war's destruction of art reveals Italy as suffering greatly. Some 2,500 buildings, together with frescoes and sculptural decorations, have been seriously or irreparably damaged. One of the saddest stories is that of Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper. The convent church in Milan which houses it was so bombed that the painting has been exposed to dampness despite sandbag protection. Many of the figures are all but vanished.

A recent book, The Lost Treasures of Europe, containing almost 500 photographs, compiled by Henry La Farge, gives the tragic story of cathedral ruin in Italy, France, England, Germany, Russia and Poland. Many of these buildings are gone forever.

Great as is this calamity to art and architecture, it is nothing when viewed in comparison with the loss of life or the physical and mental suffering among survivors. Yet the destruction of these priceless creations of man's genius are an eloquent symbol of war's horror. Restoration, undertaken wherever possible, will help bind the wounds of the spirit.
