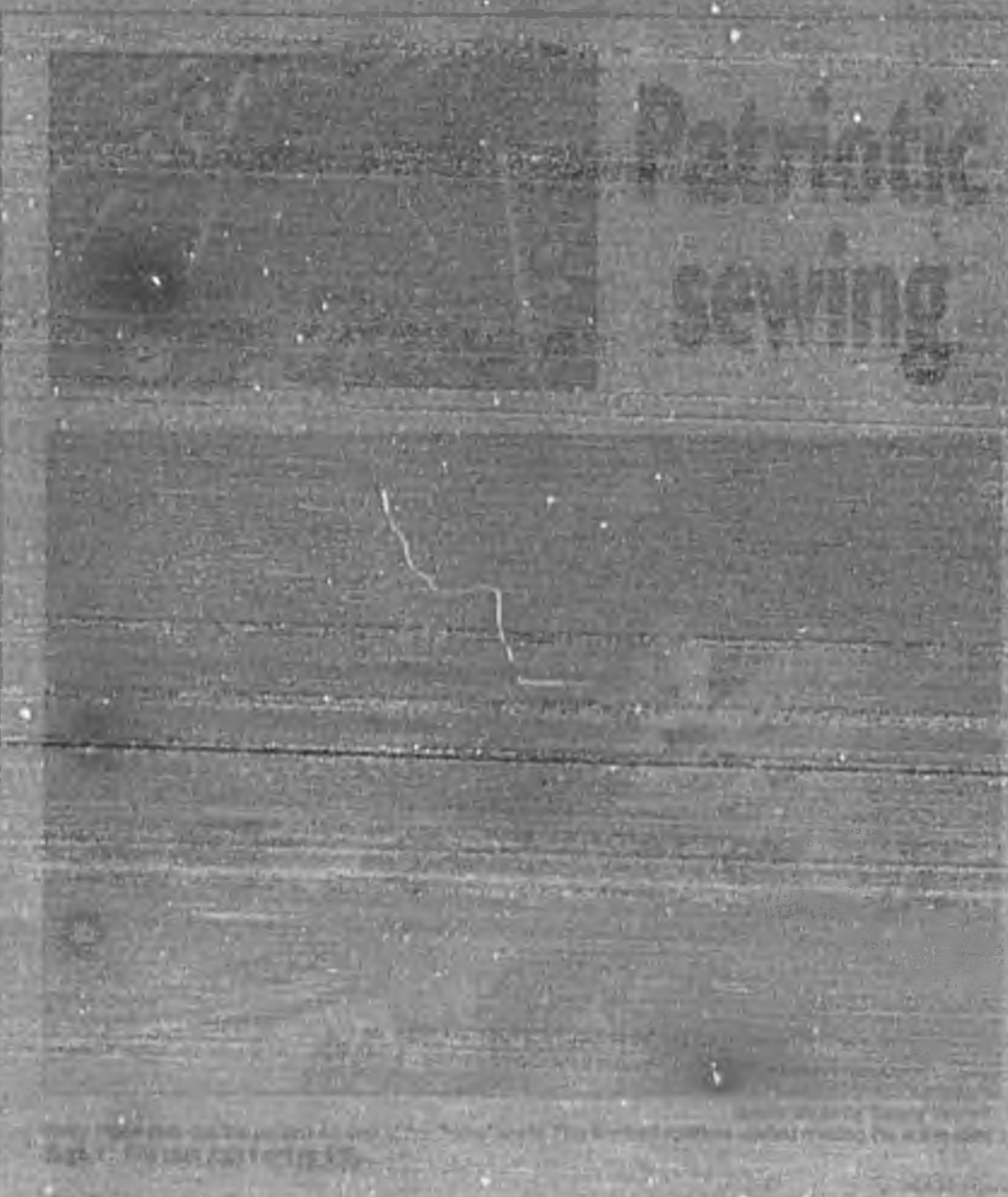

Visiting Ground Zero

Every year at this time, I comment on the anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor that launched America into World War II. This year, I haven't forgotten it, but my mind is focused on another attack on America that may also later turn into a war.

I visited "Ground Zero" in New York City on Thanksgiving week. Even though the towers were still there in 2001, the devastation is still very apparent. The actual site is now a hole in the ground — but a hole that occupies several city blocks. Finding compasses surrounds the site now, and while visitors can see the rubble, the towers are gone. The glass and steel structures were once a symbol of modernity, a symbol to those who pushed bricks as well as the firms whose workers who lost their lives in the attacks, and others.

There were large signs everywhere with the names of persons who perished in the buildings, and others of people who were rescued and others who were not. They needed what they were looking at and the entire scene of the situation.

At Ground Zero, the tall buildings were reduced to rubble. The towers were mostly covered in two or three stories high up to 30 or 30 stories. Several of the buildings had debris and wreckage along their side walls, and all of them were completely abandoned. I have no doubt many of these buildings will be demolished as work continues.

There were large signs everywhere with the names of persons who perished in the buildings, and others of people who were rescued and others who were not. They needed what they were looking at and the entire scene of the situation.

What do you see when you visit "Ground Zero"? I saw people and families, including children, and many of them were looking at the towers and the rubble.

I visited the World Trade Center site on Thanksgiving week. The towers were mostly covered in two or three stories high up to 30 or 30 stories. Several of the buildings had debris and wreckage along their side walls, and all of them were completely abandoned. I have no doubt many of these buildings will be demolished as work continues.

Remember These Holiday Safety Tips

You've decorated your home for the holidays, but did you keep safety in mind? According to the National Fire Protection Association, the most common Christmas tree fires in U.S. homes in 1993, and nearly 30,000 home fires from 1984 to 1993, were caused by lit candles. Here are some tips to help you keep your home safe.

CANDLES

- Use real or real candles. Synthetic candles become brittle when they get too hot. They are usually made of wax and can melt, dripping onto nearby objects.
- Turn off all candles immediately when you go to bed or leave the house. Overnight, they could melt and start a fire.

DECORATING

- Use only approved decorations.
- Never run an electric cord under a tree. Sparks from the tree might start a fire.
- Never put wreaths over a fireplace. Wreaths over a fire can catch fire or burn.

TREES

- If you have a real tree, water it every day. A dry tree is more likely to catch fire.
- Turn off the tree lights if you are going to bed or leave the house.

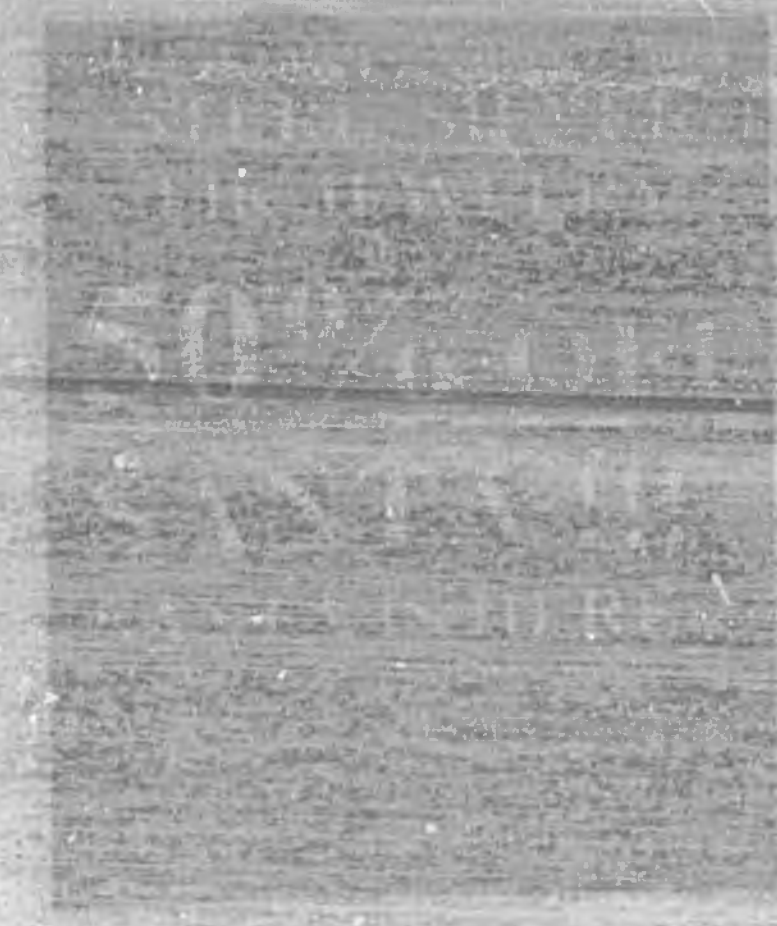

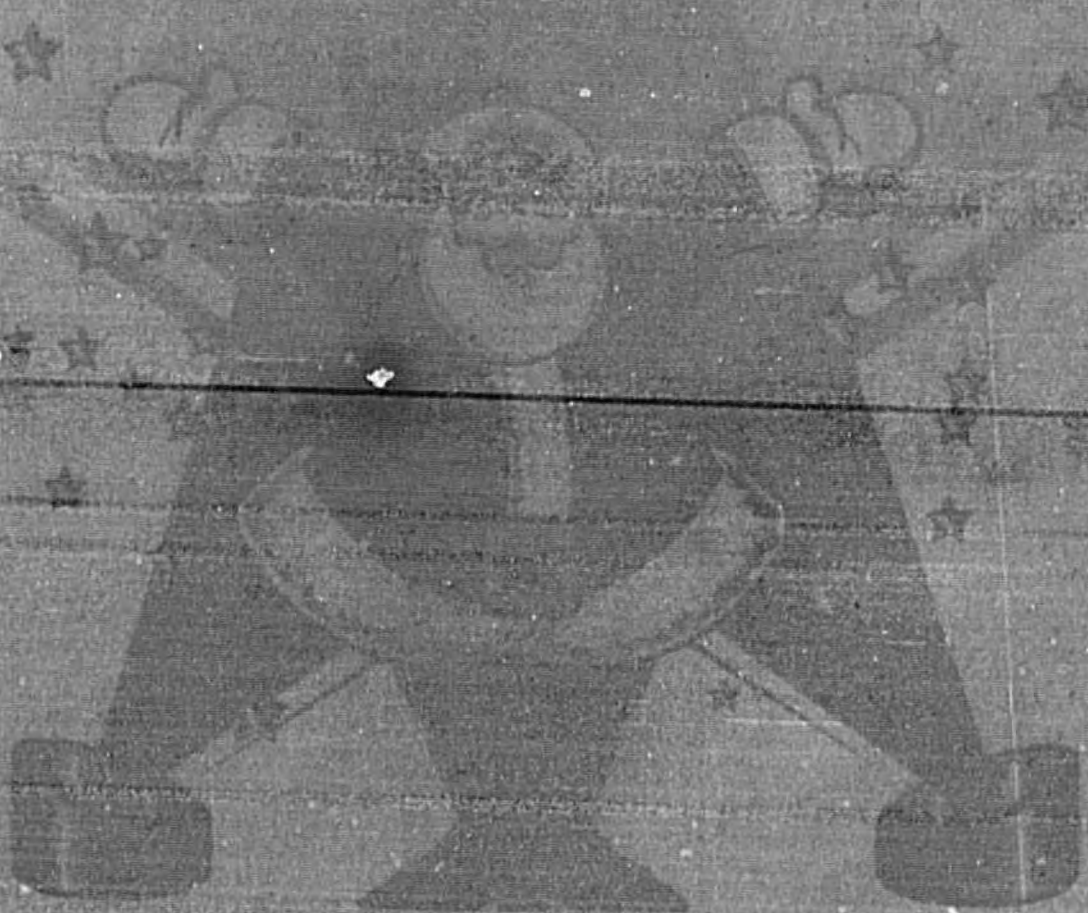

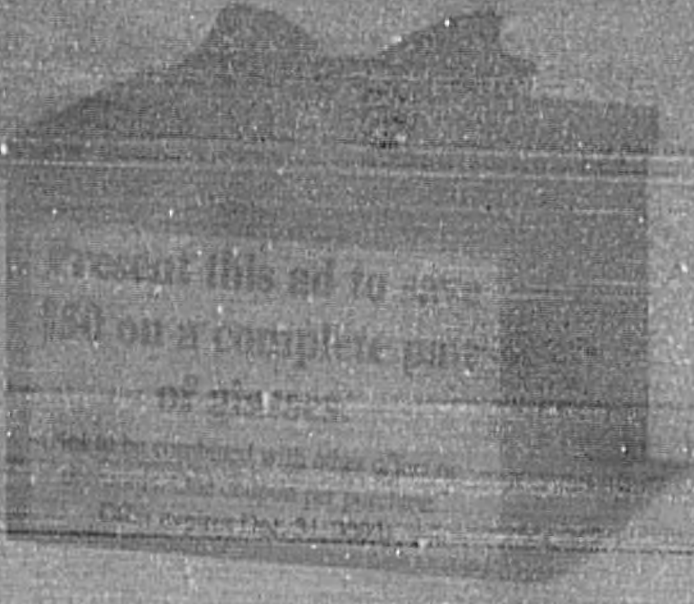
