Lyman Shapes Up As Loop Contender

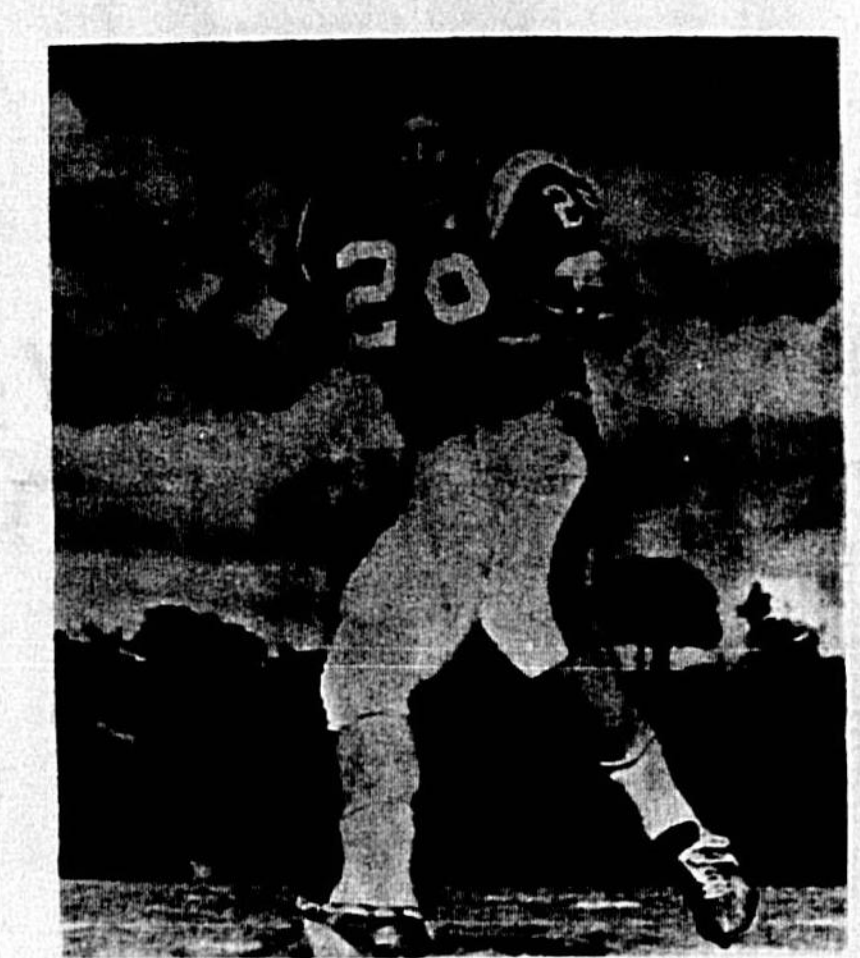

 The Orange Belt Conference appears ready for a big turnover this fall. Perennial OBC favorites, Wildwood and Kissimmee, figure to be no more than "also rans" in the gridiron race suffering from heavy losses through graduation. Included among the lettermen in the entire starting backfield, quarterback Bobby Nappi, fullback Jerry Semanich, and halfbacks Steve Barley and Jim Wesley. The passing combination of Nappi to veteran receiver Bob Busby, plus the rushes of Semanich, give Leesburg a formidable attack. The line also looks sound with eight returnees from the 1965 roster. With a few breaks and fewer injuries, either Lyman's Greyhounds or DeLand's Bulldogs could outdistance Leesburg and emerge at top dog in the OBC pack. Lyman hasn't had a winning season since becoming a Class A school three years ago but the "Hounds" and Coach Dick Copeland have high hopes this time around, boasting 10 lettermen in key positions. Cream of the crop should be fullback Paul Lambert and end Danny Overton who are rated among the top gridirers in the area. A predominantly rushing team in the past, the Greyhounds will take to the air on the wings of junior quarterbacks Mike Hertz and Jim Lucas, probably the best one-two punch in the conference. The addition of a passing attack should help to make the "Hounds" ground game even more effective than before. If the boys from Longwood can come through in the clutch, they might go all the way. DeLand will have a half-dozen lettermen, plus a bumper crop from an undefeated Jay Vee squad. Quarterback Roger Keefe and halfback Corley Stowell should pace the Bulldogs who will feature a lot of new, but capable performers. Wildwood and Kissimmee, longtime OBC powers, were hit hard by graduation and must be rated little more than dark-horse candidates. The Wildcats, OBC winners three years in a row and state champs in 1964, will have to find a replacement for signal caller Hamp Johnson. Junior Archie Levy is their apparent pick to the quarterback post and, if he comes through, the "Cats" could be tough. Kissimmee lost fullback Jim Crum, top rusher in the conference, as well as a number of other stalwarts. Guard Lorenzo Williamson and halfback Charles Swallows, standouts a year ago, are both back. The Lakeview Red Devils may have the top performer in the OBC in flashy halfback Dennis Reid, outstanding on both offense and defense. However, Coach Val Heckman's crew from Winter Garden are short on experience. Regulars beginning the fall are junior Bobby Downs of Winter Haven at left halfback, Grady at right halfback if he is healthy and junior Tom Hungerbuhler at safety. Hungerbuhler, of North Miami, has been bothered by an ankle injury and is also questionable. The secondary race is wide open, however, and coaches expect junior Dan Marry of Jacksonville and sophomore Gene Peak of Ocala to get into the battle for starting honors if they can overcome injuries. Sophomore Bill Gatorford of Fort Lauderdale was the top right halfback all spring with Grady out and he, too, figures in plans for fall. Lone personnel change from the spring will see multi-talented sophomore Larry Rentz

Scientists Ready To Tame Terror 'Faith' Smashes Ahead

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) -- Hurricane Faith, smashing across the northern fringes of the Leeward Islands, edged closer today toward a target area where man may make the first sustained effort to tame the terror of the tropics.

Scientists from Washington and California began work on Florida, ready to assemble in Florida, ready to go if we get the required cooperation from Faith. . . At 8 a.m., the hurricane was near the British Island of Antigua in the Leewards, 220 miles east of San Juan, the Puerto Rican capital, and about 1,300 miles east-southeast of the nearest U.S. mainland city, Miami.

The greater peril there and through the upper Leewards would come from 10-foot tides pounding over the coasts and heavy rain expected to drench the islands in the wake of the storm. . . If Faith sees into the Project Stormfury area, she will hit time and again by seeding planes flying in relays from the U. Navy base at Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico.

In the past, only one-shot seeding efforts have been made against hurricanes. This time a sustained bombardment is expected to prove, one way or the other, if man has a chance of breaking the power of the storm.

One Third Of County School-Bound

One-third of the population of Seminole County will begin, or continue the process of education next week. . . When Seminole County's 28 public and private schools open Monday, followed by six more private schools on Sept. 6, nearly 21,000 students and nearly 1,000 teachers, will fill hundreds of classrooms, night and day.

Seminole Junior College, the county's first institution of higher learning will open its doors to more than 650 students for the first time Monday morning. . . In addition, 22 county public schools in grades one through 12 and four private and parochial schools will add nearly 10,000 more students to the daily attendance records.

Private schools include Forest Lake Academy, All Souls, St. Mary Magdalen and Bishop Moore High School. (This Orange County school is attended by Catholic high school youth of the county.) Seminole County Business School will open also, with day and night classes.

On Sept. 6, Seminole County's new practical nurse school, across the street from Seminole Memorial Hospital, Sanford Naval Academy, Christian Day School in Maitland and St. Luke's Day School in Slavia will add 500 more students to the rolls.

In addition, adult night classes in many academic and vocational-technical fields will open again, with hundreds more persons in attendance. . . Added to this are approximately 1,000 college students who will be entering or returning to, dozens of colleges and universities throughout the state and nation.

Motorists are warned by law enforcement officials to drive cautiously as thousands of youngsters troop down sidewalks and across streets to board the big yellow buses. Student motorists, on their way to high schools and Seminole Junior College are urged to drive with care and leave home in plenty of time to get to school without rushing. . . This year, for the first time, school faculties are being de-segregated and pupil desegregation has been greatly increased. . . More than 150 new instructors have been added to school faculties.

Hospital Mum On Medicare

"No further comment" on the Medicare situation at Seminole Memorial Hospital was forthcoming today from A. B. Peterson Sr., chairman of the board of trustees.

Peterson told The Herald he has received a communication from the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, "which contained the same information" relayed by U. S. Rep. A. S. Herlong Jr. in telephone conversation with The Sanford Herald Thursday.

"I don't know where Mr. Herlong got the information that we would have a trustee meeting today, as reported in The Herald, but no such meeting has been called," Peterson declared.

The board chairman said that Robert Bessner, hospital administrator, is out of town and not expected back until Sunday. . . "We will call a meeting some time next week, after Bessner returns. As of now, I have not even talked to the other trustees about it," Peterson said.

"Until the board meets to study this matter, I have no further comment," he concluded. The Herald learned Thursday through Rep. Herlong and Associated Press that approval of the local hospital for Medicare is being delayed pending receipt of certain information on integration of room assignments, employees and student training programs.
