## Honoring our troops: Renato prepares to reboard ship

Marine Corps Lance Cpl. Renato J. Pinto, son of Concelcao A. and Edegar A. Pinto of Altamonte Springs, is preparing to re-board ships of the USS Nassau Amphibious Ready Group. He is assigned to the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU), based in Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Pinto's unit had been on a routine overseas deployment since August 2002 participating in exercises and operations in Djibouti, Kosovo, Kenya, the Arabian Gulf and Iraq. Pinto was preparing to return to his home base when he received orders to support Operation Iraqi Freedom in March.

Pinto's unit is an expeditionary intervention force with the ability to rapidly organize for combat operations in virtually any environment. MEUs are composed of more than 2,000 personnel and are divided into an infantry battalion, aircraft squadron, support group and command element. With this combination, Pinto's unit supplies and sustains itself for quick mission accomplishment and for clearing the way for follow-on forces.

Pinto is a 2000 graduate of Lake Brantley High School in Altamonte Springs. He joined the Marine Corps in September 2000.

# Woman trapped in vehicle after driving into lake

SANFORD — Cathy Cookman was trapped inside her minivan for nearly half an hour Tuesday afternoon when she veered off Seminole Boulevard and into Lake Monroe.

According to witnesses, Cookman was turning onto West Seminole Boulevard from North Mangoustine Avenue when she lost control of her vehicle and drove headfirst into the lake.

"She ran right over a post and into the water," said witness Jeanie Kimmons, who was a passenger in the vehicle directly behind Cookman. "It didn't seem like she attempted to stop or even hit the breaks. When we saw what happened, we couldn't just keep going, we had to stop and make sure she got help."

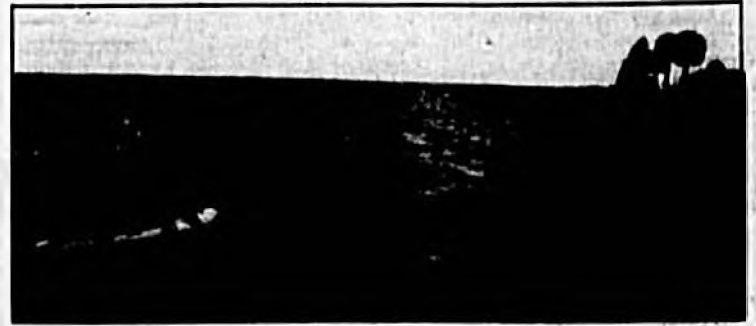
When Kimmons reached the edge of the sea wall, the front of Cookman's van was submerged in 2 to 3 feet of water and the back tires were balancing on the sea

wall. As another bystander placed a 911 call, Kimmons remained with Cookman, who was unresponsive.

"I just kept talking to her," Kimmons said. "She didn't appear to be quite right — maybe a diabetic, maybe drunk or maybe just in shock — I can't say for sure."

According to Lt. Tim Robles, inspector and public information officer of the Sanford Fire Department, although the water is

## Garden, walkway dedicated to fallen astronauts

On Feb. 1, when the Space Shuttle Columbia was lost during its re-entry into Earth's atmosphere, the construction of a memorial garden at Idyllwilde Elementary School took on new meaning.

When Principal David Scott presented his idea for a memorial walk and garden to the school's PTA more than a year ago, the original idea was to highlight community members and alumni of the school. After the shuttle tragedy, the concept grew to include a permanent memorial for the seven astronauts who lost their lives during Columbia's tragic flight.

"We already had a memorial for the astronauts who lost their lives in the Challenger explosion," Scott said. "When the accident happened with Columbia, we decided to incorporate a memorial for the astronauts in what we were already planning to do."

The school's memorial walk and garden officially opened Tuesday during a school assembly and ribbon cutting. Many of the students who listened to the dedication helped create the scenic area in front of the school.

"A lot of the kids helped with the garden," PTA President Patrick Stenstrom said. "They did a bit of everything — digging, planting, laying soil. It all came together and is now a beautiful thing."

The new addition to the school follows hours of planning and fund-raising by the PTA and student body, Stenstrom said. The entire project was funded through the

school's Parent/Teacher Association, as well as a donation of flowers and plants from Sanford's Quality Control Landscaping.

Along with a metal plaque dedicated to the Columbia astronauts, the garden includes

## City to announce new hotel deal

SANFORD — City officials are expected to announce this week a new plan for a downtown conference center that includes a key component missing from previous proposals: a commitment by a private developer to build a hotel.

Official details have not been released; however, multiple sources close to the negotiations say a private developer has approached the city about building a hotel and conference center.

A representative from the mayor's office would only confirm that a press conference regarding the conference center project has been tentatively scheduled for Thursday morning.

"There's a meeting going on right now to finish up the details," said Jeffrey Bauer, liaison to the mayor and city commission.

Unlike previous proposals, pre-

liminary sketches do not show a hotel connecting with the conference center space. Instead, the new plan calls for a multi-floor hotel on land occupied by the Best Western Marina Hotel. Sources say the developer, Suncor Properties Inc., has already obtained agreements with the principals in the Best Western property.

"Looks like it will be a Best Western hotel," said John Jones, economic development director for the city of Sanford. "It will be a very nice four-star Best Western."

In another departure from previous proposals, the new plan would not demolish the existing Civic Center. Instead, the Civic Center would receive substantial renovation including the possible addition of a second-level mezzanine. The Civic Center would be connected to a three-story structure located at the site of the

## Groundbreaking held for Seminole's new environmental center

On Thursday, May 15, at 9:30 a.m., the Environmental Studies Center had a groundbreaking ceremony to start their new facility.

The Environmental Studies Center is located at 2985 Osprey Trail, Longwood.

The new 6,100-square-foot \$1.1 million facility will include a new Natural History Museum/instructional room, a multipurpose room, support spaces for staff, and outdoor interpretive displays and kiosks. Minor site improvements for bus drop-off, parking, and storm water retention are also included.

The existing 1920's era school portable that was relocated from Lawton Elementary School in 1977 will be in use during construction, then demolished when the new facility is complete.

The exterior of the new building will be a cement fiber product which looks like wood lap siding, and will feature a full front porch, and covered learning area/pavilions on each end. The aluminum jalousee louvered windows will provide increased security of the center while adding to the "old style" Florida appearance. The interior entry

features a large open lobby with exposed truss ceiling. The east wing will have a 1,200-square-foot multipurpose space for both student and community weekend and evening use. The west wing will feature the 1,200-square-foot Natural History Museum that will be the new home for the various live and static displays of native wildlife and related topics currently at the Center.

The Environmental Studies Center is a cooperative effort between Seminole County Public Schools and the Seminole Board of County Commissioners. The program's goal is to increase environmental awareness, knowledge and responsibility while engendering feelings of protectiveness and ownership toward the environment.

Tours and activities are scheduled daily for first and fifth grade students. The center also provides teacher in-services and teaching materials to support classroom lesson plans.

School Superintendent Paul J. Hagerty, Ph.D., school board members, local elected officials, and the Friends of the Seminole County Environmental Studies Center Organization attended the groundbreaking ceremony.

## Cause of Historic District fire still unknown

SANFORD — Two historic homes located on Magnolia Avenue in the downtown Sanford Historic District were destroyed during a house fire early Saturday morning.

According to Mark James, a fire inspector with the Sanford Fire Department, the cause of the fire has not been determined.

"Due to the heat and the instability of the walls left after the fire, we [Sanford Fire Department] chose not to make entry and find an origin of the fire," said James. "We will not be

conducting an investigation, but the state fire marshal has completed his on-site investigation and will determine a cause and come back with a ruling."

According to James, the fires began at the home located at 801 Magnolia Avenue. The structure, owned by Clarice D. Delano, was being rented to her son and his two roommates. The men heard the smoke alarms and were able to escape without injury. However, the residents' two dogs were unable to make it out alive.

The son ran to his mother's home located at 807 Magnolia Avenue to

warn her of the fire. When he arrived at the door, Delano was already leaving the home after being awakened by her four dogs. She and the dogs made it out safely.

According to fire department reports, the fire at 807 Magnolia Avenue began nearly 1 minute after fire crews arrived on the scene.

"They had lumber, fuel, mattresses, furniture, boxes of papers and other things like that stored in both of the homes," said James. "This contributed to the heat generated and that is what caused the second fire and the amount of damage seen in both fires."

 Sanford Chamber of Commerce building at 1st Street and Sanford Avenue.  
 That multi-floor structure would house retail space along 1st Street, offices for the chamber of commerce and the Seminole County Tourism Development Council and a 40,000 square-foot meeting space. A 300- to 400-car parking garage would be located on the second and third floors of the structure.

Plans also call for a large, outdoor amphitheater that could seat approximately 2,500 people. At this time, officials expect the conference center complex to be called Seminole County Convention Center at Riverwalk.  
 Exactly how funding for the project will take shape and how much the private developer will shoulder is unclear. However, one official said the public sector cost would be considerably less expensive than the \$14 to \$18 million

approved by the Seminole County Commission. County officials had proposed spending up to \$700,000 of Tourism Development Council revenue each year for 30 years. This official said the county's cost could be about \$300,000, with Sanford contributing an equal amount, over a 20 year period. The city currently spends \$180,000 annually to maintain the Civic Center.  
 "I haven't gotten all the figures, but it looks like the county's share

will be substantially less," confirmed Daryl McLain, chairman of the Seminole County Commission.  
 Suncor Properties Inc. is a Lake Mary-based company that has most recently completed commercial and residential developments in Lake Mary and Heathrow. Last week the Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission approved the company's site plan for a \$12 to \$15 million residential/retail complex on Lake Monroe just west of City Hall.

 only a few feet deep if she had gone over the wall, she could have sunk 4 foot in soot. Dive teams were deployed in case the back tires slipped, but were not needed.  
 According to Kimmons, the response time for the police and fire department teams was almost immediate.  
 According to Robles, once rescue workers reached Cookman she was conscious and responsive. She didn't have her seatbelt on, but may have taken it off after the accident in an attempt to get out of the vehicle. Workers removed van seats and carried Cookman out through the back of the van on a stretcher.  
 This is the second driver this year to veer off the roadway and into Lake Monroe. An average of

six accidents a year occur on this stretch of highway in front of the Central Florida Regional Hospital.  
 "There are several of us who want to see guardrails up here," said Sgt. P. Jankowski of the Sanford Police Department. "It will take more of the crosses before it happens."  
 The crosses Jankowski speaks of are those marking the many fatalities that occur at the edge of Lake Monroe.  
 "This seems to be a hot spot to have cars end up in the lake," said Robles.  
 According to Robles, Cookman was admitted to Central Florida Regional Hospital in stable condition with minor injuries, including slight back and neck pain, cuts and bruises.

 "I am going to take this plaque back to the Center for Education, where it will be displayed for a while," Gillis said. "And then, I will send it through the various facilities at NASA, where people who work on the actual shuttle can see it."

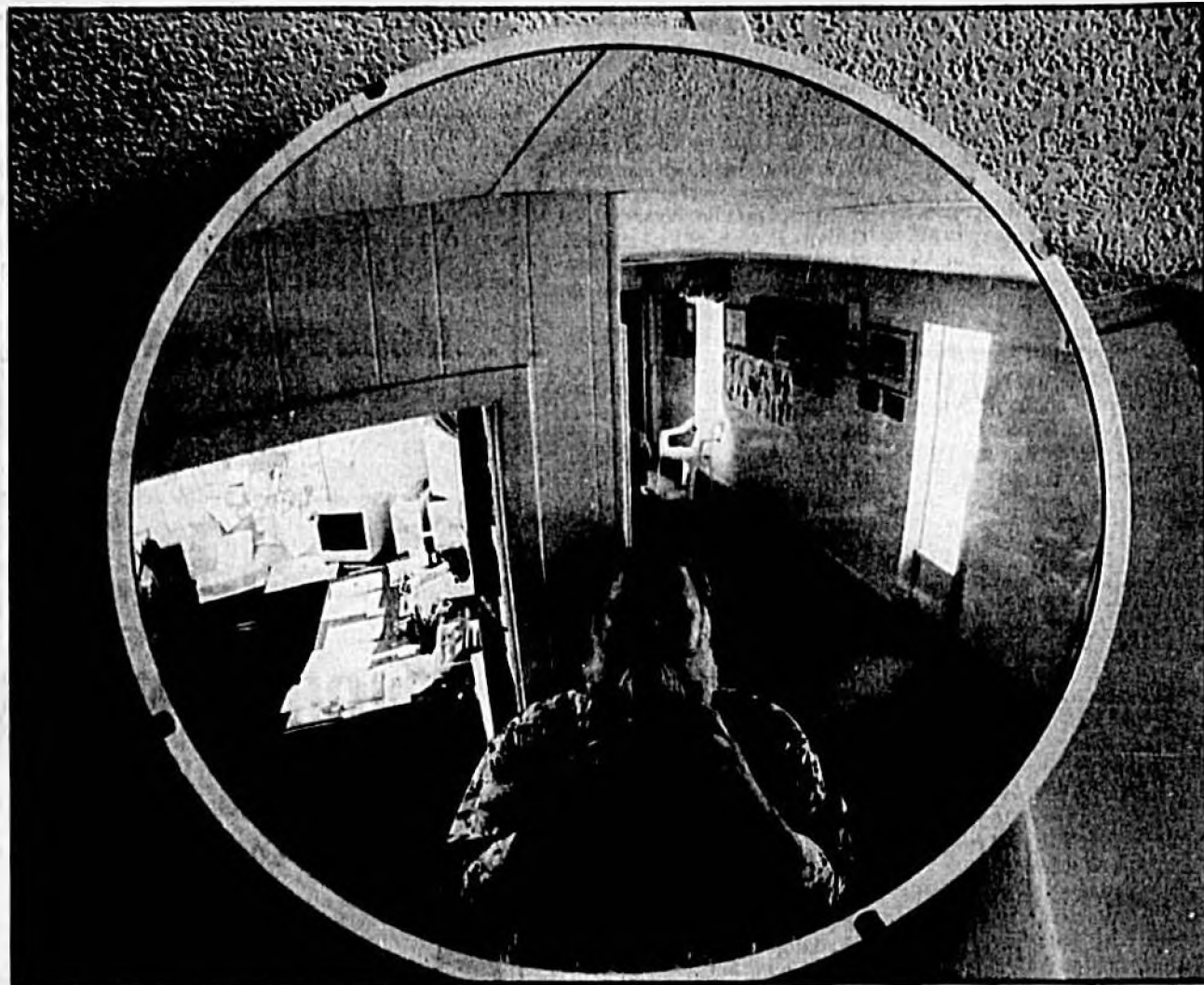

Former Major League pitcher, and Tampa native, Dwight "Doc" Gooden threw out the first pitch prior to the game and the game started as hot as the weather.

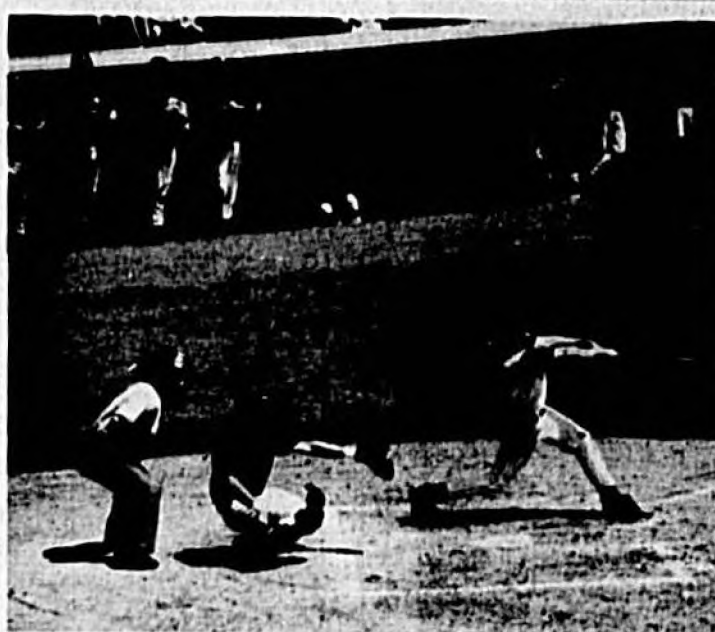
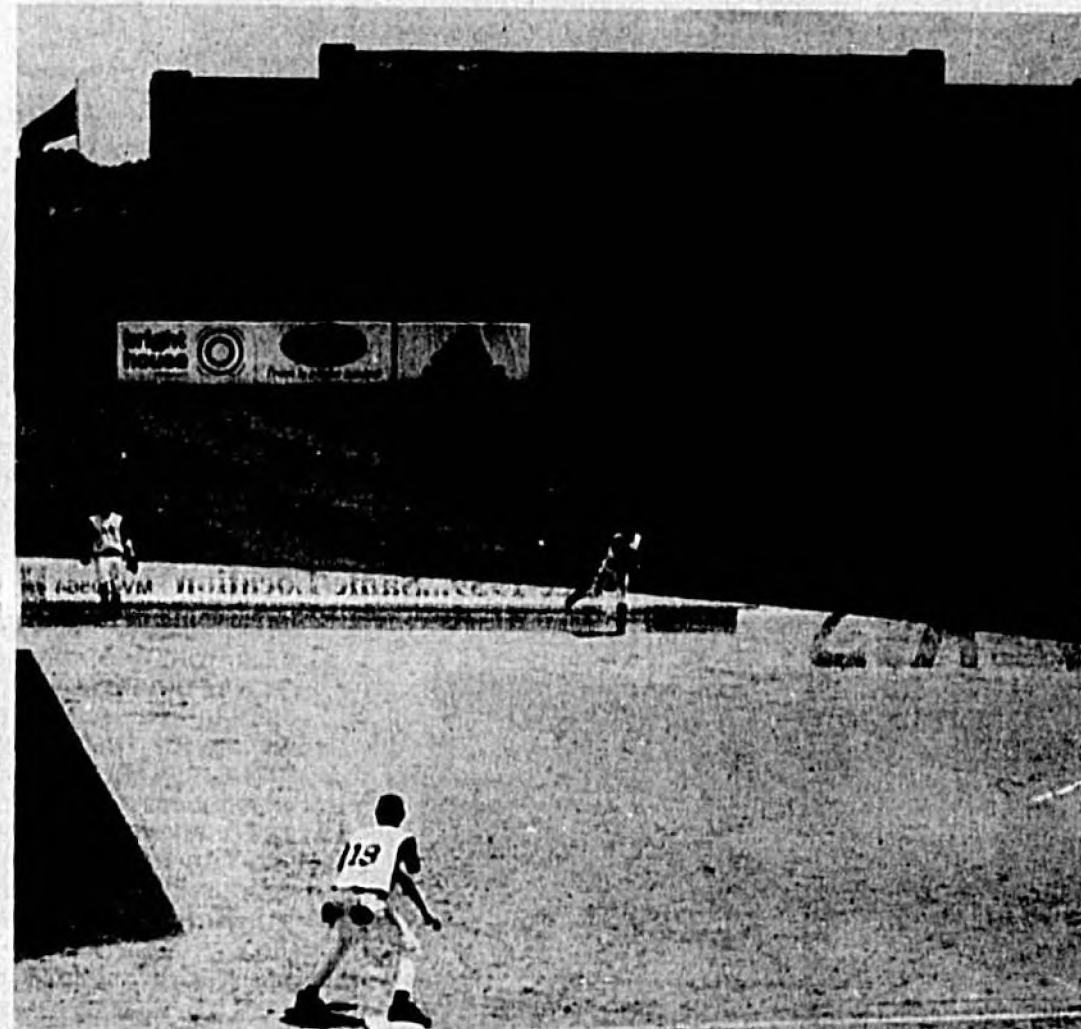

## FWC to offer free education courses

**OCALA** — The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is offering a free hunter education course in Chuluota in Seminole County on June 14 and 15 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Participants must pre-register by calling the FWC's Hunter Education Training Center at (352) 625-2804. Classes fill quickly so please register early.

To successfully complete the course, students must attend all class sessions, pass a written exam and participate on the firing range. Class materials, guns and ammunition will be provided, but participants must bring their own pen, pencil and paper to take notes.

The course covers survival, wildlife iden-

tification, hunting laws, ethics, first aid and gun safety, and is required for anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 in order to purchase a Florida hunting license.

For information on future hunter education classes and classes in other areas, please visit the FWC's Hunter Education website at <http://floridaconservation.org/huntered/>.

The FWC will also be offering bowhunting education classes in the area.

The first will be in Winter Park on June 7 and the other will be in Geneva on June 28.

The class is free and open to the public, and is offered for those wishing to learn how to hunt with bow and arrow.

The emphasis is on bowhunter history, safety, ethics, fundamental skills, techniques

and tackle. The course is based on the National Bowhunter Education Foundation text.

Some states require a Bow Hunter Education course in order to bow hunt.

Pre-registration is required and anyone under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. This course is not really suited to younger children.
