BROOKLYN, July 1. (AP)—The Boston Braves, who had not beaten the Brooklyn Dodgers in 15 consecutive games, bounced back last night to triumph yesterday to spoil Hugh Casey's venture as a starting pitcher.

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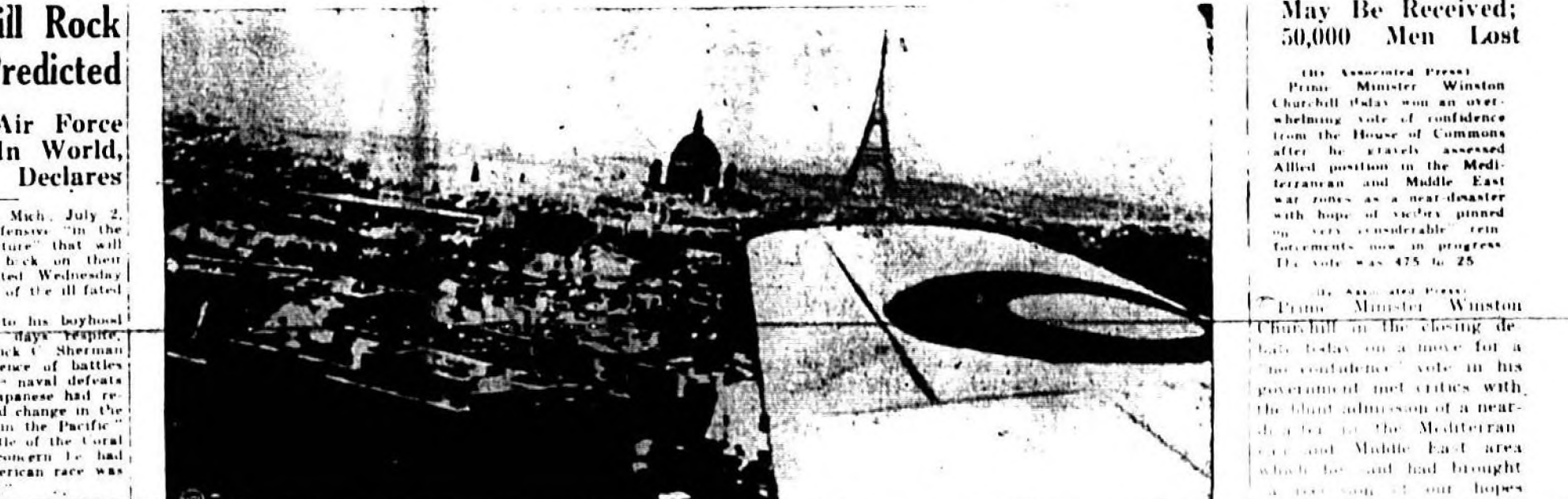

Interesting Facts Are Revealed At U. Of F. Physical Program

GAINESVILLE, July 2, (Special)—University of Florida's special "physical fitness" program, in which there are participating approximately 1,000 male students here for summer school studies, has already revealed some interesting facts and as time and training goes on, the conclusions may become even more significant.

Tom Lieb, head football coach, and his staff, including assistant football coach, Frank Gammon, swimming coach, and Orv Dermody, assistant football coach, have been putting the students through some busy sessions, but it is a study of the first tests administered to the group which has brought forth some interesting data that has quite fascinated Mentor Lieb.

Take the item of the rope climb, for example. The individual is directed to hoist his weight up a 20-foot rope, starting from a sitting position. It was astonishing, but in one section, which contained 282 men, 36 could not climb one foot. Forty-two made it to the top of the rope, but approximately 40 percent had to call it quits somewhere under eight feet.

Then in the matter of the pull-up, or what the boys commonly refer to as "chinning yourself," Lieb found that nine could not chin themselves at all and 120 could reach the bar less than five times. Somewhere between 5 and 10 chin-ups was the record of 134, while 24 made it between 10 and 15, and four of the group chinned themselves over 15 times.

The push-up event brought out these findings: Of the 282, four could push up less than five times. Twenty-five could go between 5-10; 85 between 10-15; 71 between 15-20; 86 between 20-30, and 11 pushed on up and beyond the 30 mark.

The broad jump was another event on the test schedule. Three did less than five feet. It was found that 178 could not jump

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Elden Auker Wins No. 10 For Browns

DETROIT, July 2, 1942.—Elden Auker, veteran submarine ball specialist, became the first Auker League pitcher to win 10 games when he blanked the Detroit Tigers in five hits in a 5-0 light contest last night while the St. Louis Browns were rapping out 14 for a 12 to 0 victory.

Auker permitted only one run to reach third base as he beat Ernie Bonham of the New York Yankees and Jim Bagby of the Cleveland Indians, both of whom have won nine, to 10-0 length victory. Auker has lost six.

The Browns hammered Rookie Hal White for seven runs on eight hits before driving home only in the fifth, and another scout Hal Manders was touched for six safeties including George M. Quinn's eighth home run in 15-11 with one aboard and Mike Charak's sixth with the bases unoccupied in the ninth.
