

Duke, Army And T.C.U. Chosen As Best Major Units

Blue Devils Likely To Get Rose Bowl Choice From South

NEW YORK, Nov. 28.—(AP)—With Duke, Texas Christian and Army contributing the outstanding performances of 1938 college football's last big Saturday, the game today was ready to be delivered into the hands of the chambers of commerce that back post-season contests in a string of bowls stretching from Pasadena, Calif., to Miami, Fla.

All the unbeaten major elevens except Notre Dame, Tennessee, Oklahoma and Texas Tech have completed their regular schedules. Those four, forced to win their closing games next Saturday from Southern California, Mississippi, Washington State and Centenary, respectively, rate consideration as bowl material—he it Rose, Sun, Cotton, Cotton, Orange or Sun.

Candidates, too, are Duke, 7-0 winner over Pitt and first-ranking team since the "uninvited" Colgate crew of 1932 to finish unbeaten, untied and unscorched; Texas Christian, Southwest conference champion, which has already been tendered a bid to the Cotton bowl; Villanova, tied only by South Carolina and undefeated in its last 20 games; Georgetown, lone major eastern eleven to go through its schedule without defeat or tie, and Western Reserve.

still are in the tentative stage. The Rose Bowl defender, either Southern California or California, will be named at noon tomorrow and that team then will have the right to select its eastern opponent; T. C. U. won't reply to the Dallas invitation for several days, and New Mexico is expected to answer favorably to the Sun Bowl bid, and likely to have either Georgetown or Western Reserve as its rival.

If a southern team is chosen to go to Pasadena, it will be either Duke or Tennessee. The Blue Devils, through Coach Wallace Wade, announced several weeks ago they weren't interested in post-season propositions, but that conquest of Pitt, final and conclusive evidence of Duke's right to a position with the nation's best, may change their minds.

At no stage in its campaign has Duke shown great offensive power. In nine games Wade's team scored only 13 points, yet the Blue Devils had the defensive strength to make one touchdown enough to beat Pitt. Police Given Instructions On Gambling

Chief Williams Will Continue Drive On Rackets In Co-Operation With County

Miller Reports To Commission

Judge Says There's No "Monkey Business" In Municipal Court

Chief of Police Roy G. Williams was instructed to continue his work against organized gambling, in close co-operation with County law enforcement officers, by the City Commission last night after he had reported that the Police Department has been working continuously to rid the city of gambling tickets.

Municipal Judge Frank L. Miller also reported to the Commission that City law enforcement officers "are doing everything possible under the circumstances" to curb gambling in the city. As an aid to the better enforcement of the laws against gambling, Judge Miller requested enactment of another ordinance covering "Cuba" sellers and operators in particular and placing the maximum fine which can be levied for this time at \$100 instead of \$25 which the gambling ordinance permits at present.

Judge Miller declared that the report of the Grand Jury to Circuit Judge Millard B. Smith last Friday was a compliment to the ability of the City enforcement officer. "The Grand Jurors all but said that the City officers are the only ones that can cope with the situation," Judge Miller said.

He added, however, that he did not feel it the duty of the City to work up cases for the State when the crimes committed are felonies and are punishable by imprisonment for long terms. This, he said, is out of the jurisdiction of the City.

Pointing out that the Police Department has made 132 arrests for gambling in the past year, Chief Williams told the Commissioners that so far as he has been able to ascertain, through the Lake Alfred Growth Association packing plant, and to day that two men who had placed striking pickets were stoned this morning by a crowd near the plant.

He said the men, whom he did not have available, were not being hurt and that deputies soon dispersed the crowd. He estimated there were about 300 persons in the crowd.

The incident followed shortly after several hundred front pickers went on strike in this area in sympathy with about 60 others who have been protesting against a pay cut at the Lake Alfred packing house since Nov. 17.

Members of the two pickers unions affiliated with the Congress of Industrial Organization, carried out their threat to walk off their jobs at five packing plants in sympathy with the strikers at the Lake Alfred Association plant.

Edward Norman, union secretary, said about 600 men were involved in the general walkout.

Norman said the workers would demand collective bargaining contracts before returning to work.

The Lake Alfred walkout followed a wage cut of one cent per box for "cleanup" picking of oranges, grapefruit and tangerines.
