




a deal to avoid prosecution. The Herald was unable to contact Mayor Norman Floyd to determine if he intends to suspend Bundy, who began a two-week vacation today and could not be contacted.







TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Sen. Lew Brantley, D-Jacksonville, says he has contacted some fellow senators about the possibility of electing him to the Senate presidency for 1977-78.

Brantley said Thursday he did not believe the top contenders for the post, Kenneth Myers, D-Miami, and Dan Scarborough, D-Jacksonville, could get enough votes to win, the Miami News reported.

"I have chatted with some of the members to let them know I would be interested if the top two contenders could not garner enough votes," Brantley said. "I've had a good bit of encouragement."

Public Patronage Meetings

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Sen. David McClain, R-Tampa, has filed a bill to require committees that give advice on patronage appointments to hold public

McClain said Thursday that the bill was a companion for his earlier bill that would abolish the committees. "I'd rather see them abolished but I'm enough of a political realist to know this will draw opposition from the governor's people," he said. McClain said that open meetings would assure that the

committees make recommendations based on merit rather than political activity. Gov. Reubin Askew and others have relied heavily on local advisory committees to make appointments which McClain said had damaged party structures.

Rate Hike Opposed

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Public Service Commissioner Billy Mayo says he will oppse an attempt by the Florida Power Corp. to put a \$14.5 million rate hike into effect Aug. 1.

Mayor said he would also demand hearings for the firm to justify the increase. The state's new public-counsel law allows a utility to put a rate increase into effect unless the PSC objects within 30

days after a rate application is filed. If the PSC objects, it has eight months to take final action on a proposed hike.

Florida Power, based in St. Petersburg, filed for the increase July 5 and asked that it go into effect Aug. 1
