Threats Poor Way To Pump World Oil

We can't help but entertain a few reservations about recent speeches by President Ford and Secretaries Kissinger and Simon concerning the price and availability of Arab oil.

We suspect that the tough talk was as much for domestic as for foreign consumption, but we fear that it'll be taken a lot more seriously in the Mid-East than in Grand Rapids.

It smacked just a little of saber-rattling and that, we suspect, isn't going to provide the basis for a long-term settlement of the problem. The Arabs have the oil — that is a fact that we

must keep in mind at all times. The Arabs have been ripped off by American businessmen in the past - that is another fact that we must keep in mind at all times.

So the Arabs are, naturally, enough a little touchy about the subject. And when we start threatening, however obliquely, to shut off or reduce food supplies in retaliation, we are playing into the hands of those who would like to undercut whatever remaining influence the United States retains in the Arab world.

President Ford's main point that the world economy is so interdependent that any precipitous action by any one or any group of nation carrie with it world-wide reaction was well taken. We just wish that he had used a little softer language and had talked to the Arabs alone and not to the Arabs and the electorate at the same time.

WORLD **IN BRIEF** Rome Is Burning

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Giovanni Leone of Italy is reported ready to tell congressional leaders and high government officials that with some outside help Italy will move away from the brink of bankruptcy. The Italian leader will meet today with congressmen on Capitol Hill and U.S. officials at Blair House, the guest house of American presidents.

The warning that "Rome is burning" has been heard for months in American circles concerned about the political and economic future of Italy, where unemployment is rising, currency reserves are declining and the inflation rate is more than 18 per cent.

Italian sources quoting Leone said that the picture of Italian politics and economics is not as bleak as depicted by some observers. The 66-year-old president is expected to convey the same thinking when he meets first House Foreign Affairs Committee members, then for lunch with the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

Portuguese Empire Dying

LISBON, Porgual (AP) - A Lisbon newspaper predicted today that Portugal would soon establish diplomatic relations with China and may give up its colony of Macao at the mouth of the Canton River. O Seculo reported that Foreign Minister Mario Soares has been in contact with the Chinese delegation at the United Nations General Assembly in New York. The tiny Portuguese enclave near Hong Kong has 260,000 residents, about 6,000 of them of Portuguese origin and the rest Chinese.

The present Portuguese military government, which ousted the heirs of the rightist Salazar dictatorship in April, is committed to disband Portugal's 500-year-old

Fifi's Damage

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras - No one in Honduras paid much attention early last week as Hurricane Fifi crept through the Caribbean sea.

It was just another storm to the 2.6 million people in this triangle-shaped Central American country. Fifi is gone. But Honduras, a nation reeking of poverty, is flat on its back with Fifi's name etched forever in the national memory, the worst disaster in Honduran history. The government estimates that 7,500-8,000 died. No one will ever know for sure how many perished. The National Emergency Committee said another 100,000 are

Shah Denounces Pressure

CANBERRA, Australia (AP) - The Shah of Iran today flatly rejected American pressure for reduced world oil prices. "No one can dictate to us," said the shah, in Australia on a state visit. "No one can wave a finger at us, because we will wave a finger back." He said the only solution was for people to "work a little barder." Meanwhile, Abderrahman Khene of Algeria, secretary-general of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries, said in Vienna that oil prices which quadrupled in the past year may rise next year at the same rate as inflation.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) - Greece has ruled out Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger as a mediator in its deadlock with Turkey over the future of Cyprus. Ford Vows Equality In Inflation War

WASHINGTON (AP) - Declaring that no miracle cure is in sight, President Ford convened his economic summit today and quickly found his administration's anti-inflation policies under attack from congressional Democrats.

Ford predicted in his opening remarks that "we as Americans can and will win" the fight against inflation, and hinted at tax cuts for the poor so no group is "called upon to carry an unfair share of the load."

House Speaker Carl Albert, who followed Ford to the microphone, complained that some congressional recommendations for economic action had been overlooked in presummit con-

"The administration in effect has spoken of the old-time religion" of tax incentives for business and cutback of programs for the poor, Albert

The Oklahoma Demccrat pledged "compromise and conciliation" because "the problems we face are too serious to allow partisan

Next to speak was Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield, who said "in all candor I am not too optimistic about the result" of the summit conference, broadcast nationally by public television and radio.

Both Albert and Mansfield questioned whether Ford's proposed cuts in the federal budget would have much impact on inflation.

"At best," Mansfield said, "the federal budget is only a fraction of the answer." The President puffed on his pipe as he listened to the Democratic congressional leaders blend

criticism of his policies with suggestions for

In his opening remarks, Ford indicated he was

moving toward tax cuts for the poor, who he said had been hit hardest by inflation. "This administration will seek to ensure that burdens are distributed equally," he said.

Noting the presence of observers from other nations, Ford also said inflation is an international problem and the United States will "consult with friends abroad as we move to combat an international threat." The President confirmed what many ob-

servers had expected - that he made a significant start in preparing an anti-inflation program even in advance of the summit. "We are already narrowing some of the op-

tions to those which would appear most effective and command widest support," he said. Ford said the summit, like a dozen

preliminary conferences this month, "is wide open." He continued:

"All views and opinions are invited. This administration's commitment to visible and responsive government remains intact. I might not like everything I hear. But it is my solemn duty as President of the United States to give fair consideration to all views and to carefully weigh the possible courses of action."

Restating a caution against expectation of "quick or easy solutions," Ford said:

"No miracle cure has emerged from the preconference meetings. Inflation is a problem which we must deal with patiently and persistently.... It will require sacrifice and common effort. It will require discipline, but we will win." Ford said the summit was "in the tradition of the American town hall" and represented a joint executive-legislative initiative undertaken in response to a bipartisan congressional recom-






