

WASHINGTON (AP) - A nationwide postal strike is threatened next week if union and management officials fail to agree on a new two-year contract for 600,000 postal "There will be no mail deliveries next Monday morning

if we can't reach agreement within the week," warned President James H. Rademacher of the National Association of Letter Carriers. Even though postal workers are forbidden by law from

striking, Rademacher says "if we have no contract we have a right to withhold our services."

The letter carriers union is one of four unions whose contract with the Postal Service expires at midnight Sunday. Should the parties fail to reach agreement on their own, the law authorizes fact-finding and, finally, binding arbitration as a means of resolving their dispute. ### Gasoline Price Hike Seen

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford's proposal to end domestic oil price controls could increase the cost of gasoline by 7 cents a gallon and raise consumer prices by nearly 1 per cent, administration spokesmen say. The over-all impact would cost the average family \$200

a year in higher energy prices. Administration officials say this is the price the nation must pay to increase its supplies of domestically produced oil and to conserve energy.

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica (AP) -- The United States is proposing another meeting of the Organization of merican States at the end of the month to speed up the removal of the remnants of the organization's 11-year-old ban on trade and diplomatic relations with Cuba. Delegates from the 24 OAS members begin a 12-day

meeting in San Jose on Wednesday to consider a proposal to require only a majority vote instead of the present twohirds to remove the quarantine the organization voted against Fidel Castro's Communist regime in 1964. However, the voting change could not be put into effect until ratified by the 21 signers of the organization's Mutual Defense Treaty, a process that could take years.



### Councilman Balks At Insurance Cost

# Bond Issue May Be Illegal, Zacco Says

CASSELBERRY - Councilman John Zacco last night said the City Council's okay to float a \$2 million bond issue "may be illegal" and is a matter for an investigation by the state at-

"I don't know if it's illegal, but it possibly could be. Other sources have indicated it is," Zacco said. The \$2 million is earmarked for purchase of General Waterworks Corp., a Winter Park based utility which operates in

"Are you aware of what you're saying?" Council Chairman Zacco said a bonding plan proposed by Harvey Henann, a private investment banker, increases expenses to the city by adding on a \$55,000 to \$61,000 insurance charge.

"This one-time expense (insurance) puts

than 71/2 per cent interest," Zacco charged. Henann admitted the insurance "will be necessary under present market conditions." Zacco said no benefit accrues to the city. Contacted today, Zacco was uncertain whether he would ask State Attorney Abbott Herring for a probe into the issue.

Councilman Sal Orlando said the insurance "puts bonds into a much more favorable light. This one time expense puts the entire proposition in a more favorable light," he said. Last night's approval was part of a \$9 million package. The



### **Time Has Come** To Cut Deficits

There are unmistakable signs of strength in the sometimes erratic pulse of the American economy. Business indicators which point to future trends are combining to convince many economists that the basic direction of the economy is turning toward stable and healthy growth. The main point of dispute is on the question of time - whether the turnaround will have the sharpness of a V on an economic graph or the softer curve of the letter U.

Whether one subscribes to the V-school or the U-school, logic argues that the recent spurt in retail sales coupled with a decline in inventories must eventually produce an upturn in production which will begin whittling away at the unemployment rate. Moreover, a 27 per cent rise in building permits promises to buoy up the ailing construction

The quarterly report on the international balance of payments showed a \$475 million deficit - a figure that would be disappointing in other times. However, compared to the \$6.57 billion deficit in the previous quarter, it suggests that efforts to recycle our dollars spent for imported oil are bearing some fruit.

Perhaps the most promising news of all does not come from the economic statisticians. 

When persons go to the inspection station, they should make absolutely certain they have documents substantiating both insurance coverage and current registration, else everyone's time goes



### **IN BRIEF Campbell To Testify**

### In Forbes' Trial

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (AP) - National Hockey League President Clarence Campbell was scheduled to testify today in the assault trial of Boston Bruins' hockey

player Dave Forbes. Forbes, 26, is charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon - his hockey stick - in an altercation with Henry Boucha of the Minnesota North Stars during an NHL game Jan. 4.

Campbell suspended Forbes for 10 days without pay following the incident in which Boucha received eye injuries requiring stitches. Boucha, who has since signed with the Minnesota Fighting Saints of the World Hockey Association, testified last week he still suffers doube vision as a result of the incident.
