





Individual Income Taxes Of 10 Million People Are Slashed; **Business Taxes Cut**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9, AP) The White House announced today that President Truman had signed the bill giving individuals and business a slash of \$5,920, 000,000 in 1946 faxes. Thus he became the first President in 16 years to sign a general tax reduction measure. The last was in 1929 when Herbert Hoover put his signa-ture on a "Christmas Present".
