Lights! Buzzer! Cut! No action - you just sat down in a 1974 automobile and tried to start it without fastening the seat belts.

Sensors in the front seats detect the presence of the driver and passengers and will signal the interlock system to prevent driving - until all necessasry seat belts are buckled. This was done, of course, in compliance with federal safety regulations. Even if the car is in neutral and the driver unbuckles the belt, the buzzer will sound and the light will flash until the belt is buckled again.

The system will also prevent the car from operating if the belt is buckled before the driver or passenger sits in the

"This is one more example of solid state electronics being utilized by the automotive manufacturers to make highway vehicles safer, more efficient and more maintenance free than ever before," said Bernard V. Vonderschmitt, vice president and general manager, RCA Solid State Division, a major supplier. "We envision the day when a wide variety of automotive

systems, ranging from antiskid devices to collision avoidance systems, will be automatically controlled in a truck, bus or automobile by solid state electronic systems. "Before the end of this decade, the automotive industry will be using \$3 billion worth of electronic equipment for automotive systems such as obstacle detectors, antiskid braking systems, sobriety detection devices, variable speed windshield wipers and ignition systems which reduce

pollution," Vonderschmitt said. The reason automotive designers are taking a creative look at electronics, he added, is that solid state devices such as transistors, thyristors and integrated circuits offer such advantages as improved reliability, low power consumption, low cost, compactness and light weight.

Not all of these systems whill be popular with the auto owners, however. The seat belt interlocks, for certain, are sure to elicit some strong words on occasion, especially when there is a malfunction.

Casselberry Council Actions

The city council Monday night voted unanimously to get engineering under way to nearly triple the capacity of the sewage treatment plant it purchased little more than two months ago and to go "on our own" to fund the expansion. At the same time the board authorized negotiations to purchase additional land for polishing ponds to handle the expanded plant capacity.

The expansion may not take place at the present Winter Park Drive-Cross Street site, City Manager Ron Bergman and Utility Director John Lane said. The site will depend on availability of property and its price tag. During a discussion on the possibility of obtaining

federal funding for any phase of the program, Bergman said federal moneys are not being awarded except for regional plants and the Casselberry area is not in line for a regional plant for several years. "If the city is going to expand, we will have to fund it on our own," Bergman said. The city in its negotiations to purchase the water and sewer utility last September insisted that the 700,000 gallon per day capacity plant at that time be expanded to 1.4 million

gallons per day. The new expansion is to bring the facility to "at least" 4 million gallons per day capacity. Much of the capacity is needed for new developments already on the drawing board, Lane said. Lester Mandell, a principal of Greater Construction Company, Monday night unveiled plans for a \$2 million mobile home park development to be called Seminole Sites. Mandell said the 50 acre parcel, bounded by Lake Kathryn Park to the east and the Colonnades to the north, will have 188 lots and be developed all at one time. The lots, to be sold as mobile home sites, are to be a

minimum of 75 by 100 feet, he said. Mandell agreed to donate 2.5 acres to the city for recreation purposes and to prepare this land for recreation development. He also said he will plant trees on site at the rate of 10 per acre.



U.S.-China Trade:

It Is Far Exceeding Any Expectations

involved in trade with the People's Republic of China for years are sitting back these days utterly amazed at how rapidly Sino-American trade relations have been developing.

No one, including the American businessman, ever imagined that the level of two-way trade would grow as rapidly as it has. Early this year, there were bold - and some thought overoptimistic - predictions that two-

way trade between China and the United States would amount to some \$300 million in 1973. Now U.S. government trade officials, with undisguised grins, are saying the level of twoway Sino-American trade will amount to more than \$700 million this year.

And that level of trade will push the United States into the position of being China's second largest trading partner after Japan.

Some of the bolder analysts now are beginning to talk about the U.S. overtaking Japan as Peking's largest trading partner in 1974. There appears, in fact, no reason why that

There are several reasons for this rapid trade growth. Not the least of them is the fact that the United States has the agricultural commodities China (and many other countries) have been unable to produce in sufficient quantities themselves.

Peking's problems began with a severe drought last year. Weather conditions have been only marginally better this year, with both drought and floods affecting production.

Other Thoughts

SPEAKING OF FOOD costs-and who isn'there's how 31/2 cents worth of tomatoes becomes a 29 cent can of tomatoes at your supermarket. The processor, who buys the tomatoes by the ton, pays an average of 3.4 cents per can to the farmer. His processing and container costs run 12.8 cents. Marketing and distribution costs-shipping, warehousing, sales and advertising, plus the wholesaler's and retailer's expenses add another 11.7 cents. Of this amount, less than half a cent a can normally goes for brand advertising. Total profit to the processor, wholesaler, and retailer comes to about 1.1 cent per can. Figures represent industry averages, and are based on a study by the Associated Grocers of Arizona and Del Monte Corporation.

Japan Offers Trade Advice

A Japanese industrialist has

given American businessmen some food for thought as trade talks get under way aimed at between our two countries. Akio Morita, president of the Sony Corp., warns that we cannot have a free world market if we try to solve such problems solely through "artificial" devices such as import surcharges or manipulation of currency exchange rates.

He is right, of course, and he is not appealing to principle glone when he argues that free competition ought to prevail on world markets. He offers a perceptive diagnosis of why Japan's own trade policies, which may seem too selfserving and protectinist in our eyes, are not the only reason U.S. goods do not find markets as readily in Japan as Japanese goods do in America.

Mr Morita believes the Americans can match the energy and productivity of the Japanese in turning out goods, but are failing to meet other requirements of the export market.

The Americans, he says, presume that their products and their way of doing business will be accepted automatically abroad. This is not the case, in his view, and our goods and marketing techniques in foreign countries have to be competitive by foreign stan-

In War-Torn Colombia

Largest Emerald Mine For Sale

BOGOTA- The world's largest emerald mine will soon be up for auction in Colombia. But before you join the stampede to Bogota, by a gun and a good insurance policy. Emeralds are the color of blood in this South American country. Countless Colombians and foreigners have died in the

decades-old emerald war that rages in the mountains north of Bogota and even in the heart of the capital itself. A teroporary truce currently is in effect as a result of the combined efforts of the ary and the central government. But, once the bidding for Muzo and two other emerald mines is over, it should be back to murder as ususal.

The government has decided to turn over the mines' management to private investors, Colombian or foreign, simply because it cannot cope with the ecomomic and social chaos that has come to characterize the meerald trade. In order to close the mines, for example, the government had to send in four battalions of soldiers, for where emeralds are concerned, ferce is the only law.

While Colombia produces 90 per cent of the world's emeralds, the government treasury rarely sees any of the green gold. Indeed, Econominas, the state agency charged with running the mines, actually was losing money before the government decided to suspend the operation. During the first half of the year, for example, Econominas spent \$1 million to obtain \$250,000 worth of emeralds. Yet, the state export agency registered foreign sales of emeralds valued at \$41.7 million in that very same period.

mines, Econominas officials assume most of the emeralds exported were stolen from state mines. That's a pretty safe assumtion. Estimates are that 15,000 "guaqueros," or amateur miners, were poaching on government property. With only 100 police and guards and 370 miners and engineeers, Econominas was in no position to expel the illegal miners or their 15,000 dependents. 

BRUCE BIOSSAT Defense savings found possible

WASHINGTON (NEA) If the considerations which presently govern the United States defense posture continue largely unchanged, our de fense budget could rise to \$104 billion in fiscal 1978. That would be 25 per cent higher than 1974 projections and would seem to leave little room for major shifts to pressing domes-

Some of this added cost would be related to higher price tags on spectacular new strategic weapons systems like the advancing Trident missile-bearing submarine. But it must be emphasized again, as the Brookings Institu-

tion does in its brand new study of the President's latest budget, that inescapably rising manpower costs tied to inflation are the chief factor in swelling defense outlays. The much advertised and often highly criticized growth in

the per unit cost of weapons systems has not, according to the Brookings report, "caused total procurement costs to rise and in this sense has not pushed up the size of the defense budget." Figures show that what might be termed 'military capital investment," as contrasted with manpower and other operating costs, has remained fairly stable for Yet none of this means there are not savings to be made

in military hardware costs as a result of changes in the basic U.S. defense posture or fiscal and political pressures. Consider, for example, the outlook for the country's allmportant strategic forces - which means our sea-based land-based, and bomber-carried nuclear missile units, the ornerstone of American defense

strategic forces "including operating and indirect cost" is estimated at \$18 billion - up \$500 million from 1973. Brookings sees these particular costs climbing to \$20 billion a year by 1976, and reaching nearly \$22 billion a year as 1980 ap-

Brookings specialists nevertheless conclude that spending for strategic forces for the remainder of this decade could be held to an annual ceiling cost of \$20 billion or perhaps brought down as low as \$13 billion a year depending on whether or not certain basic defense approaches were altered. These could involve either cutting defensive forces, slowing down weapons modernization, or slashing air defenses. To do one or more of these things we would have to take the risk of reducing our protection, giving away some bargaining chips in arms limitation talks with the Soviet Union, or relying upon a less flexible defense.

The soybean is politically very important in Japan, being a staple in the diet and an important meat substitute. So the export ban was a sensitive matter. We first assured the Japanese we would honor our commitments. Then we slashed exports, reducing that promise

to shambles. Now we've shifted again and it appears Japan

will get what it requires. The Japanese have asked us why we operated in this embarrassing way. They said they understand our inflation problems, that if we had come to them and pointed out our difficulties, the two countries could have talked out a solution which would have met U.S. requirements and Japan's


The Japanese had, in fact, built stocks and had room to maneuver. "But to us," as one Japanese put it, "the way in which something is done is often more important than what is done." And that is what Washington forgot.

A friend who works daily with Latin American countries tells me we make the same mistake there. Say we have a legitimate disagreement with the government of one of the Latin lands. Instead of holding the long and exasperating informal talks which are often necessary in such circumstances, we stand on our rights formally in a way that in-

This is not to suggest we should cave in, but that we show a greater willingness to talk as equals and attempt to show the Latin officials we understand their political and economc problems, their emotions and even their prejudices without being self-righteous and legalistic. 
In Latin America, delicate political matters frequently can be handled in personal, unofficial ways.



DEAR POLLY - Lorraine can use her leftover needlepoint yarn to make patchwork needlepoint pillows. Cut and bind the canvas so it is at least one inch wider all around than the pillow. Use an INDELIBLE, waterproof pen to block off the desired assorted shapes and then do these sections in various colors, shapes and stitches. I plan it all out on paper so the colors, etc., are distributed to the best advantage. - MRS. R. T.

DEAR POLLY - and Lorraine - I used leftover yarn for making covers for coat hangers. Crochet a piece long and wide enough to wrap around the hanger and then sew it on. It does not matter how the colors match or meet. Such bangers look so pretty hanging in a closet. - MARGARET

DEAR GIRLS - Margaret's idea is great for using leftover knitting wool, but needlepoint wool is quite expensive to put to this use unless the hangers are to be very special. Also, needlepoint wool is usually cut in short lengths so would be hard to crochet without a lot of knotting and join-- POLLY

DEAR POLLY - Leftover needlepoint wool is a blessing not a problem. It can be worked into footstool covers, pillows or samplers, using a variety of colors and stitches. Eveglass cases, coasters and Christmas ornaments are all ideas. Such wool could be used in your crewel embroidery work, too .- MRS. E

According to a report from Ogden, Utah, where they will hold the National High School Rodeo Aug. 13-18, over 8,000 boys and girls in 26 states and two Canadian provinces are entered in competition.

Rodeo World Series

The national competition being held at Ogden is billed as the "World Series" of high school rodeo and over 1,000 contestants will be vieing for the top prizes including Dodge Colts (the car not the animal), 16 handsome western saddles and a horde of silver belt buckles.

Although not yet part of the public school programs in those state the requirements for the competitors are the same, scholastic wise, as they would be for football, swimming, golf or baseball. Each contestant must have a signed statement from their school principal that their grades are up to par.

Demanding Sport

Walt Wickham, president of the NHSRA reports that less than one per cent of high school rodeo participants are ever involved in the kind of trouble their counterparts have, mainly drugs, vandalism and crime.

Chief reason for this is that rodeo is a demanding sport, requiring good physical condition, good marks in school plus personal courage, a sense of responsibility and a willingness to follow the rules.

"They have rules of conduct to follow and if they don't want to follow those rules, we don't fool with them," says Wickham. "If they're willing to meet our requirements, then we'll go all the way with them."

SNA Distance Runner 3rd In State

A Sanford Naval Academy Sophomore, who had already run just about as fast as could be expected of a first-year long distance man, according to his coach, again sliced a six-second chunk off his time, taking third in the state's AAU summer program.

Fifteen-year-old Kenny Evans, son of Mr. and Mrs. K. G. Evans, 3105 Mellonville Avenue, who started running the mile only at the end of the school year, ran a personal best ever time of 4:38.0 to take third in the state meet for 14-17 year-olds in Gainesville.

The young former quarter miler and future anchor on the Middies cross country team, has taken 20 seconds off his first mile time since the summer vacation started.

SNA track coach, Tim Praay, who earlier said he believed Kenny was about at the bottom of his first plateau in distance running and would not lower his time appreciably for some time to come, was just as pleased that his prediction was

"Taking that much off his time at this stage, tells me that Kenny probably hasn't even come close to reaching a 'levelling' off stage yet. I say he'll finish this next school year around the mid 4:20's," he said.

Young Evans, who nipped Lyman rival and

running pal Kenny Duncan at the tape for third in the Gainesville race was second to last from the race's start until the final lap of the third turn, running slightly behind Duncan.

"But," he said, "the pack was tight, and none of us thought we had run that slow of a first lap (66 seconds for Evans), so we all kind of took off at once, and stayed together," Evans

"By the second lap I knew Kenny was having a good race—he ran a 2:17.5 half mile, and that's better than our best open 880 yard run during the regular season," Coach Pray added. "His three-quarter split was 3:30.0, his best
