Wanted: Chess Players

Consider the chess player and the nsung contribution he is making to are living.

In a day when the average busi-man's schedule is loused up for two weeks if he misses one section of a revolving door on his way to work, the choos player will sit in un-ruffled contemplation for as long as

he darn pleases. He is the last survivor of an era when it was regarded as prudent to think first and then act, instead of vice versa.

It is perhaps in practical to sugrest that all business in these jetpropelled times be conducted on a note of massive deliberation such as the chess player employs.

But it is intriguing to wonder if irreparable damage to civilization would be inflicted if just a little more time and thought could be given to moves and decisions, be they made by citizens or government.

Don't panic, chess players. Keep on taking your time. Think first. It just might become contagious!

Pleasant Change

Even though we know the Russians too well to drop our guard, it must be admitted that it is a pleasant change from the Cold War to be on the receiving end of Russian effusions of friendship.

Relations between our two countries could not have been more cor-dial than they have the past few weeks. Our envoys to Moscow and those from Britain could not have been more warmly treated.

The signing of the nuclear test ban treaty, limited and imperfect as it is, makes worthwhile the seemingly fruitless years of argument that went before.

Assuming that the Soviets may intend to abide by the treaty, there is still the nagging suspicion that this sudden sweet reasonableness may not be quite genuine, that there is some ulterior reason which may, in the end, work to our harm.

The obvious answer is that Khrushchev is mending his fences facing the West because of deteriorating relations with the East - Red China. Knowledgeable observers seem to agree that the Russian about-face is genuine, that it does bode well for the future of mankind, and that we should take advantage of it.

Surely the vehemence with which the Red Chinese have denounced the treaty - and Khrushchev and the Russian Communist party for signing it -- indicates that the nuclear test ban is hardly just part of a larger Soviet plot, any more than Gen. De Gaulle's maverick behavior is part

of over-all Western strategy. Whatever the truth may be, Americans are accepting the treaty with restrained relief. Opinion polls are almost unanimous in painting a picture of the man in the street who is wary and not exactly overjoyed, but is nevertheless hopeful that some good will come of it.

Americans' attitudes might be summed up as: "It's better than nothing." Or to paraphrase Churchill: Ban ban is better than war war." Senate scrutiny of the treaty will

be thorough, but approval is expected to be speedy and overwhelming.

Conditions For Development Are 'Favorable'

MIAMI (UPD - A low pressure area that appeared to have the makings of the season's second tropical storm popped up in the Atlantic today near where Hurricane Arlene was found Aug. 2. A hurricane hunter plane sped from Puerto Rico to give weathermen an accurate picture of the disturbance.

The San Juan Weather Bureau labeled the disturbanco a "tropical depression" on the basis of ship reports from the area and estimated its center to be about 600 miles east of the French Island of Guadeloupe or about 900 miles castsoutheast of San Juan.

Highest winds reported by the ships were 30 to 35 miles per hour. The disturbance was estimated to be moving westward at about 12 miles per hour.

"Conditions remain favorable for further development and some increase in size and intensity is likely in the next 12 to 24 hours," the Weather Bureau said.
