## Revitalize Downtown, Group To Urge City

urge Sanford to proceed "full steam ahead" with the had been able to find the \$78,000 needed for materials for the revitalization of the downtown area. John Mercer, president of GSDC will tell commissioners that more than 90 per cent of the property owners and tenants in the

downtown model area are endorsing the project. The model area extends on First Street from Park Avenue to Palmetto and on Magnolia from First to Second streets. The city in its current budget has allocated \$78,000 for materials to provide "in ground" planters in the model area, shade trees and to convert the section of Magnolia Avenue to a pedestrian mall, in addition to other improvements. Labor for

the project is also to be provided by the city. "We take the position," Mercer said, "that with all the development planned and anticipated projects, the downtown must be made attractive for those people to do their shopping and other business there," Mercer said. "It will become an area of beauty and one that will attract people to the down-

Among projects announced in recent weeks are: a high rise apartment complex; a luxury apartment complex; possible conversion of the Seminole Memorial Hospital into a nursing facility; possible construction of a senior citizens center; a multi-purpose building and construction of a new hospital Mercer said although some had feared the modifications would cause the loss of parking spaces, this is not the case. Miss Jacobson said, however, without exception all ot Speer's criticisms have been found to be ill-based. Experts have confirmed the accuracy and adequacy of the technical aspects of the plan, Miss Jacobson said. She said the GSDC attempted to "placate" Speer by finding a compromise. Miss Jacobson said Bill Colbert of the law firm of Stenstrom, McIntosh, Julian, Colbert and Whigham found there was no adverse precedent to the plan in a St. Petersburg case. Colbert was able to find, she said, a Miami case which clearly documented the city's ability to move forward with the

With the opinion from Colbert, she said, the GSDC "restoked its furnace and came back with full steam ahead" for the project. She said a copy of the plan and a petition was presented to downtown property owners and tenants and all but eight signed the petition favoring the plan. In addition, more than 200 signatures were collected from consumers favoring the plan, she said.

In compliance with the city's request for evidence showing private sector involvement, Miss Jacobson said 25-30 downtown buildings have been renovated.

"We feel we will be coming to the city Monday night with legally sound, engineering sound and economically sound plans bearing the support of the people as documented by the petitions. With these recommendations we feel the city has the full power, will exercise wisdom and demonstrate progress to authorize the implementation." Miss Jacobson said.

"We also know that Mr. Speer may continue to threaten a lawsuit and the GSDC is prepared to offer the city as much support as we hope will be necessary to meet that lawsuit," she

### Tito Honored By Throng Of World's Top Leaders

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (UPI) - President Josip Broz Tito, the last of the giant World War II soldier statesmen, was buried in the presence of one of history's largest gatherings of world leaders, who used the funeral as he might have wished - for summit

Statesmen from 121 countries - including 36 heads of states, four kings, 40 prime ministers and eight vice presidents, watched as Tito was laid to rest Thursday in a plain white marble tomb in the quiet tree-shaded flower garden of his home.

The assemblage included Soviet President Leonic Brezhnev and Chinese Communist Premier Hua Guo Feng. But notably absent were President Valery Giscard d'Etaing and President Carter, whose failure to attend drew sharp criticism in Europe.

An estimated 1 million Yugoslavs, many weeping openly for the leader who led them for the 35 years since World War II, lined the 2-mile funeral route. They tried to catch a glimpse of the coffin resting on a gun carriage and draped with the blue, white and red

#### Carter Warns Of Red Threat

PHILADELPHIA (UPI) - President Carter said today the Red Army is consolidating its hold on Afghanistan and warned unchecked Soviet aggression is the most serious challenge to the world since the

In his toughest foreign policy speech, Carter revealed his belief the Soviet Union may use Afghanistan as "a launching pad" for incursions into Pakistan and Iran. In a speech prepared for the World Affairs Council of

Philadelphia, he laid down what his aides said signals the hard line Secretary of State Edmund S. Muskle will take with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko

#### **Bani-Sadr Gains New Post**

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini today personally approved the appointment of President Abolhassan Bani-Sadr as Iran's new bet in an apparent victory for th president's moves to contain his fundamentalist

The 80-year-old Islamic leader gave his assent in a brief statement broadcast by the state radio which said simply: "In the name of God, it is agreed." Bani-Sadr said that Khomeini's intervention was necessary "to resolutely counter plots," and the president declared he also wanted fuller control of the armed forces and the government-controlled media.

#### **Hostage Tried Suicide?**

NEW YORK (UPI) - Italian journalist Oriana Fallaci says one of the American hostages in Iran has made three suicide attempts. ACCRA, Ghana (UPI) - Pope John Paul II, who promised to do "everything possible to remove the divisions in faith," met today with the new archbishop of Canterbury, spiritual head of the world's 70 million

The historic half-hour meeting between the pope and Archbishop Robert Runcie was described by Vatican officials as a private session of discussion and prayer.

Before delivering the eulogy this morning in the Arlington Amphitheater, Carter was to meet with relatives of the eight American servicemen who were killed in a fiery aircraft collision on an Iranian desert April 25. #### 'Beret' Singer Sentenced

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (UPI) - Singer-author Barry Sadler, best known for his 1966 song "The Ballad of The Green Berets," was sentenced to prison Thursday for the shooting death of songwriter Lee Emerson

Sadler, 38, a former Army paratrooper who claimed earlier he fired one shot at Bellamy in self defense, was sentenced to a 4- to 5-year prison, term. He had pleaded guilty to a charge of voluntary manslaughter. He had been charged with second-degree murder, but said he pleaded guilty to the reduced charge "in order to expedite things and to avoid the embarrassment of a trial."

#### New Device Aids Fertility

NEW YORK (UPI) - New York University researchers say a simple cotton bag worn over the scrotum may help some infertile men become fathers. Dr. Adrian Zorgniotti of NYU School of Medicine said Thursday the bag, hooked up to a watering device. is worn over the scrotum and cools the testicles. That, he said, improves the quality of the sperm and increases the chances for fertilization.

"If a man stands in front of a pizza oven all day, he could have a problem" being fertile, Zorgniotti said, adding a number of other industrial jobs that involve standing in a hot area - such as steelworking - could elevate the temperature.

### Trucking Deregulation Bill Faces Final Test In House

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - After weeks of testimony, debate and compromise, a bill deregulating most of the trucking industry comes to a final vote today in the House.

The House also planned a final vote on a bill outlawing the use of "Fuzzbusters" and other devices used by motorists to detect police radar. The deregulation bill HB 1635, which also abolishes the state's restrictions on fares and routes for buses, won preliminary House approval Thursday with a series of amendments stemming from a compromise between Regulatory Reform Chairman George Sheldon and trucking lobbyists.

The bill initially called for the Public Service Commission to assign truckers "zones of reasonableness" in which they could vary their rates until rate regulation was dropped in 18 months. In the compromise, the "zones" were discarded in favor of allowing truckers to increase or lower their rates as much as 15 percent of their current levels during the first three months and as much as 30 percent during the next three months.

## Nicaragua's Slide **Toward Marxism**

Ever since Sandinista revolutionaries overthrew the regime of Anastasio Somoza last year, foreign observers have been watching Nicaragua anxiously for signs of which way the new government was leaning — left toward the Marxist faction within the Sandinistas or toward the pluralistic politics of social democrats who also opposed Somoza.

Tragically, recent events warn that Nicaragua is sliding toward a Marxist future.

Recently, the two moderates serving on Nicaragua's five-member ruling junta resigned in protest over a transparent power grab by San-dinista radicals. Alfonso Robelo, an American educated businessman and longtime foe of Somoza, offered a succinct explanation of his resignation: "We just got rid of one dictatorship and the people don't want another one.

The second junta member to resign, Violeta Barrios de Chamorro, cited "ill-health" but warned privately of the junta's increasingly obvious Marxist tilt. Chamorro, whose anti-Somoza husband was assassinated by unknown gunmen in January 1978, is the publisher of La was received with something less than Prensa, Nicaragua's only independent popular acclaim. newspaper. Ominously, La Prensa was shut down recently by its Sandinista-controlled labor union.

### **New Device Gives Clues** To Makeup Of Earth Core

WASHINGTON (UPI) - A diamond squeezer that simulates the immense pressures of Earth's interior has given scientists their first laboratory clues to the makeup of the planet's

One of the initial results of the high pressure apparatus a the Carnegie Institution of Washington was to squelch the longheld idea Earth's core consists of an alloy of iron and nickel. Now, Carnegie geophysicist Peter M. Bell said Thursday, he and co-workers have come up with experimental data supporting a new concept for the composition and evolution of the

planet. The work suggests the iron in the core is mixed with some sort of exotic substance, perhaps metallic oxygen. The device that provides this laboratory "window" into Earth's insides consists of two cone-shaped diamonds. One is mounted on the roof of a cylinder and the other serves as an anvil mounted on a piston. The two diamonds, no larger than one-half carat, are pushed together against a tiny sample. The device already has generated pressures up to 1.7 million times atmospheric pressure at sea level. This is equal to the pressure well within Earth's core, which begins at a major rock boundary zone 1,800 miles deep.

A laser beam shining through the diamonds can heat the material to the 5,400 degrees Fahrenheit temperatures believed to exist at the outer boundary of the core. X-rays and other radiation going through the diamonds can "see" what happens to material under such pressure and temperatures. Bell's co-worker, Dr. HoKwang Mao, was the first to show iron-nickel mixture could not exist in the core because the alloy changes density under great pressure and would be far too dense to exist in the core.

In more recent experiments, Bell and Mao discovered at pressure and high temperatures simulating a depth of 500 miles, major chemical changes occur in the rock material including the formation of a very dense, diamond-shaped crystal structure called perovskite.

Bell said at a news conference almost all elements will crystallize into this structure. Most iron, however, does not go into this crystalline form and thus is separated from the magnesium that normally accompanies iron in Earth's



## Dancin Dancin' Jack Regrets Giving crown and the title of Miss USA Saw" Edward is destined for Tips To Astaire

SEATTLE (UPI) - If there's a table top within twosteppin' range and a honky-tonk tune to spare, 78-year-old Dancin' Jack Kelly will be there.

His dapper hat, cane and twopiece suit are as much a fixture of the Pike Place Market scene as bug-eyed fish and tourists. He can be found most any day drinking 14cent coffee in the ancient Athenian Inn and at night he heads for the Pioneer Square Tavern where the crowds gather around to watch and, "I've yet to meet a youngster who can keep up with me."

That's still how Kelly earns his spending money although he'd rather not disclose how many coins jangle his way for fear of the tax man.

Now that he's pushing 80, Jack says his only regret is that he gave away some of his dancing tips to Fred Astaire back when Fred was teaching ballroom dancing at his studio at Ninth and Nicollet in Minneapolis.

"I saw his sign and said, 'I wanna see how much he knows," Kelly recalled of that time in the Roaring '20s. "He was just another guy dancing like me, but he had all these women hanging around him. He saw me dance and said, 'How d'ya do that?' I told him to put on something fast and I'd really show him a step or two."

Astaire, of course, later went on to Hollywood and stardom. Kelly went west, to gin joints that followed the Depression Era, on the rails to lumber camps, mining towns and finally Seattle.

Jack doesn't know where he got the dancing fever. "It's just always been there, in my head and feet and I can't stop. I've always been what you call a leg man."

Born "40 miles from nowhere near the Crow Creek Indian Reservation" in South Dakota, Kelly left home at a 16 and drifted until he settled in Minneapolis "I was a little shy about things," he says. "I did some

## County Mulls Choice Of Chemical Or Manpower To Do The Ditches

Herald Staff Writer While the Seminole County Public Works Department i planning to ask permission to abandon manpower and use chemical power to clean out excess plant growth in roadway ditches, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has called into question the safety of one of the most widely used

The chemical is known as "2, 4-D," and was a component of "Agent Orange," the defoliant which has come under fire for its use by the U.S. military in Vietnam.

The chemical has already been used along state roads in Seminole County, according to Rene McDowell, Florida Department of Transportation assistant maintenance

Although the Seminole County Public Works Department has not yet decided which herbicide it will recommend the county use, Jim Mathews, Seminole County road superintendent, said the choice will be based on the advice of the DOT. According to J.A. Lewis, DOT roadside maintenance engineer, the state uses approximately 5,500 gallons of the chemical per year. It also uses other chemicals, but 2, 4-D is used for broadleaf and other weed control at low levels of concentration, according to David Denson, district roadway engineer for the DOT in DeLand.

McDowell said the concentrations used are "less poisonous "Whatever the manufacturer's recommended dosage."

If the manufacturers comply, she said, the EPA will allow use of the chemical to continue while the studies are underway Should any of the new studies indicate the chemical presents any health or environmental hazard, she said the EPA would take appropriate regulatory action without waiting for completion of all the studies.

In addition, she said, the EPA plans to conduct studies on the chemical in its own laboratories while awaiting the industry

The term "2, 4-D" refers to the phenoxy herbicide 2, 4dichlorophenoxyacetic acid and its 35 related salt and ester forms. There are approximately 1,500 2, 4-D products. Although never approved by the EPA for civilian use in the

U.S., Agent Orange, composed in part by 2, 4-D, has been the subject of much controversy. Its use in Vietnam resulted in numerous claims that the chemical caused adverse health effects on American military personnel. These claims are now under investigation by the Veterans Administration.

Jack Schuder, Seminole County director of public works said the county would use a herbicide only in ditches that do not feed into any body of water.

He said the program was planned to save the county mone Currently, the county maintains a ditch cleaning crew of six people and a foreman. Schuder said use of a herbicide would eliminate perhaps two or three jobs.

"They are the hardest and more unrewarding of jobs," he said. It involves getting into the ditches and working with a

During the last quarter of the fiscal year, Schuder said th county cleaned 25 miles of ditches.




