Polk Budget To County

Sheriff John Polk officially presented commissioners with his \$1.9 million budget request Monday afternoon, the bulk of the \$900,000 increase to fund 40 new squad cars, new

The board held off giving Polk a hard time on the request-if any can be anticipated-noting the budget will receive line-by-line scrutiny later this month, after initial run-throughs of all 44 departmental budgets. Commissioner's did express mild skepticism at two of Polk's requests, however, probing \$130,000 for 21 new

communications personnel, and nearly \$200,000 earmarked for the new cars, which would double the present fleet. Less argument was hinted to be in the works for salary increases for existing personnel, which Polk said are based on a two-step, 10 per cent hike similar to those granted or

pending in Orlando and Orange Ciunty. If granted, the salary hikes will give beginning deputies \$675 a month, up from \$611, as compared with a rookie Orange County Deputy who received \$627 last year, and Highway Patrol beginners, now earmarked for \$724 a month,

Polk said. "If we don't keep (salaries) up, there's no way we can keep the men after incurring the expense of training them,' Polk told the board. On the new communications people, Polk told com-

missioners seven men are needed to man three shifts, and that actually 29 men will be needed to provide full time coverage on weekends and holidays. The Sheriff indicated he is willing to compromise on the request for 40 new squad cars at nearly \$5,400 each, when

fully equipped, if commissioners approve purchase of 19 trade-in cars, supplemented by 11 new vehicles. The county currently spends \$40,000 annually, trading-in one-third of the sheriff's fleet, Polk said, adding purchase of the 40 new cars would chop \$25,000 a year off maintenance







Polk Budget To County

Sheriff John Polk officially presented commissioners with his \$1.9 million budget request Monday afternoon, the bulk of the \$900,000 increase to fund 40 new squad cars, new

The board held off giving Polk a hard time on the request-if any can be anticipated-noting the budget will receive line-by-line scrutiny later this month, after initial run-throughs of all 44 departmental budgets.

Commissioner's did express mild skepticism at two of Polk's requests, however, probing \$130,000 for 21 new communications personnel, and nearly \$200,000 earmarked for the new cars, which would double the present fleet. Less argument was hinted to be in the works for salary increases for existing personnel, which Polk said are based

on a two-step, 10 per cent hike similar to those granted or pending in Orlando and Orange Ciunty. If granted, the salary hikes will give beginning deputies \$675 a month, up from \$611, as compared with a rookie Orange County Deputy who received \$627 last year, and Highway Patrol beginners, now earmarked for \$724 a month.

Polk said "If we don't keep (salaries) up, there's no way we can keep the men after incurring the expense of training them,'

Polk told the board. On the new communications people, Polk told commissioners seven men are needed to man three shifts, and that actually 29 men will be needed to provide full time coverage on weekends and holidays.

The Sheriff indicated he is willing to compromise on the request for 40 new squad cars at nearly \$5,400 each, when fully equipped, if commissioners approve purchase of 19 trade-in cars, supplemented by 11 new vehicles. The county currently spends \$40,000 annually, trading-in one-third of the sheriff's fleet, Polk said, adding purchase of the 40 new cars would chop \$25,000 a year off maintenance



Was Castro Behind Plot Against JFK?

advance that an attempt would be made to assassinate U.S. President John F. Kennedy? The question has arisen as the result of an article in The Atlantic Monthly which stated that the late President Lyndon Johnson believed

Kennedy was killed in retaliation for a thwarted

attempt to assassinate Castro. According to the author of the article, Leo Janos, Johnson on one occasion stated bluntly, 'I never believed that (Lee Harvey) Oswald acted alone, although I can accept that he pulled the

There are additional facts, not mentioned by Janos, that tend to support the possibility Castro knew in advance that an attempt was to be made on Kennedy's life. Two, in particular, stand out:

- In September, 1963, Castro attended a reception at the Brazilian Embassy in Havana. At this time he made the ominous statement. "U.S. leaders should realize that if they are aiding terrorist plans to eliminate Cuban leaders they themselves will not be safe." Two months later Kennedy was assassinated.

- Oswald traveled to Mexico City on Sept. 27, 1963, and remained there until Oct. 2, 1963. During that time he made several visits to the Cuban and Soviet embassies. According to the Warren Report, Oswald was attempting to obtain visas to visit Cuba and the Soviet Union.

The Warren Report states that "an important source of information" regarding Oswald's trips to the Cuban Embassy was Mrs. Silvia Tirado de Duran, a Mexican national employed in the visa section of the Cuban Embassy. The report said that Mrs. Duran and her husband "have been active in far-left political affairs in Mexico, believe in Marxist ideology, and sympathize with the government of Fidel

Realistically, Mrs. Duran could hardly have been expected to provide anything but the Cuban government's explanation as to why Oswald visited the Cuban Embassy. And the Cuban government was not about to admit to any in-

Argentina On Brink Of Civil War

BOGOTA - There once was a great country called It was a land of abundance with soil so rich it could feed a nation of beefeaters and have enough left over for all the rest of South America. It was a land with the most glamorous capital on the continent and a power to be reckoned with. It also was a land that, once upon a time, could boast a

population of hard-working, sure-sighted people. Today, Argentina is on the brink of civil war. The soil still is the richest in the hemisphere, but the people have lost their way. Sacrifice, compromise, common sense - these are concepts the Argentines seemingly no longer understand. Even Juan Domingo Peron, Argentina's legendary dictator, admits the situation is "gravely serious." The country's problem must be "arranged by all the Argentines because if not, no one can solve it," said Peron on

his recent return from an 18-year exile in Madrid. Certainly enough Argentines have tried. Since Peron's overthrow by the military in 1955, there have been two civilian administrations and six military regimes. None was able to put the Argentine house in order.

That is why the armed forces agreed to allow free presidential elections last March, the first in 10 years, and to swallow the bitter medicine of their old enemy's return to power. If no one else could do the job, reasoned the military, then let Gen. Peron come home.

Peron's hand-picked presidential candidate, Hector Campora, swept the elections and was duly inaugurated president. He recently returned from Madrid with his sponsor, the 77-year-old Peron. As political scenarios go in Latin America, Peron's

return is a masterly piece of Machiavellianism. During 18 long years, the Argentines have convinced themselves that the key to trouble in Argentina is Peron. The ex-dictator's followers claim that nothing can be resolved without Peron; his critics insist that nothing will be resolved while he lives. It is a convenient myth to disguise a people's

own shortcomings and one that Peron himself has carefully

Thus, when urban guerrilla warfare erupted in Argentina three years ago, the problem was attributed to the Argentines' dissatisfaction with a military dictatorship. True, the regime was politically heavy-handed and

economically shortsighted. What everyone forgot, however, was that in 1966, when a civilian administration was middling along, virtually every Argentine - Peronist or Anti-Peronist - welcomed the military coup.

The same sense of euphoria and relief that greeted Peron on his return to Argentina was evident in 1966 during the first days of the military regime.

Peron, of course, always has been a better politician than the younger generals who ruled more recently. Guerilla warfare did not end with Campora's election, as Peron undoubtedly expected. Throughout the presidential campaign, Peron refused to condemn the guerrillas, knowing that to do so might alienate the youth vote. Many of Argentina's three million new voters agreed

with the guerrillas' goals, if not their tactics, and their vote clinched the election. The continuing guerrilla war also has set the stage for the final act in Peron's scenario. President Campora, a retired dentist, shows no indication of being able to handle the current anarchy in which the political right and left literally are prepared to kill each other.

EDITORIAL Should we care about Burundi?

Burundi is an East African nation of about 3.5 million peo ple. That is about 100,000 fewer people than lived there little more than a year ago. The other 100,000 are dead, massacred in a vicious, ghastly intertribal conflict that has recently spilled still more fresh blood.

Most Americans have been unaware of those deaths and probably unaware that there was such a place as Burund We have had, after all, our own more immediate probler And when we get through thinking about them, it is easier to worry about how Liza Minnelli and Peter Sellers are getting along, or whether the Cubs can hold on to their lead this

Maybe, in fact, the deaths in Burundi are not any of our business. Maybe there is no reason for us to worry about

Burundi is a long way away, geographically, culturally, ethnically and politically. (It is unlikely that the ancestors of many American blacks came from Burundi, since most slave trading with the United States was carried on from the wes ern coast of Africa.) The Burundian army is not likely to be a factor in any future world wars and while the United States buys 60 per cent of Burundi's exports, mostly coffee that trade is still only a drop in the percolator as far as we

The structure of Burundian society is, superficially at least, alien to us. The government and economy is ruled by the Tutsi tribe (the once-faddish pseudo-African dance, the Watusi, was named after them). Most of the work is done by the Hutu. And the fact that the Tutsi make up only about 10 to 15 per cent of the country's population to the Hutu's 85 per resentment, whether the rapid growth of radical and cent is the source of most of the friction. (The other By rundians are members of a pygmy-like group, the Twa which is discriminated against by both the Tutsi and Hutu.)

> Ever since they migrated to the area in the 15th century. the Tutsi have been dominant. As cattle herders, the African equivalent of Cadillac drivers, they have maintained a feudal relationship with the agricultural Hutu and were left in charge when Burundi gained its independence from Belgium

But then in April 1972 the Hutus mounted a large-scale attempt to overthrow the government of President Michel Micombero, a Tutsi and former army officer who had overthrown the king in 1966. When it failed, Micombero launched a series of reprisals that included, according to some reports, the killing of Hutus by driving nails through their heads with sledge hammers. Another aborted coup this May caused a similar savage reaction.



EDITORIAL blacks must help

Georgia legislator Julian Bond is emerging as something Not only do both men share youth, looks, brains and national prominence as courageous reformers, but both are given to making slightly outrageous statements. Addressing students at Cuyahoga Community College in Cleveland the other day, Bond said that while blacks can point to many improved conditions in America, there are asmany others that are worse.

"We seem to be climbing a molasses mountain dressed in snowshoes while the rest of the country rides an easy ski lift to the top," he said. Bond has climbed rather high on that mountain through his own efforts, having had to go to court to win the right to sit

in the Georgia House of Representatives as a duly elected member. But at a time when many poverty-level white Americans would be glad just to have a serviceable pair of snowshoes. Bond is no longer exceptional In his field of politics, Los Angeles councilman Tom Bradley, a black, won a landslide victory over incumbent Sam orty, a white, as mayor of that predominantly white city. it was Bradley's second try against Yorty. Also in California, in Oakland, two black candidates were

in the running this year for the mayor's seat against two whites, including the white incumbent. In the run-off, Black Panther Bobby Seal lost to Mayor John H. Reading by almost a 2-1 margin, but what is significant is not that he lost but that he did so in a city close to 50 per cent black. In Camden, N.J., another city close to half black, five black candidates and one Puerto Rican ran for mayor and were overwhelmed by the white Democratic candidate, one

of three whites in the race. These examples suggest that in politics, at least, if whites are riding "an easy ski lift to the top," a lot of minority people must be pulling for them. Conversely, white loser ike Sam Yorty may have cause to mutter about sliding down a "molasses mountain

On another subject that affects all Americans but blacks especially, the president of the St. Louis Board of Police commissioners recently made some pertinent and much-"The crime reports I see from day to day show that 75 per cent of crimes in St. Louis are committed by black criminals

and that 80 per cent of their victims are also black," said Whether or not we are willing to face up to the truth, the

fact remains that crime - black crime - is a noose, slowly but relentlessly strangling the St. Louis black community and every similar community across the nation. While agreeing that there is some truth to the charge that racism is one of the factors in the increase in crime, Mc Neal added that "I am convinced that there are not and never will be enough police to reduce and control crime in our ities until and unless the black community becomes actual and actively involved in the overall war against crime. We cannot curb crime as long as large numbers of black tizens act as if they were deaf, dumb and blind when a rime is committed in their presence. 

POLLY'S POINTERS Afghan Storage Tips Supplied By Readers

By POLLY CRAMER

DEAR POLLY - Jean wanted to know about storing an aighan in her hope chest. Whenever my grandmother crochets an afghan she puts it in a blue laundry bag (should be sealed tightly) and then puts this bag into a box. The afghan stays fresh and clean, and white ones do not discolor. - N.

DEAR POLLY - Jean may want to store her afghan in her hope chest now, but after she is married. I suggest that she not store it but use it. I have several wool ones made from old sweaters that I have used for years. Recently I made two new ones - one I keep at the foot of my bed and the other across the back of the couch. I just shake them out occasionally and put them out to air. When washing, I use only a COLD water detergent and hang straight or lay flat to dry. If she must store them, she should use a moth repellent. It could be put in a plastic bag. Too many people pack away their beautiful handmade articles never to be seen or used when they should be enjoyed. — LILLIAN

DEAR GIRLS - Any wool article must be immaculately clean before it is stored. If put in a hope chest or box with other articles, the alghan should be wrapped separately and be air-tight as one other little piece might be infected with moths and ruin it, too. Moth crystals could be placed between the folds before it is sealed. Many readers wrote that they used plastic bags but I cannot completely agree with this because moth crystals may melt or discolor the plastic if in a hot place like an attic. A paper bag is safer but do be sure there is not even the tiniest hole, and then double fold over at the top and seal with brown gummed tape or staple together. Press out any air in the bag with your hands before sealing - POLLY

DEAR POLLY - I have a friend in the hospital who had never used a satin pillowcase to protect her hairdo so 1 promised to make one for her. Devlin, Von Hagge On Course

Brace Devlin and Robert Von Hagge, the two fellows who got together to construct the beautiful Sheoah Golf Course in Winter Springs, are busy putting another course together down in Tamarac which is located in West Broward County.

The Tamarac layout is most unusual, considering today's golf standards, in that it is only 4,120 yards in length. The course plays to par 64 and was to have been opened last

month. And the course is open to the public. Tamarac offers eight par 4's, six of which are over 300 yards long; a short but tricky par 5 measuring 426 yards; and nine par 3's that will continually test each golfers ability to

Devlin called this course a "fun course" but one that will require the use of every club in the bag.

Changes Needed

With the new dimpled golf ball design and the graphite shafts giving greater distance to the golfers there has to be something done to separate the "men from the boys" and distance need not be the answer.

Perhaps more "short courses" with greater penalties for the errant shot is the answer.

Incidentaly, Devlin's Sheoah course has not yet been officially opened to the public but it should not be too long before the newest Central Florida golf paradise is available.

When the Professional golf tour makes its PGA tournament stop at the Canterbury (Ohio) Golf Club in early August, it will be the first time the PGA event has been held



Nevertheless, peace and church groups have begun regearing the antiwar movement into an amnesty campaign. More parents of war resisters are speaking out about the impact of exile and imprisonment on their families.



Most of the ship's 700 passengers and 300 crew members were affected by the virus. It caused fever, stomach cramps and dizziness,

forcing a halt to a seven-day cruise and a swift return to Miami on June 23. The suit also alleges that Norwegian-Caribbean failed to provide proper medical care for those who became ill. Three
