

## Rain, Tornadoes Pound Florida

A tornado touched down just south of Daytona today causing heavy damage to a mobile home park and several persons received minor injuries. Volusia County was placed on a tornado warning as severe weather pounded parts of Central Florida on the east and west coasts. Meanwhile, a tornado watch was issued for Seminole and every county in north and central Florida from noon to 5 p.m. today. The watch indicates a possible tornado, or large hail and damaging winds.

Severe thunderstorms pounded the Tampa Bay area today, spawning a number of small tornadoes, one of which struck a mobile home park east of the University of South Florida.

Extensive damage was reported from the winds and heavy rains, but there were no reported injuries. One twister struck the Lamplighter Trailer Park northeast of Tampa, damaging 30 to 40 mobile homes and an auto repair shop and gun shop across the road were heavily damaged.

Several tornadoes were reported north of Tampa International Airport and in north Tampa, but there were no immediate reports of damage, and the Pinellas County sheriff's office reported some damage due to high winds south of Clearwater.

Another tornado hit the tiny town of Port Orange south of Daytona Beach, striking several mobile home parks and a new housing subdivision.

"So far, no one's hurt, but the damage looks awful bad," said a Port Orange police spokesman.

Tampa International Airport recorded 5.89 inches of rain between midnight and 10 a.m., and clocked winds up to 86 knots.

At one point the control tower at the airport was evacuated for 10 minutes because of the high winds and the spotting of the tornado just north of the airport.

"But nothing was really operating at the time and it was just precautionary," a spokesman said.

The line of thunderstorms stretched from near Daytona Beach on the east coast to off Fort Myers on the lower west coast, but a weather bureau spokesman said most of the storm was concentrated in the Tampa area.

"The heavy stuff has been concentrated in the Tampa area," a weatherman said. "We've had numerous tornadoes reported. The thunderstorms are coming in from the Gulf and are not moving very fast."

## Airport And Seminole OK Space Lease

The Sanford Airport Authority has approved the leasing of building space to the Seminole County Commission, clearing the way for construction of a new terminal building at the airport.

The 43,000 square feet of space in buildings 310 and 311 at the airport, which cost the commission \$300,000 for the first year, \$42,000 for the second year, \$40,000 for the third year and \$54,000 for the fourth year. The rate for each year after that will be negotiated, according to the contract approved by the Authority. The vote to approve the contract was unanimous.

In April, county commissioners voted to approve the leasing of building space at the airport and authorized Chairman Bob French to execute an agreement with the Authority. Formal approval of the lease negotiated was expected to come during today's regular commission meeting.

The commission's decision to seek space at the airport came after the advice and recommendations of Sheriff Polk. Polk wants to use the second and third floors of the three-story structure at building 310 to consolidate the administrative offices and communications center which are now housed in four separate facilities. The communication center is located at the courthouse and the department has offices at the old jail, the Sanford Masonic Building and building 1 at the airport.

The move will free up 10,545 feet of space at the old jail for other county purposes, leaving only an 18-cell block for housing of prisoners. The cell-block will remain as reserve space when the new jail at Five Points is completed, according to Polk.

Jeff Eichberger, director of the county's Office of Management, Analysis and Evaluation, said the rent reduction during the first four years will enable the county to make all but about \$10,000 of improvements to the building. He said the reduction in the first four years amount to \$42,000. He estimated the cost of the elevator construction and other improvements to come to \$52,000.

At the first year rental fee of \$30,000, the cost per square foot comes to \$2.86, he said. By the fourth year of the lease when the rent jumps to \$54,000, the rent per square foot comes to about \$5.15.

The going rate for office space in the area averages more than \$5.25 per square foot, he said.

## One Block To Accident: Longest Walk Of Life

All the pain and agony a mother can know returned to Mrs. Paul Chaplin during a frightening one-block walk Monday.

At 3 p.m. she received word her son, Edward, 8, had been struck by a car and injured on Park Avenue just south of 9th Street. It was just two weeks ago that she was told her other son, Scott, 16, had been hit by a car and injured. The accident killed Scott.

"It was the longest block I ever walked," Mrs. Chaplin said of the trip from her home to the scene of the accident at about 3 p.m. after being told Edward had been hit by a car.

"Thank God," she said.

"That's all Mrs. Chaplin could think to say upon learning Edward was going to be all right.

"It's at home," she said this morning, "he suffered a slight concussion and is going to be all right."

Sanford police said Edward was running south on Park Avenue when he veered into the path of a car driven by Louis Clyde Alexander, 56, whose address is listed as P.O. Box 624, Sanford. The car struck the boy and threw him to the pavement. He was taken to Seminole Memorial Hospital by ambulance where he was treated and released.

Police said Alexander stopped immediately after hitting the youth. No citation was issued.

On April 28 Mark Scott Chaplin, 16, left his home at 2809 Magnolia by bicycle to visit a friend. But before he reached his destination, a blue Pontiac struck him on Old Lake Mary Road about a mile south of Airport Boulevard. Four days later he died in an Orlando hospital.

The driver of that car fled the scene at a high rate of speed. The Florida Highway Patrol said it suspects has yet been apprehended in connection with the hit and run. Mrs. Chaplin said she did not know whether or not anyone had been arrested for the accident that claimed her son's life. But she said:

"I prayed for the driver again this morning."

After learning her other son was not seriously injured, she prayed again.—GEOFFREY POUNDS

## Sheriff's Department In 'Air Pool'

In about a month's time, Seminole County will be ready to join the hundreds of sheriff's departments across the nation in a so-called air pool to save time and money in the transportation of prisoners.

The sheriff's department is currently renovating its \$15.5 million, two-engine propeller aircraft confiscated in a recent drug raid, said Sgt. Jerry Capehaw, chief pilot of the Seminole County Sheriff's Department.

When the aircraft's facilities is complete in about a month, its average of \$225 and 2.1 man-hours each time, Triggs said.

Capehaw said Seminole County's twin-engine plane which can seat six operators on about seven cents per passenger mile at full capacity. It gets about five to six miles per gallon and can travel 300 miles per hour, Capehaw said.

"On a one-to-one basis, the cost of flying commercial and flying our own aircraft is about the same," Capehaw said.

But when more than one person is being transported, the cost saving of the plane fare is immediately realized not to mention the time saved in flying instead of driving.

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## Only 7 Years Old, Already Has Acne

DEAR DR. LAMB—My son is only 7 years old and already he is developing signs of acne. His face along the jaw line and also his upper arms are covered with tiny bumps that look distinctly like pimples. Several have already come to a head. I'm very concerned because I developed this problem in early childhood and am still coping with it at age 28. Added to the general acne problem I also developed and still have large clusters of blackheads. I have them on my neck and on my breastbone. It's unsightly as well as embarrassing. Is there anything that can be done to prevent the pimples from happening to my son? This type of problem can cause him to be self-conscious and eventually lose much of his confidence. I can't know because I was terribly shy as a child. Please help.

DEAR READER—That's a little early for the acne problem but it can occur. Usually acne problems begin in the teens and are related to hormonal changes. People who are prone to acne may experience it for the rest of their life.

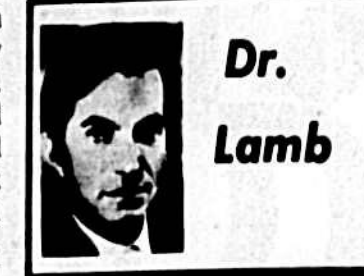
Acne includes the problem of blackheads, whiteheads and pimple formation. They are all related. The conditions are caused by the excessive formation of sebum, the oily secretion formed by skin glands. The usual medical approach is to decrease the excessive oily sebum formation, improve the drainage of the oils to prevent blackheads and use antibiotics that prevent small bacteria from splitting the fatty sebum into chemicals that are irritating to the skin.

The pimple is an inflammatory reaction caused by a breakdown of the fatty sebum.

Home remedies for most other people really are directed toward keeping the skin clean by washing all the areas involved with warm water and mild soap two or three times a day. The skin can also be dried by wiping it off frequently with simple alcohol sponges.

It's often not mentioned but sunlight is remarkably helpful in some people in clearing acne conditions. It won't work in all cases but it shouldn't be forgotten as an aid.

I'm sure your doctor will be able to determine whether your son really has acne or if he has a little skin infection that needs treatment. He will also be able to give you guidance and help you in managing your son's skin condition so he will have the best opportunity to avoid excessive acne and scarring.

Exercises Reduced Fat, But Only Awhile

DEAR DR. LAMB — I sent for your letter on the fat belly. I did your exercises and it worked. I was flat. My waist was only 25, down from a 29-inch waist. Then overnight I swelled up. I looked as if I was pregnant. The doctor said I had a lot of fluid so he gave me a water pill called Ezidor. But they made me sick and tired so please can you help me? I don't know what's wrong. The doctor said I was in good shape. He gave me a good exam. Now I have pains in my back and feel like my body's been through a hard work out.

**DEAR READER** — I'm glad that the exercise program helped you reduce your waist size. Proper exercises for the abdomen will tighten abdominal muscles and help shrink the waistline. The only reason such exercises work is because they strengthen your abdominal muscles. If a person already has strong abdominal muscles, he won't get much out of the exercises.

Whenever your abdomen is full of something, whether it's fluid, fat or gas, there's no way that exercises can compress these. You have to get the fat, fluid or gas out of the body of the abdomen before you can reduce the waistline.

Some people do feel tired if they take a water pill because it works by washing out salt. Often this is just a matter of having taken more medicine than is needed for the job.

People who have been on weight-loss diets and don't lose any pounds for weeks may actually be accumulating water. Then suddenly they'll flush out all the water. Even with this natural course of

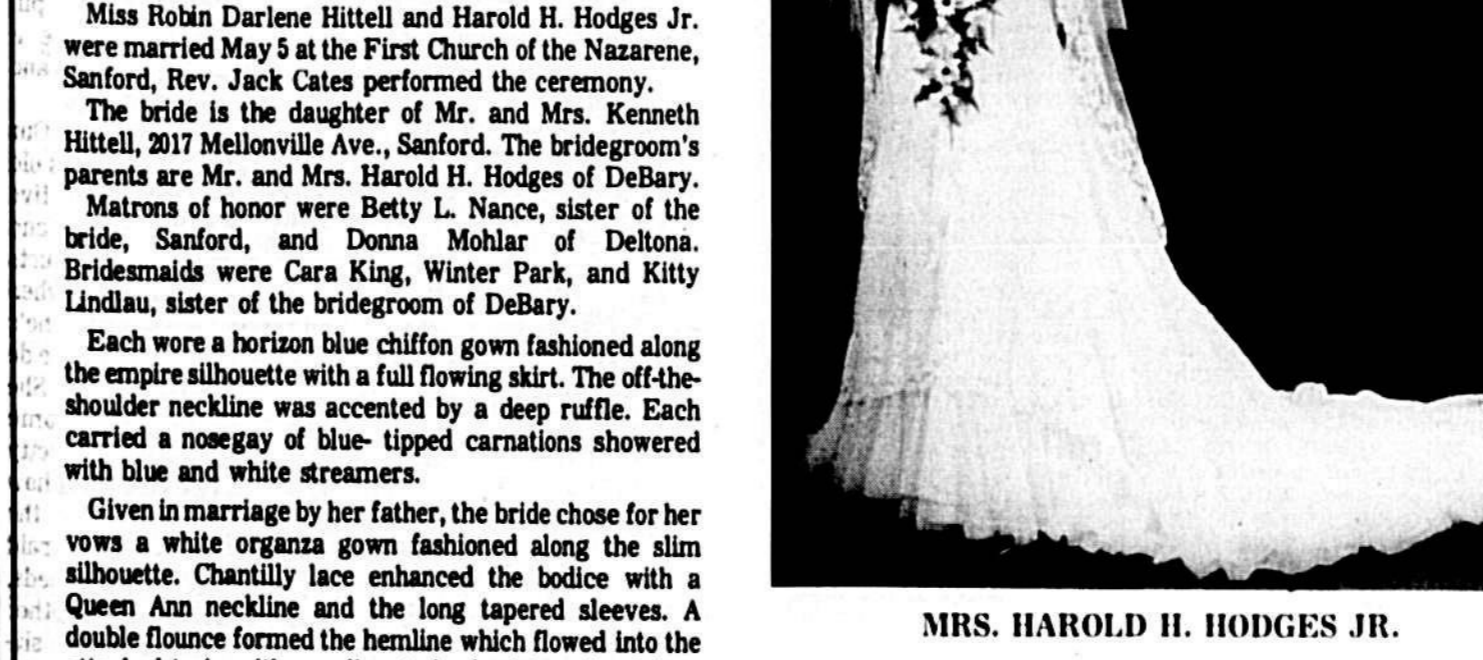

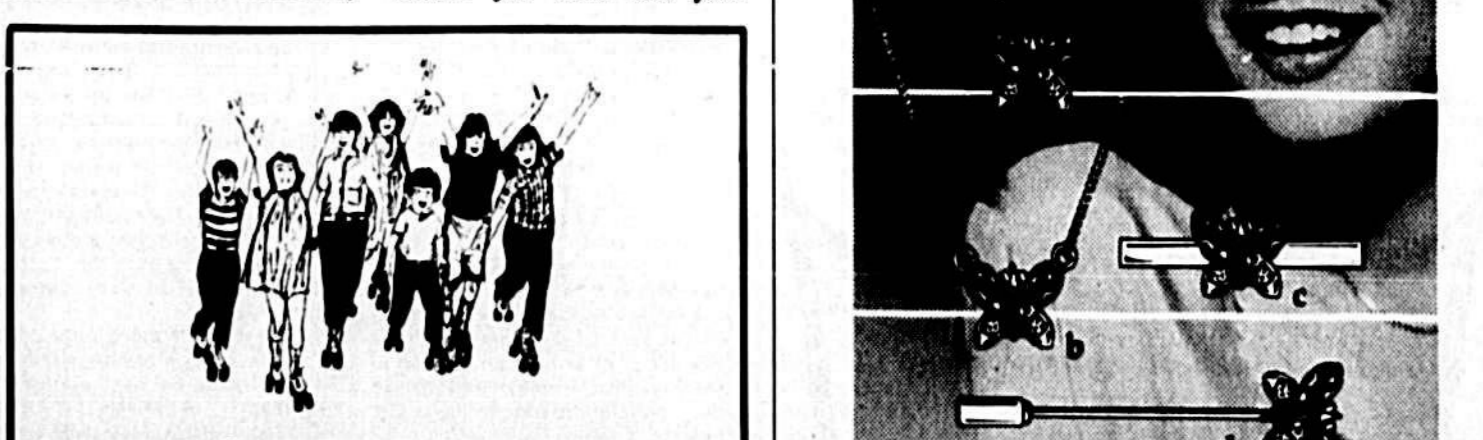

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Mother Charged In Tub Drowning Of Two Children



take the children out of the tub immediately. Instead, she left them in the water and ran into the bedroom, police said. The children's grandmother, Rosa Keitt, returned home and found her daughter "in hysterics," according to police.

Police said the mother was charged with two counts of manslaughter and two counts of child abuse in connection with their deaths. Police said a two-month investigation of the drownings produced evidence suggesting criminal acts may have been committed by Blissett Keitt, whose sons were found face down in a bathtub at 100 Lake Monroe Terrace, Mrs. Keitt was arrested Tuesday on an information prepared by the state attorney's office.

Telly Keitt, age 2, and 8-month-old Terry Keitt, had been dead for up to an hour when the mother said she discovered the pair, a medical examiner's report concluded. Medical examiner Dr. G.W. Garay said Telly had a bump on the head.

Miss Keitt told police she put the children in the tub and returned to the kitchen to finish dinner preparations at about 5 p.m. on the evening of March 8. About 30 minutes later she returned to the bathroom and found both the children dead, police said.

But the police report indicates that Miss Keitt did not take the children out of the tub immediately. Instead, she left them in the water and ran into the bedroom, police said.

"She loved those kids and was so particular about them. She kept her eye on them like a hawk when they were playing outside," Rosa Keitt said.

Miss Keitt's mother said she still doesn't know the exact events which transpired on the evening of March 8. She said she was out shopping while the children were bathing. When she got home she found her daughter in the bedroom screaming, she said.

Attempts to revive the children by police and rescue units were unsuccessful at the scene, police said. She kept her eye on them like a hawk when they were playing outside," Rosa Keitt said.
