From the \$6,000 base, the pa for holders of bachelor degrees mount till at the end of three years, salary is listed at 96.360; then a teacher if ap proved for tenure receives sal ary on a continuing contract which starts for bachelor a \$6,720. Hhis continues till end of 10th year, when bachelor salary is listed at \$8,340. Highest pay in this category comes after 15 years of service when salary is held at \$9,240. For holders of a master d

gree, first year pay starts a \$6,960 on first year annual contract and concludes at \$7,320 on annual contract after three years. Master degree teachers on tenure after three years re ceive \$7,680, this increases each year until after 10 years of service, master's degree teachers receive \$9,120. Peak is reached after 15 years at \$10,020. For teachers with doctor of specialist degrees, first year pay starts at \$7,620 for beginners with annual contract and grows to \$7,980 after three years. Tenure contracts for doctor's degree teachers start at \$8,340 and conclude at \$9,600 after 10 years. At the end of 15
