BULGARIA GETS READY TO HALT ARMED ACTION

Intervention By Britain And France May Be Asked By Nation

VIENNA, Nov. 24.—(INS)

—During an attempt by Macedonian rebels to seize Sofia, the Bulgarian Government is massing troops for protection of the capital, according to reports printed in newspapers in Belgrade to-day.

Intervention by France and England to protect Bulgaria from Macedonian revolutionaries and prevent civil war is being requested, it is reported. Bulgarian troops are marching upon Petrik, the stronghold of the Macedonian anti-communist.

Fresh violence is reported from Bulgaria. Macedonians shot and killed two Bulgarian Army officers at Skopje, where they were leaving. A council of army officers after demanding "strong action" to support the revolutionaries.

Bulgarian buildings in Sofia are under military guard. Vance (Ivan) Maloff, leader of the Macedonians, is defying the Bulgarian government to arrest him. He declared he would fight any troops sent against him.

According to advices from Belgrade, quoting press reports, Foreign Minister Bulow, of Bulgaria, the parliamentary committee of Bulgaria is asking France and England to aid the Sofia government. Belgrade and Athens are requesting joint action against Macedonians owing to the menace of peace on the Greek and Yugoslav frontiers.

King Boris is giving his personal attention to the crisis, but has indicated he will take the field with his troops.

**John Walker Held
Same Jail With
Benzell Carnes**

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 24.—(INS)

—John D. Walker, who is said to have disappeared 12 days ago with \$100,000 belonging to the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, was today quartered in the same tier of cells at Fulton Tower, here, with Clinton Carnes, charged with the embezzlement of \$103,000 of the Bank Home Mission funds.

Walker was returned from New York where he was arrested after federal officials had traced him to several countries. He faces charges of embezzling church moneys and misappropriating funds while at the head of 107 Georgia banks.

He will go on trial at federal court in Savannah, but will be held here several days before being sent to prison there.

Walker, who was described as the financial genius of Georgia, was "glad of the opportunity to return and erase the stigma on his family escutcheon."

**Typhoon Causes Big
Destruction Thru
Philippine Islands**

MANILA, Nov. 24.—(INS)

Sweeping through the central section of the Philippines, a typhoon was taking a terrific toll today, according to meager advice received here.

The typhoon is centering in the provinces of Rambon, Masbate and Sorsogon, about 150 miles south of Manila. All communication from the stricken provinces has ceased.

The only direct word received from the typhoon section was from Legazpi. Reports from there state that hundred of Nipa houses had been destroyed and the people had fled to the strong storm-watches of the hemp companies' stores.

The weather bureau here described the typhoon as the most intense since 1882.

Two Separate Probes Into Sinking Of Vestris To Be Resumed Monday

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—(INS)

—Two separate inquiries into the sinking of the liner *Vestris* off the Florida Coast on Nov. 12 will be resumed here Monday with hot litigations made during the first day's investigation toward determining the cause of the disaster, cost \$114 lives. The investigations indicate that the vessel may have suffered from any one of the causes.

Following their 3 to 0 defeat at the hands of the Palatka Matroos, champions of the Northeastern Conference, and with one of the hardest week's work behind them they have known this season, Coach Hugh Whelchell's Seminole High squad is in fine shape for the encounter with the Terrible Kissimmee Cowboys, which takes place at Municipal Field tomorrow, Saturday afternoon, at 3 o'clock.

Kissimmee is an unknown quantity, as far as their offensive and defensive ability is concerned; their schedule being composed of games with teams of the smaller schools and their most important game, which they lost by the way, being with Leesburg. However, Kissimmee and Sanford are almost the steady rivals that Orlando and Sanford are, and any of the old timers who used to follow the teams of other years to Kissimmee can tell you that we've always had to bear down plenty because these cowboys would not be denied a victory. To date Sanford holds a primus against 3 losses during the 6 years the schools have been meeting each other, and there is no doubt but that the Indians will annex their sixth win from these hard fighting and spirited Osceola County boys.

The trip to Palatka last week tragic though it was, gave the boys the long road trip they were looking forward to their stay in that city was the occasion for their being deeply entertained by the local Palatka townspeople and high school pupils. 



"Pearl Of Antilles" Is Satisfied With Tenth This State Attracts

100,000 Hoped For

Number Insignificant Beside Our Traffic

HAVANA, Cuba, Nov. 24.—Wide circulation has been given here to the issue of Liberty containing the article by Sidney Sutherland, under the startling heading, "Havana Succeeds Florida," but despite this effort to arouse Cuba to its destiny the serenity of the island is undisturbed. There are no hurried preparations for the hordes of Americans promised by Mr. Sutherland, no sudden rise in reality values, no evidence that Havana believes it is about to become the successor of Florida.

Here and there you find those who hope that Mr. Sutherland is right in his prediction, but it is only a hope. A bigger tourist crop is expected this year than last, and a bigger one next year, but there are only smiles for the promise of the headline over the Liberty article. Cubans having to do with the tourist business are inclined to base their calculations on facts and not visionary predictions. However pleasing they may be.

They keep in mind, for example, the fact that Florida last season had more than a million visitors while Cuba had less than eighty thousand.

And they don't forget that of these eighty thousand a good part were week-enders from Florida—regulars from our tourist centers breaking their winter vacation with a trip to foreign shores and a glimpse of a lot of things they have been hearing about.

Satisfied with 100,000.

Havana will be satisfied this season if a hundred thousand Americans hop over from Key West and spend a few days on the island. That is the highest estimate I heard, and it is not much more than St. Petersburg expects off and on during the same period.

The majority of those who come will be week-enders here on their first visit. The average visitor to Cuba is not a repeater in the sense that thousands of Florida winter residents are. He comes once to see Havana and this beautiful island as he goes through the Yellowstone Park. He is delighted with Cuba as he should be—and he resolves to return, but seldom does.

Palm Beach, in its feverish search for thrills, is little influenced by Havana and its racing and casino. Palm Beach provides for itself everything that Havana offers with the exception of racing, and many things that Havana doesn't offer. She has finer and larger hotels, a more lively social life, the same wines and whiskeys, supper clubs and wilder parties, gambling for even higher stakes. It is true that occasional parties of Palm Beachers sail into Havana for a few days of play. The city is geared up for him and gives him his thrills as he wants them.

A good many Americans, of course, come here regularly and will continue to come. Mostly these are incurable patrons of racing and the roulette wheel—good spenders, high livers, easy money for the resorts they favor. These are the real sports who livened up things around Miami during the hectic days of '24 and '25. They had and have plenty of money and their presence is noted in the daily bank clearings whenever they happen to be.

No Great Loss to Florida.

If these are the tourists Mr. Sutherland had in mind when he spoke of Florida as being the springboard of Havana, he was considerably wrong. They came to Miami with no spending or racing there and departed in large numbers when the track was closed.
