#### **Propeller Trouble Stalls** Cambodian Supply Convoy

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) - Phnom Penh's first supply convoy in a month was reported stalled by propeller trouble 44 miles southeast of the Cambodian capital today. Two tugs towing barges loaded with a total of about 4,000 tons of ammunition were trying to make the run up the Mekong River from South Vietnam with the protection of T28 fighter planes, helicopter gunships and navy gunboats. A military source said one tug fouled its propeller and was beached 12 miles south of Neak Luong while workmen made repairs.

#### **Police Investigating Murders**

MONTREAL (AP) - Police investigating the mass murder of 13 people in a Montreal night club think an escaped convict named Richard Blass may have been involved. But apparently they have no concrete evidence pointing to him. The police are trying to determine if there is any connection between the wholesale killing in the Gargantua Club Monday night and the mob-style killing of two men in the same club last October. They think the killer or killers Monday night might have been eliminating witnesses to the October slaying. Blass, who escaped from a Montreal penitentiary a week before that killing was suspected of it and is still at large.

#### Congress Moves On Taxes

WASHINGTON (AP) - Congress is responding to President Ford's renewed drive for his economic program with quick action on tax relief while entangling his energy program in dispute. In a no-retreat statement opening his news conference Tuesday, Ford said he will put into effect without congressional help his tariff on imperted oil and would veto any mandatory gasoline rationing legislation.

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP) - Former Sen. Edward J Gurney of Florida has lost a plea to have a federal appeals court throw out an indictment charging lim with bribery, conspiracy and perjury in an influence peddling case. In a brief, no-comment order Tuesday, the 5th U.S.

#### **Door To Peace** Is Kept Ajar

The illness of Chairman Lecnid Brezhnev gave the Soviet Union a convenient explanation for the cancellation of his scheduled trip to Egypt this month. Now President Anwar Sadat has confirmed that there is more to it than that. He says efforts to repair relations between Moscow and Cairo remain "frozen" because the Russians are refusing to supply Egypt with the quantity and quality of weapons they have been sending to Syria. Egypt thus has all the more reason to think in terms of peace with Israel instead of war.

This development raises the hope that Secretary of State Henry Kissinger can begin with Egypt and Israel in his effort to work out a Middle East settlement on a step-by-step basis. His success at this point may depend on how badly he has damaged his credibility with the Arabs as an evenhanded mediator by his remarks regarding the possibility of military action by the West to protect its oil supply from the Middle East. Some Arab leaders are bristling, but this will not necessarily cause Mr. Sadat to shut the door on the possibility of an accommodation with Israel.

The first hurdle for Mr. Kissinger is to find points of agreement between Israel and Egypt that could lead to a further withdrawal of Israeli troops from occupied territory in the Sinai. This is an easier challenge than the problem of obtaining territorial concessions anywhere else on Israel's perimeter, but it is difficult enough.

Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin is faced with parliamentary opposition that could bring down his government if he accedes to a surrender of territory that leaves Israel substantially weaker on its southern front. Giving up the oil fields in the occupied Sinai which are fulfilling 80 per cent of Israel's petroleum needs — as Egypt is asking would be hard for Mr. Rabin to sell to his people. President Sadat will find it politically no easier to make compromises that might suggest Egypt is intimidated by Israeli military power or that this country would not be wholeheartedly behind the Arab cause if there is another showdown with

Kissinger's mission will be helped along by conditions in both Israel and Egypt that would make a new accommodiation profitable for both. Israel desperately needs to be relieved of the cost of the current level of her mobilization. Demonstrations disclosed in Cairo the extent of discontent among Egyptians with their economic problems, which are not being helped by having one-third of their national budget committed to military spending.

A ray of optimism can thus be found in the

otherwise menacing picture of enemies armed to the teeth in the Middle East. The big question is whether the Soviet Union, apparently unable to gain a more influential position with Egypt, would be content to see Mr. Kissinger's diplomacy succeed. Relaxation of tensions in the Middle East would rob the Russians of their main excuse for being there.

### Cutting Edge Of Religion Major Story

Rather than discuss the highlights of religious stories that appeared in 1974 and predict the large events for 1975, let us concentrate on some trends that appear to be shaping the church at this time. Many things are happening that do not move from a single event or activity, yet demonstrate a broader and, at times, an exciting development within the religious community.

The ordination of women. The Episcopal Church continues to vibrate with the tension and controversy surrounding the ordination of 10 women in Philadelphia last summer. Liturgical communions are the last to ordain women to the priesthood, a move that was begun earlier in this century in the main-line denominations. Perhaps of higher importance for the whole Christian church is the support and encouragement of the main proposals of women's liberation.

The conservative, evangelical churches have been quiet and hesitant on this issue (although they were the first, in the 19th century, to ordain women). A major breakthrough was the new book "All We're Meant To Be" by Scanzoni and Hardesty (Word Books) which deals with the issues of women's lib from a Biblical approach. In December, this book received one of the longest and most favorable treatments in a review published by the conservative,

#### What Price For Control Of Prices?

worse - if they were better, that is. There is a steel shortage today, among other shortages. Bad enough. But if the economy were numming and if the auto industry were taking its normal share of production, the shortage would be of "staggering" proportions. This is the opinion of William H. Knoell, president of Cyclops Corp., a steel producer.

Knoell is concerned about the re-imposition of price controls, an anti-inflation measure strongly supported in some quarters and even more strongly now because of the eight per cent price hike announced by U.S. Steel, the industry's pacesetter.

In tracing the origins of today's steel shorage, he attributes it to the price controls imosed a few years ago, which compounded the problem the industry had already been having competing with foreign steel under the fixed dollar exchange rate established by the Bretton

Woods agreement in 1945. Because of a severely overvalued dollar, says Knoell, foreign producers with their modern postwar plants were able to undersell American producers by \$20 to \$30 a ton. The dollar was eventually cut loose, but devaluation was almost immediately followed by a freeze on steel prices at "unrealistically" low levels.

Steel imports continued to rise, to account for 18 per cent of domestic steel consumption, or the equivalent of all the growth in the consumption of steel in this country over a period of seven or eight years.

The result was to restrict steel producers from making the profits necessary to expand capacity.
