

The event is being held as a White Elephant Sale, with many items (but no white elephants) offered for sale.



Assault on corpse: **Harsher penalties?**

Prosecutors could have brought tougher charges against a young man accused of sexually assaulting the corpse of a friend's mother under a bill nearing flouse floor action.

In Seminole County, Eddie James, who killed a 56-year oldgrandmother and her eight-year-old granddaughter could have faced additional charges for sexually assulting the little girl after she was dead if the bill had been law last VEAF

Mutilating or abusing a dead body. would be a telony punishable by prison time under the proposal (HB) 363) unanimously approved Thursday by the House Criminal Justice Committee.

Seminole County State Attorney

Norman Wollinger spoke in layor of the bill.

"We have had cases where persons have had sex with a deadbody. When we do, we are generally limited to misdemeanor charges of improper burial." Wollinger said

The bill would have helped law enforcement officers probing the slaying of Kathryn Moore of Tallahassee last year. Leon County Undersheriff Larry Campbell told the panel.

Mrs. Moore's son, Aaron Moore. 17. and his friend. David Baity, 22. are still awaiting trial in the June 29, 1995, slaying. They contessed to the fatal beating of Mrs. Moore, whose body was dumped down anabandoned well. In addition, Campbell said, "The friend of the son had sexual intercourse with the

Limits set for divorced parents

TALLAHASSEE - The state Supreme Court has clarified limits on the ability of divorced parents to relocate when minor children are involved. The high court three years ago approved a policy favoring relocation requests of custodial parents as long as such moves are made in good faith for the well-being of parents and

children. Also, the justices miled at that time, moves cannot be made "from a vindictive desire to interfere with the visitation rights of the other parent The high court's 7-0 opinion Thursday sided with Ray Dean

Russenberger, of Pensacola, who had objected to the moving plans of his former wife, Cynthia L. Russenberger, who has custody of their children. Director suspended for wrong release

KISSIMMEE - The sheriff has suspended his jail director over the mistaken release of a rapist and an apparent jail cover-up about the missing man. Steven Baker, 36, was released March 6, within hours of his

rape conviction. The victim and the public were not alerted until last Tuesday, when a reporter began asking questions. Baker was arrested by chance while crossing the Mexican border to Brownsville, Tex.

Capt. Ron Caswell, the jail director, will remain on suspension until an investigation is completed. Osceola County Sheriff Charlie Croft said there were reports that other inmates have been released by mistake without anyone being notified. "The ball was really dropped," Croft said Wednesday, "He went to one location, and the paperwork went somewhere else ... The mistake was made here, and it's going to be corrected."

brought ridicule not sympathy. Mrs. Clifton was banned from sitting at the counter of The Clock restaurant in this Central Florida city about three weeks ago after the manager blamed her for damaging several stools. Kerrie Razmi, manager of The Clock, said she's allowed to sit

In a booth and nume a coffee for hours at a time, but not the Angry about the ban from her beloved counter, Mrs. Clifton called The Ledger of Lakeland to complain.

Body found in fridge

FORT MYERS - A woman reported missing by friends was found by Lee County deputies who searched her apartment and found her body in the refrigerator. The woman was identified as 38-year-old Michaelene Blastic.

Lee County sheriff's spokesman Tim Hets said. Police said the killer may have stolen her 1998 green four-door Saturn SL.

An autopsy confirmed the woman was murdered, and police believe she may have known the killer. Police would not say how she was murdered.

Deputies visited the apartment about 9 p.m. Wednesday to check on a missing persons report. They found stores with apartment door, but a deputy who knew her doubted they were in her handwriting. While searching the spartment they found her body inside

TALLAHASSEE - The Florida Supreme Court upheld a death sentence for the mastermind of a mistaken-identity

In 1993, the justices had vacated Robin Archer's death sentence and ordered a new penalty hearing, which had the same result. This time, the high court split 4-3 in upholding

the sentence Archer, 31, promised three teen-agers a briefcase full o money to kill Daniel Wells, a cierk he held responsible for having him fired from his job at a Trout Auto Parts store. But Wells called in aick and was replaced by Billy Wayne Coker on Jan. 26, 1991 when the teens came into the store.

They shot and robbed Coker instead of the intended target. The high court, in its earlier ruling, upheid Archer's first-degree murder conviction but found the trial judge im-

properly instructed jurors an aggravating circumstance - that the killing was especially heinous, atrocious or cruel - cited to justify the death sentence. In the new opinion, the justices found instructions given to

the second jury on another aggravating circumstance - that the killing was cold, calculated and premeditated - was unconstitutionally vague.



Justices refuse to give personhood to fetuses

TALLAHASSEE - Florida's law barring wrongful death suits over the loss of a fetus will remain unchanged, the state

Supreme Court decided. in a case with possible abortion rights implications, the ustices were unanimous Thursday in refusing to change their long-held view that a fetua cannot be considered a person under the state's wrongful death 10.107

The one-paragraph ruling keeps Florida among only seven states that still prohibit suits alleging negligence in the loss of a fetus. The high court cited its

1980 decision in a similar case. The ruling bars Gwendolyn Golden Young from suing St. Vincent's Medical Center of Jacksonville over the death o her fetus in 1989.

A lawyer for Ms. Young said she suspected the justices were afraid that changing their posi-tion could have impacted the abortion issue.





Teacher should be cleared of blame

We agree with Lyman High School principal Dr. Peter Gorman that a teacher is ultimately responsible for what happens in his classroom.

However, a teacher can only do so much to control the actions of his students.

Joe Laughlin, a former teacher of the year at Lyman, has been recommended for a five day suspension by his principal and by district administrators because a pair of students were "fondling" one another during the showing of a film in his biology class last month.

Witnesses have told officials and the Sanford Herald that Laughlin left about half the classroom lights on while the film was in progress, he regularly walked the aisles of the classroom to supervise the students and the students in question hid their activity under a jacket.

According to the other students in the classroom, only the students on either side of the couple were aware of the nature of their actions. They failed to report their observations to the teacher until after class, however.

It has come to light that the students involved had been in trouble in the past for engaging in similar activity at school. Perhaps, Laughlin should have made it his business to be aware of his students' behavioral problems and, knowing their history, to keep them separated in the classroom.

That, as far as we can see, was Laughlin's only possible "mistake" in this matter.

The students who could not keep their hands out of one another's pants should not be allowed to drag an outstanding teacher down with them.

Laughlin's otherwise spotless record has been highlighted by countless examples of selfless dedication to his students. Why should a pair of young people whose hormones apparently could not be kept in check be allowed to beamirch his good name as a teacher?

The students have been rightly punished. In this case, the teacher should not also be penalized.

Buchanan has brought GOP together



We support Laughlin and hope the hearing officer will as well.



There must be some noncynical reason for the legislation that was reported out of a House Judiciary subcommittee last week. Surely the bill's sponsors-presidential nominee-apparent Sen. Bob Dole and Rep. Charles T. Canady, R-Fla.-aren't just being nasty with their archly titled "Equal Opportunity Act of 1996."

The obvious (and obviously intended) effect of this regressive legislation would be the utter dismantling of "affirmative action." root and branch. Its title notwithstanding, it is manifestly not about improving opportunities for women or minorities. Nothing in the bill acknowledges even the existence of sexual or racial discrimination-except, impliedly, discrimination against white men.

It's hard not to view it cynically. Canady, who has never impressed me as a thoughtful man, at least is consistently conservative. I'm not surprised either to find him sponsoring this bill or to find him offering no remedy for America's real problems of discrimination. But what of Senate Majority Leader Dole, who used to be a supporter of affirmative action until that position became a threat to his presidential ambitions? Has some flash of philosophical insight turned him into an all-out

opponent of what he lately backed? The kindest thing I've heard from the Kansan's African American supporters is that now that the nomination is virtually secured, Dole will revert to his mainstream core.

The problem is, if this bill is passed, it won't matter

I ought to say here that I have no quarrel with principled objections to some of the manipulation and self-dealing that go on in the name of affirmative action. I have expressed my own objections often enough.

But this legislation isn't about fine-tuning principles. It's not a proposal for an alternate plan for securing rights and opportunities for those to whom they have been denied. It is an all-out in-your-face attack, a walking away from hard-carned civil rights gains.

Not only does it forbid any federal agent to discriminate in hiring or contracting on the basis of gender or race: it even outlaws goals and timetables, long considered essential for measuring progress toward actual (as opposed to mere theoretical) fairness.

"Wiping out goals strikes at the very heart of equal opportunity enforcement." says Penda Hair of the Washington office of the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. "The numbers were never binding-just a signal that if they were out of line, you ought to look for an explanation. The explanation might be benign, but at least you were on notice to look. This bill says you can't even do that."

It says more than that, in the reading of Barbara Arnwine, executive director of the National Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights

Under Law. "The FBI has been sued for discrimination in the hiring and treatment of women and blacks. This bill says that if the plaintiffs absolutely proved their case, you could not have a consent decree that required expanding opportunities for blacks or women. The language is quite clear: 'preference' means 'an advantage of any kind, and includes a

quota, set-aside. numerical goal. timetable, or other numerical objective."

Again, since it's impossible to read the legislation as enhancing opportunity for those groups that, historically. have been denied opportunity, what noncynical purpose could its sponsors have in mind? is it an assertion that racial and sexual

I recall a frustrating exchange with Rep. Canady in which he simply could not bring himself to say that the government had any role in fighting discrimination beyond asserting that discrimination is against the law. What do you do. I kept pressing him, when the discriminators go on discriminating? Don't you, at some point, have to require evidence--yes, numerical evidence--that the discrimination has ceased?

Canady had no answer then. His answer now involves only what government must not do. As I read him, his idea is that government must not do anything that has any chance whatever of being effective.

And the philosophically flexible Dole? The suspicion is that he signed on to the legislation last fall as a sort of bookmark for proving his conservative bona fides and that he'd much prefer that it not be brought up for con-sideration now, while he's embarked on his party-healing trek back toward the political middle.

Maybe Canady, who is chiefly responsible for the present spurt of activity on the bill, is justified in refusing to let Dole have it both wave.

the ordeal and the pain of losing. Dole assured Gramm that he was still a young man who would get another shot to run for national office. perhaps realizing the

same could not be said for himself.

The hard-bitten Gramm -- who always had a personal affection for Dole despite their rivalry -- was moved by the sincerity of Dole's sermon. When an aide later asked him about the call and whether there had been an en-domement, Gramm quipped, "Hell, by the time he got off into all that, he never got around to asking."

It didn't matter, for Gramm had decided to endorse Dole even before the call. Gramm sees former Tennessee Gov. Lamar Alex-ander as a phony, and Malcolm S. "Steve" Forbes as a faith healer whose flat tax idea is no magical elixir for healing all of society's ills. But most of his wrath is reserved for Buchanan, whom he regards as an economic demagogue, an anti-Semite and a racist. Gramm has privately told aides that if the election came down to a contest between Buchanan and President Clinton, he would not vote for Buchanan.

For the Gramm family, the negative feelings aroused by Buchanan's campaign hit home. Supporters of Buchanan in the Louisiana caucuses distributed campaign literature pointing out that Gramm's wife, Wendy, is Korean-American. It read, "Many conservatives will not vote for him in the primary due to his interracial marriage. He divorced a white wife to marry an Asiatic." Buchanan has denied any links between the literature and his campaign.

Contrary to published reports, Gramm personally learned of the literature several days before the election. But when Gramm requested copies, his top staffers stalled in getting them to him out of concern for how the vile literature might impact the candidate.

By the time Dole called back a second time to request his former adversary's backing. Gramm's only concern was timing. He thought Dole would probably lose the New Hampshire primary, though he still believed that Dole would prevail as the nominee. But the larger dynamic driving Gramm's en-dorsement decision was the specter of Buchanan somehow winning - or prolonging .. the nomination battle. He told senior staffers he would feel guilt-ridden the rest of his life if he didn't jump in and do his part to defeat Buchanan, whom he privately calls "dangerous."

Dole, who is intensifying calls for party unity, had better be careful what he hopes for in the case of Pat Buchanan.

Charalambous presented pamphlets which will be given to the visitors, outlining area attractions. and filled with information which is expected to be extremely valuable to British visitors.

As an example, one of the pamphlets gives a listing of some words which may be different in the two nations, even though they generally speak the same language.

It explains that in America, visitors should call an infant's garment a diaper, rather than a nappy as they may do at home. Likewise, Brits should know that what they call crisps are potato chips. and what they refer to as chips are actually French fries.

Valuable phone numbers, hospital locations, safety suggestions and driving tips are also provided for each visitor. (Nowhere does it remind drivers to drive on the right instead of the left side of the road.

Charalambous' purpose, in addition to explaining the operations of Airtours, was to encourage Sanford area business and government leaders to work together in helping to welcome these visitors to the general area. "They may be coming to Central Florida to see the attractions." he said, "but that doesn't mean they won't be coming into Sanford as well, and I hope the city will be prepared."





AT&T reduces layoff estimate

BASKING RIDGE, N.J. - AT&T Corp. said today it will lay off about 18,000 people rather than the 30,000 it originally estimated would be required as part of its restructuring plan.

The company announced in January it would eliminate about 40,000 jobs over the next two years as it splits into three companies.

At the time, it said it expected to lay off about 30,000 people as part of that plan. But more people than expected took a buyout offer and many found other jobs within the company.

The telecommunications company expected about 6,500 people to leave voluntarily, but 7,300 people took the offer, spokesman Ritch Blasi said today. AT&T anticipates that an additional 4.700 employees will take future buyouts, he said. The company figures an additional 6.000 employees will get

other jobs within the company. Blasi said as some divisions grow, such as wireless services and the WorldNet Internet access service, more jobs will be created.

All of those factors caused the company to reduce its projections on the number of jobs to be eliminated.

'it comes down to about 18,000 people that would have to

leave the business involuntarily," he said. The company placed full-page ads in 29 newspapers Thursday seeking jobs for the workers it is laying off. It received hundreds of calls to a toll-free line listed in the ad for employers to request more information.

The ads were designed to run as the end of work at AT&T comes for many managers who were told in mid-January that their jobs would be phased out.

Yearning for the job

WASHINGTON - While the Senate majority leader was out hunting the Republican presidential nomination, the business of the Senate has been conducted in a Mississippi drawl by a man who yearns for the job full-time.

Trent Lott, 54, who holds the Senate Republicans' second highest ranking, majority whip, was ostensibly just helping keep the GOP legislative agenda on track while Bob Dole traveled around the country.

Lott apparently will have to wait a while for a more formal role as No. 1 Senate leader. Dole rejected suggestions he give up his position to concentrate on the presidential race: "I'll step down if Clinton steps down," Dole quipped recently, Formal or not, Lott brings to the Senate floor a leadership

style --- more personable, more partisan, more conservative ---that clearly differentiates him from an old-school pragmatist such as Dole.

Buchanan refuses to guit

DETROIT - Pat Buchanan offers a simple answer for those expecting his quick exit from the Republican presidential race: 'We're going up into the hills and we're not coming down until

deep, late in the summer. We're going to meet in San Diego." At the same time, though, aides complain that attacks from Bob Dole's allies are harming the cause of eventual party unity, while Buchanan himself says he may ask backers for advice on whether to part ways with the Republican Party.

With the GOP presidential race all but settled and Buchanan the only remaining candidate running against Dole, most of the suspense in the race focused on the role Buchanan would play in a post-primary season.

Stumping across the industrial Midwest, there were conflicting signals and no sign of a quick resolution.

Avoiding a government shutdown

٠

WASHINGTON - Legislation sent by Congress to President Clinton avoids a partial government shutdown at midnight tonight, but the broader impasse over spending priorities is dragging on nearly six months into the fiscal year.

The one-week spending bill adopted Thursday by Congress buys more time for lawmakers and the administration to settle differences over a \$160 billion measure to carry the government through the 61/2 months left in fiscal 1996.

President Clinton is expected to sign the stopgap bill keeping the government open through March 22. Neither Democrats nor Republicans wanted the political failout from sending thousands of government workers home in what would have been the third partial shutdown in five months.

But Democrats offered Republicans little help in pushing the stopgap bill through the House, 238-179. The Senate adopted it without opposition Thursday night after Democrats secured support from Republican senators to add \$727 million for environmental protection to the longer-term measure.



Government orders inquiry

DUNBLANE. Scotland — Saying the "cold-blooded slaughter of tiny children is beyond atrocity." the government ordered a public inquiry into how a gunman could burst into a Scottish school and massacre 16 kindergarten children and their teacher.

Many Britons were asking how 43-year-old Thomas Hamilton, widely regarded as unstable and unsavory, was able to get licenses for the guns he owned. Hamilton also wounded 12 other children and two other teachers before fatally shooting himself.

"The whole nation mourns," the Cabinet minister responsible for Scotland told a grim House of Commons as he announced a full public inquiry into the massacre at Dunblane Primary School.

Michael Forsyth, who visited the scene of the shootings, said Thursday that what he had seen there encompassed both the worst and the best of humanity.


Taiwan president campaigns

TAIPEI. Taiwan - In a combative spirit today, President Lee Teng-hui told China to stop "nagging" Taiwan and ruled out sending an envoy to Beijing to appeal for an end to war games aimed at intimidating the island.

Campaigning for a fresh term in Taiwan's March 23 presidential election, Lee said: "Despite Communist China's military exercises, our people remain calm and cool, making their nagging in vain."

Lee told an enthusiastic crowd of 1,500 farmers outside Taipei that he and running-mate Lien Chan were not "wimps with weak feet" and would not bow to "intimidation and surrender to Communist China.



Start planning college early

One of the most pressing problems faced by low and middle income families is paying for the kid's college education. While Florida has some of the lowest tuition rates in the country for in-state students, the added cost of room and board make even state institutions seem out of the range of the possibilities for many families.

But as with many other things financial, planning is of the casence. Planning needs to start carly. The earlier you start, the casier it will be to afford the college education of your choice. An excellent planning aid is provided free of charge via Internet by Sallie Mac. Sallie Mac is a government agency that helps banks and universities offer educational loans and other types of financial aid. The Internet "web" address for Sallie Maels:http:// www.sailiemac.com

The Sallie Mae web page contains very useful planning information. Planning starts when the prospective college



student begins the first year of high school. This guide lists step by step the "how-to" to obtain financial aid. It also describes the different types of aid available. An interesting fact is that many forms of aid are available

regardless of family income. College CD: The College Savings Bank offers a CD that guarantees to pay tuition, room, and board when your child is ready to go to college. Unlike prepaid college plans - which guarantee tuition, and sometimes room and board payments at a particular university - this CD can be used to pay for expenses at any institution. Here is now it works: The CD is sold in

"units." One "unit" pays for all one-year expenses at an average private college: 0.4 "units" pay for a year at an in-state public university, and 1.42 "units" pays for one year at an ivy league institution. The cost of the "unit" depends on when do you want your CD to mature (1 to 25 years). CDs do not have to be bought in one lump sum, the minimum investment to open up an account is \$1,000.

The nice thing about the college-sure CD is that it takes the uncertainty out of college expense planning. The CD guar-antees to keep up with college expense increases and guarantees a yield of at least 4 percent for years with small or no in-creases in tuition and expenses.


Typically consumers have relied on savings accounts or investing in mutual funds to accumulate funds to pay for college costs. Yields on savings accounts and CDs are very safe because in most instances they are held in federally insured institutions. The drawback of

saving accounts and CDs is that their yield has lagged behind the increases in the cost of attending a college. Over the last 10 years these costs have grown at an annual rate of 7.3 percent.

On the other hand, investments in mutual funds have done better, averaging returns of more than 10 percent per year for the last 10 years. However, investments have a downside you can actually lose money. This risk decreases with the length one is willing to stay in the market.

The CD is not technically an investment - because there is no risk of loss - but a deposit. In effect, the CD is insured by FDIC for up to \$100,000. For more information about this product call College Savings Bank at 1-800-888-2723.

Positives of jail ministry shared Jail ministry banquet at Civic Center nears



SANFORD - Throughout an individuals walk in life one never knows whose life may be touched by their efforts. The work of the Good News Jail Ministry has touched one of these precious souls.


This person only referred to herself as "Elizabeth" in a letter that she wrote concerning the jail ministry. As the Prison Ministry Banquet nears, this correspondence was deemed an appropriate message to share with others the effectiveness of such a program.

She began by saying,"...Prior to my addiciton I was born into a mid-upper class family in Seat-tic, Washington. I had everything any child would want, a nice home, nice clothes, a summer home, family vacations, the opportunity to play or learn any activities I chose and two successful parents, whom today I can only thank by remaining clean and sober."

She further shared the progression of her addiction as it began with drinking, smoking marijuana, cocaine, free-based and crack cocaine. "I hung out in the dope neighborhoods and walked the streets for money. I went against every moral value my family had taught me."

Elizabeth told that under the influence of cocaine a person doesn't feel hungry, tired or thirsty. "I spent days on end wearing the same clothes, not eating or sleeping until I would literally pass out. I did not care about anything."

After the birth of a child in 1992, that was addicted to cocaine, Elizabeth recalled H.R.S. retreiving the baby from her hospital room. "It hurt but all my sick mind could do was think of where and when I could take a hit and forget the pain. So I proceeded to bury myself furiner in my addiction for the next three years and the monkey on my back turned into a gorilla and grew and grew."

down off the drug, and the pure sense of hopelessness and fear that surrounded my mind." Again, after an arrest in Oc-

tober of 1994 Elizabeth spent 10 months in the John E. Polk Correctional Facility. "Here is where I began to see that there was hope through the Lord Jesus Christ and this is where and when the healing began. The Jail ministry at John E. Polk planted a seed in me. They showed me there is hope and that I never had to be alone again because Jesus had been with me all the time and he was not going to drop me now."

She continued."I got involved in the Nuture Program. I did Bible studies and met a lady by the name of Joann Zapf who began to share her personal story with me. She believed in me and understood. I felt so much relief that someone finally understood what I was going through. I began dumping a lot of my pain in prayer. I began submitting to God. Joann and the Chapiains. They asked me to do things that at first I didn't want to do and to give up things I wanted to hold on to. I began to work hard at change but deep inside I had reservations which took me back to my drug of choice and three months later I ended up back in jail. This time though I knew I had to do something different. I was pregnant again and I wasn't going to go through the pain of losing another child. Chaplain Joanne Westmoreland was there for me when I go back into the system this time. She concluded by saying." I owe my recovery to a lot of people but first I owe it to God and myself. I have been clean 18 months today. I want to thank the John E. Polk Jail Ministry for planting the seed, the Center

for Drug Free Living for 11 months in residential treatment and for putting up with me. My mom and dad for life and their ability to love unconditionally, Debbie H. for being the best friend a girl ever had. Marilyn Wilming, H.R.S. for seeing me through the last three years and Joann Zapf and Juanita Fuller for being mentors and the heroes in my life. I want to thank my flance. Valdes Williams for giving me my second daughter and finishing recovery for himself. Lestine for giving the love and support to my first born daughter and many others who have played important roles in my recovery. The biggest victory and praise I have today is that on December 16, 1995 I was awarded custody of my first born daughter and at last my two girls and I are together. Life ian't always casy but what it's about is living it. on it's terms, clean and sober. So, to whomever reads this and is still out there suffering or has a loved one who needs help, remember





started. One of the reasons the medical profession is in trouble is that some practitioners have forgotten the very reason they entered the profession in the first place. Instead of helping the sick and injured, too many doctors have been seduced by the business of medicine.

Unfortunately, the seismic upheavals in health care, such as managed care and Health Maintenance Organizations, have done little to get our healers back on track.

See? You got me started.

The kind of rip-off you described is not only unusual, it is - in my opinion - unethical. If I were you, I'd write a letter of complaint to the grievance committee of your county medical society. That should get some action -- and teach the guy a lesson.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My daughter had hives all over her body for nearly six months. They either appear all over her body, or they're sporadic. They primarily occur when she gets out of bed in the morning. Do you have any information on this condition?

DEAR READER: Unticaria (hives) are really just a manifestation of allergy in the skin. Typically, these itchy, irregular, raised, reddish splotches result from exposure to an allergen, such as potlen, food, insect bites, or certain drugs. Some diseases, such as lupus, are associated with urticaria. Also, most authorities believe that high stress levels may cause hives.

Acute urticaria, although not dangerous (unless the allergic reaction progresses to affect breathing), can be extremely annoying. Without therapy, hives can last up to a week.

Treatment with anti-histamines, such as Benadryl, or cortisone is almost always successful.

Chronic urticaria usually means that the person has a continued exposure to an allergy-producing substance. In such cases, consultation with an allergist is advisable.

By examination, skin tests and blood tests, the specialist can ordinarily identify the offending allergen. Then the person can either avoid the substance, use anti-histamines prophylactically or be desensitized with niections.

Judging from your description, your daughter appears to be allergic to something in her bedroom; this could be dust, vapors, or even detergent residues in her pajamas. She should


