Yank In RAF Has Bagged 12 Planes

ALEXANDRIA, July 22, (AP) A 25-year-old Yank in the RAF, Lance C. Wade of Tucson, Ariz., has just bagged two more Nazi planes to bring his western desert total to 12.

The flight lieutenant has completed 260 hours operational flying in the Middle East, and last April received the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wade tried to get in the U. S. Army Air Force before the war, but was rejected, and he said he has no intention of seeking a discharge now "because I know the British service and like flying with the RAF boys."

Pipeline, Canal Bill Is Signed

WASHINGTON, July 23, (AP)—President Roosevelt today signed legislation authorizing the construction of a pipeline from Lake Okechobee to Florida, designed to help reduce the damage caused by drought or moving oil to the eastern seaboard. It also provided for the damming and enlarging of an intracoastal waterway.
