

## **Tight Auto Inspection Sked Seen**

In fact for the two stations to handle all of Seminole's registered motor vehicles seems a mathematical impossibility. Mathematical calculations show that with the 40,000 county vehicles to be inspected twice yearly, some 1,520 vehicles would have to be inspected each week. Further reduced this would mean eight vehicles per lane each 60 minutes. Virgil Neiders, minutes will be required for each auto inspection. Using his figures of eight minutes at the outside, the stations could not

handle all the cars necessary. (Brevard county estimates 10 minutes per inspection is necessary.) Not figured into the calculations is the number of vehicles which may require a second inspection. 

Administrator Frances E. Roumillat III announced that all plans have been approved by all agencies concerned and all permits have been granted, such as directlying by the Internal Improvement.
