

# More than 200 attend annual event

LONGWOOD - More than 200 senior citizens gathered Friday in St. Stephen Lutheran Church to celebrate the holi-

The annual Meals on Wheels Etc., Christmas event attracted participants from all seven sites of the organization's Congregate Meals program. Party-goers were treated to a turkey dinner, entertainment, presents and prizes dur-ing the festivities.
"During the holidays, many

of these people don't have the opportunity go to parties," Meals on Wheels Etc. Executive Director Sherry Fincher said. "So, this is their

party."

Each week, the Congregate

Meals program provides free meals, transportation and other services to more than 250 senior citizens. At the numerous sites throughout the county, including St. Stephen Lutheran Church, recreational activities, informative speakers and nutritional information is provided during the noonday

"Many people in the pro-gram would otherwise sit at home and not eat well if we did not provide this service,"



Fincher said. "Besides offering them meals, we take them to the grocery store and to medical centers.

"If we were not here, many would have to go to nursing homes prematurely," she said.

Meals on Wheels Etc., has provided numerous services, including the Congregate Meals program, to the area's senior citizens for the past 27 years. According to Fincher, the average age of participants

in the program is 84. Currently, there is a waiting list at many of the Congregate Meal sites. However, Fincher said there are still open spots at several of the sites and encourages people interested in participating to call Meals on Wheels Etc..

"We only have so many

vans and so much funding," she said. "Unless we have funding from the community, we do have to cut our ser-

# County ponders mosquito program

SANFORD — County com-missioners could take the firststeps Tuesday in securing the first permanent mosquito con-trol program for unincorporated Seminole residents.

With a flurry of West Nile Virus medical alerts across the state, the county contracted for approximately three months of truck spraying this year to reduce the number of pests. Eleven human cases of West Nile were reported in the state with 55 of the 67 counties on

medical alert for the virus.

A county staff presentation
Tuesday will furnish commissioners with several options for developing an in-house, year-round mosquito control pro-gram. The three proposed mos-quito programs range in price from \$460,000 to \$900,000.

Commissioners could also decide Tuesday to establish a mosquito control Municipal Service Taxing Unit to fund the program. If approved, a public hearing could be scheduled for Jan. 8 for the special taxing dis-

# Commissioner says road standards for level of service don't make the grade

This is the second in a series of articles that will look at development projects in Sanford - what's coming in, where it's going and what effects it may have on the community.

SANFORD — In a motorist's utopia, the lights are always green and traffic is nonexistent. In reality, stop lights and congestion are a way of life, particularly if you drive in Central Florida.

As more development moves into Sanford along State Road 46 and Rinehart Road, city planners will be charged with ensuring traffic congestion doesn't exceed the capacity of those roads. But how much traffic is too much?

The Institute of Transportation created Engineers Transportation and Traffic Engineering Handbook which establishes six classifications of service from 'A' to 'F'. An 'A' level of service is an ideal condition where "vehicles are completely

unimpeded." An 'F' level of service indicates traffic exceeds the road's capacity and "traffic flow has generally come to a stop but will have slight, but inconsistent movement." So what's the level of service planners aim for when

designing roads? Believe it or not it's 'D', and that concerns Sanford City Commissioner Art Woodruff, a high school physics teacher who doesn't think a 'D' is acceptable

HEATHROW Police believe a white elderly man who used a stolen bank card at a Heathrow bank three months ago returned to the same branch Wednesday as an armed robber.

At approximately noon, a man believed to be between 55 and 65 years old robbed the CNL Bank on International Parkway and Lake Mary Boulevard. The suspect reportedly approached a bank employee, produced a handgun and demanded money.

Carrying a briefcase, the man got away with an undisclosed amount of cash. Witnesses describe the suspect as approximately six feet tall, 200 pounds and sporting a mustache and ball cap.

#### 83-year-old Sanford woman shot during home invasion

SANFORD - An 83-year-old Sanford woman was shot twice with her own gun Tuesday while trying to defend her home from a potential robber.

Minnie Dorsey of 1105 Willow Ave. was released Thursday from the Orlando Regional Medical Center with wounds to the left side of her forehead and right hand.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:30 p.m., when a black male entered through the rear porch stating "gimme your bags." In an effort to run the

intruder off, Dorsey grabbed her handgun. A struggle ensued between the two with her attacker eventually gaining control of the gun. The suspect shot several times hitting the woman once in the right thumb and again grazing her head just above the

"The constitution gives us the right to bear arms to protect our-selves," said Cleo Cohen, Sanford police spokeswoman. "People need to realize the same gun that defends you — if it ends up in the hand of perpetrator - could also be used to kill

**CLYDE NICKELSON** Clyde Nickelson, 79, of Park Court, Sanford, died Monday, Dec. 3, 2001



#### Remembering the past only makes us stronger as a nation

You would have to talk to someone over the age of 65, even much older, in order to get a first-hand report on the Japanese bombing of Pearl Harbor

on Dec. 7, 1941. I am of that advanced age, and for the benefit of those who aren't, this is my rec-

I remember being on the living room floor, in front of the radio, listening to who knows what, when an announcer broke in to make the announcement. Being 9 years old, I hadn't any idea of where Pearl Harbor, much less the Philippines, was located. All I knew was that the announcer said they were attacking Americans on an American

Naval base. I dove for my encyclopedia and found it right away. Just like people of today, we all remember where we were and what we were doing on Sept. 11 of this year. Likewise, most of us remember the where and what of the assassination of John F. Kennedy, Martin Luther King Jr., the death of

Elvis, and perhaps a few other shocking occasions. I can remember them all — and knowing the lump Dec. 7 left in my stomach, I knew each of the other ones were disasters history would not forget. What I would like you readers to do is find someone over the age of 65 and ask them about Pearl Harbor. The older the better — and the more they will probably remember.

A friend of mine from Orlando, Con Hilchuck, was in one of the barracks at Pearl Harbor on that terrible day. He told me he heard explosions, looked out the window and saw bombs and strafing, then ducked under his cot and stayed there for several hours before getting up and going to his duty station.

"I was never more frightened in my life," he told me. "It took several hours before I realized what had happened, then my responsibility as a military man returned and I went about my work as did my buddies."

Even though he hid under his bed, rather than rushing outside and grabbing a machine gun, I have always considered Con a hero. I believe all of us would have been frightened like he was, not expecting what was happening.

The same holds true for the World Trade Center. Not everyone was a hero in the first few minutes - but once shock wears off, we do what needs to be done no matter what the consequences may be. The number of people who were at Pearl Harbor in 1941 are dwindling in number, as are those of us who were younger but still remembering that fateful day. Find one of these people and ask them about Pearl Harbor.

Just like what the World Trade Center and Pentagon explosions did to this nation in September of this year, you will find Pearl Harbor instilled patriotism unexcelled until the present

The old phrase is "Remember Pearl Harbor." Those of us who do will never forget it and those of us who lived in the Sept. 11 tragedy won't forget that either. Both of them make us stronger Americans more in love with our own nation. And, if we keep the memories alive, it will make our nation and everyone in it better.

> This is not the elegant courage defined by Ernest Hemingway as grace under pressure. It is the simpler version defined in Webster's Unabridged: "the quality of mind or spirit that enables one to face difficulty, danger, pain, etc. with firmness and

unknown. The best man on the Israeli side, another former general, Yitzhak Rabin, was also shot down by his own people after trying to make peace in 1995.

It is the way in that part of the world. I remember my surprise when I first saw Jerusalem and realized that the Western Wall, the sacred wailing wall of the Jews, was essentially part of the foundation of the man-made plateau of the Dome of the Rock, the Muslim holy site, and that the Via Dolorosa, the path of the crucifixion of Christ, passed close to both places. Everything, the most important stoour civilization, happened over the centuries within a few hundred yards of each other in a small city

in the desert. It all reminded me of "West Side Story," a turf war with sacred music and chants.

The turf war continues. One side is led by a man I consider a thug and worse, Israel's Ariel Sharon, a man who seems to want war and has, I am sure, the courage to die for his vision. The other leader, the Palestinians' Yasser Arafat, once a terrorist by trade, perhaps still one, seems to lack the essential courage to lead. He also seems afraid he will be killed by his own worst


people if peace is at hand. So that war will continue; words will not stop it because the men in charge are unwilling or incapable to say the right words and pay the price. Most of the blame, I suppose, is deserved by Arafat, who keeps changing the words to satisfy the men who would kill him if they lost their capability to find young men willing to blow themselves up to kill an Israeli or two.

There are, in Webster and in life, lesser definitions of courage than the willingness to die. "Courage of convictions" is another, defined in the dictionary as: "to act in accordance with one's beliefs, especially in spite of criticism. Our own tory, that of the United States, tells us that such moral courage, or "integrity" or "guts," is essential to the leadership of our great democ-

I always thought that John F. Kennedy talked too much — and in too macho a way — about courage and exaggerated when he said it was the most important of virtues, because all the rest were impossible without it. But I have found myself wondering about that in contemplating the extraordinary political pulling power of George W. Bush, an unimpressive potential presi-dent by most relevant standards, as compared with that of his more talented predecessor, Bill Clinton.

Looking now, though, at the kind of leadership needed abroad and at home, Americans seem to want courage above all and are concluding that whatever his other failings, President Bush is a man of courage who believes in what he is saying and is willing to face the consequences of his own uncomplicated convictions.

meeting stating that the ladies planned to place an evergreen wreath on the monument in Fifth Street Park on Christmas morning in memory of the eight boys from Seminole County who had died in the war. To find out more about this monument, since it is not in the

park, Mrs. Boyd referred to Peter Schaal's book "Sanford as I Knew It" where she found that a marble shaft, donated by Frank Miller, had been erected in the Fifth Street Park as a memorial for the men who had fought in World War I. More than 1,600 people were on had when it was unveiled on Feb. 16, 1919. It was the first such monument erected in Florida.

A conversation with George Mayberry, commander of Campbell Lossing Post # 53 of the American Legion, revealed that the monument had at one time stood near the Legion Hut on the lakefront, had been moved to the Legion building on U.S. Highway 17/92 and now stands in front of the present Legion Hall at 2870 Sanford Avenue.

Back to Sallie Harrison Chapter's project of a marble arch. In October 1919, the organization asked Mr. Forrest Lake to be chairman of the Men's Committee to raise funds. # The Way We Were: Sallie Harrison DAR

Today we continue the history of Sallie Harrison Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, which was organized May 1918.

In May 1919, Brenda deVere Morrison made a motion "that a committee of four be appointed

Fund included a ball on June 14. 1921; subscription bridge in 1924; a "Society Vaudeville" starring actors who were wintering in Florida, and a bridge luncheon which included an exhibit of antiques at the Forrest Lake Hotel (Tickets \$2).

The chapter was greatly concerned when the Legion Boys built a log cabin on the lakefront in 1924, stating that a stately handsome home preferably of lasting stone had been their intent, and they feared the log building would not endure. That log cabin is still there!

Other philanthropic activities included donations to the School Board to help pay for school lunches, sewing layettes for European and Chinese bables and hemming dressing and tray scarves for the Sanford Hospital. These sewing projects were often completed during chapter meet-

While contributing to the needs of Seminole County citizens, the chapter did not forget that its members were first members of the National Society, and with this in mind, they spent considerable time and money in support of National and State goals.

One of the goals of the National Society has always been the marking of historic spots. On the national level, the hope in 1922 was for a modern road crossing the United States following the pioneer trails, with a statue of a ploneer mother and her children erected in each state through which the highway passed. This was finally accom-

In Florida, the goal was to mark the site of Jean Ribault's landing on the Atlantic Coast between St. Augustine and Jacksonville. This is the location of the first settlement of French Huguenots in America, in 1562. Sallie Harrison contributed its share toward the project. They involved the entire community, including school children who donated their pennies.

Mrs. J.N. Whitner was the chapter's first chairman of the Old Trails Committee. In 1920, she reported that a search was underway to located the deed to the cemetery at Fort Reed. However, the earliest marker placed by the chapter was the one at Mellonville Avenue and Second Street, commemorating the site of Fort Melion. The plot of land where it is located was donated by Harry Bodwell, developer of the Mayfair subdivision. He and Forrest Lake agreed to donate the bronze tablet, but the boulder was to be provided by the Sallie Harrison chapter. It was hoped that a Florida rock could be used, but none was found to be suitable.

A granite stone was ordered in March 1925 at a cost of \$115. It was finally in place by April and the unveiling was set for May 15, 1925. The ceremony was impressive. The municipal band played martial music; invocation was by Dr. E.D. Brownlee, pastor of First Presbyterian; an historical sketch of Fort Mellon, written by Mrs. Whitner, was read by G.W.



Continued from Page 1A programs in Florida, 43 percent are funded through special taxing districts. Orange, Volusia, Brevard and Lake counties all currently have mosquito prevention programs. The Volusia and Brevard programs utilize the

special taxing districts.

They could fund it in other ways," said Owen Reagan, countywide operations manager. There is other counties that fund it through the general

Many of those counties that fund mosquito control programs in the general fund are coastal

and established programs in the 1920s and 1930s, explained Reagan.

Elements of the new program could include year-round public education and mosquito monitoring, larviciding between March and October and adulticiding between April and November.

Options of adulticiding include fogging trucks to reduce the population of adult mosquitoes in urban and suburban areas, barrier spraying for localized application of pesticides and aerial mosquito spraying in rural areas in the event of a med-

The most expensive program option would fund three applications of larvicide for 500 ponds and barrier spraying for parks, schools and events. This option would be the most comprehensive and proactive, said Reagan.





for his students or local motorists. The way I understand it, the city is setting their standard for service at 'D'," Woodruff said. "According to the definition, a level of service of 'D' is unsatisfactory to most drivers."

That's the standard everybody uses," counters Jay Marder, Sanford's director of engineering and planning. "Nobody shoots for an 'A' or B'. The level of service the county and state aim for is 'E'.

At level E', a road is at or above its capacity for traffic. On Rinehart Road, that translates into 42,000 cars a day, according to Marder. Traffic along Rinehart is no where near capacity today (11,000 vehi-cles travel Rinehart between County Road 46A and the south entrance to Seminole Towne Mall, while 7,000 a day travel the road between the south entrance and Sate Road 40). But as 1,900 new apartments, a Sam's Wholesale Chib, a Wal-Mart Super Center and three new car dealerships are built in the next two years, those numbers will increase substantial-

Marder said planners must balance many factors and notes that peak traffic hours can skew the

overall levels of service. Morning and evening rush hours may classify a road as a 'D', but during the day and at night traffic levels could set the level of service at 'B'

or higher. "Do you build a road to operate at an optimum level of service during peak times?" Marder said. "Or do you build it knowing that during the peaks there will be some delays?"

Woodruff argues that peak traf-fic usage should be the key.

"Rush hour is when everyone is on the road," he said. "That's when people are going to notice the level of service most.

However, Marder said there's an expectation that service during peak hours won't be as good.

"People are willing to tolerate a certain level of service at certain times and in certain areas," he

For instance, commercial and downtown areas are more congested than the suburbs or neigh-"You want congestion in a

downtown, particularly if you're doing infill projects and trying to revitalize the area," Marder said. "In those areas you have to use certain teams into large men wools," vices and plenty of sidewalks, Marder said.

like parking garages, trolley ser-

One of the traffic management tools planners use on major roads like Rinehart is access control.

Good access management controls are crucial" to maintaining acceptable levels of service, Marder said. "Curb cuts affect the amount of congestion on a road, probably more so than the land use of the property. You can have a high intensity land use and properly functioning roads as long as you limit access, particularly left-hand turns."

Marder said along Rinehart right-in-right-out curb cuts will be spaced at least 330 feet apart, and left-hand turn intersections must be a minimum of 660 feet apart. Contrast that with U.S. Highway 17/92, where curb cuts occur nearly every 50 feet.

These are tools we didn't have years ago," Marder said. "By limiting access and forcing development to provide cross connections, you're going to see Rinehart Road function well, even with a lot of traffic."

Woodruff agrees access management is a good idea. During his campaign for city commission,

he advocated limited curb cuts and access roads as a way to control traffic congestion along State Road 46. However, he argues that the city should set higher standards and allow commissioners flexibility in applying those stan-

"I would rather set the level of service at a higher standard, then loosen it at the city's discretion," Woodruff said. "It's the same thing we're going to be doing with buffers and setbacks. We set the standard high, then we can always back it down if there's a project that is beneficial but for some reason can't quite meet that standard. It's very difficult to ask someone to do more than is required when you set the standard low."

"On Rinehart Road, we have an opportunity to maintain a high standard," Woodruff added. "Same thing on East Lake Mary Boulevard when that road is fourlaned. We've already lost that opportunity on French Avenue, and I'd hate to see us waste other opportunities.

# Oviedo may join lawsuit against Florida Power

OVIEDO - A third Seminole County city may join Casselberry and Longwood in legal fights against Florida Power next month.

The city of Oviedo's franchise agreement with the electricity provider expires Jan. 4. Similar to disagreements with other municipalities, Florida Power is refusing to include the buyout clause in Oviedo's new contract.

"The city has been trying to negotiate with Florida Power," said city attorney Bill Colbert.

Oviedo city commissioners will be discussing their options at a Dec. 17 meeting. They could adopt an ordinance for a new franchise agreement similar to one that has served the city the last 30 years, leaving the decision up to Florida Power to accept it, said Colbert.

Leading the way in the Florida Power legal battles, Casselberry is awaiting an arbitration hearing set for July and Winter Park is hoping to schedule arbitration in June, said Orlando attorney Tom Cloud, who represents more than half dozen cities in their legal battles against Florida Power.

Seminole County Judge Gene Stephenson recently ordered Florida Power to release documents regarding its political seed and public relations programs the utility has established in Longwood to fight the city's lawsuit, which is scheduled to be heard in January. Last week, the city of Bel Air also had their

franchise fees reinstated by the Pinellas County Circuit Court.

"So far they're batting a thousand — they're losing every hearing," Cloud said about Florida Power. "The cities are standing up for what's right and you have to admire that since they're going up against a billion dollar company from North Carolina."

Meanwhile, a recent Florida Power letter sent to Longwood customers is upsetting city commissioners. They voted Tuesday to send a letter to residents explaining the city's stance on the issue.

Cloud said the letter was "so typical of their game plan and no one is buying it." In particular, the letter stated the city commission "has considered some very risky actions that could end up costing you money and causing great inconvenience." According to Florida Power officials, the letter was sent because they're hearing a lot of questions from customers who are "not getting a lot of information."

The commission decided to draft a factual letter why the commission took the stance they did," said John Drago, city administrator.

Drago stressed the letter will not be an answer to the Florida Power letter, but will help residents determine the facts. Residents may receive the letter as soon as their next water bill, sald Drago.







Four years ago All-American guard Daria Kudruyvtseva, who went on to star at the University of West Virginia and is now

Although education is a huge priority. Collier said many Crimean students do not have the advantages of their American counterparts. Textbooks are hard to come by, and there are only six computers in the entire Bakhchisarai school.

"Can you imagine teaching chemistry without a lab? 's hey don't have a lab," Collier said.

"They have gym class, but they don't have a gym." Nevertheless, the Crimean gov-ernment and school officials are trying to change things, she said. Principal Polupan helps by writing and publishing English textbooks for his students.

"He spends every waking hour writing textbooks," Collier said. Collier and her American sta-

dents also want to help When the geography teacher returned to Millennium Middle School, she brought with her more than 100 letters from the

Bakhchisarai students. The Sanford students are responding to the let-ters, and they have already sent one package to the Ukrainian school

In the next few weeks, the class plans to make friendship bags full of various items, including pencils, stickers and pens, to give to every student at the Bakhchisarai school.

Collier also plans to add a few items to the package, including crayons, dustless chalk and Ziploc

bags.
"Alexandra, the teacher of English, loved Ziploc bags," Collier said. "She visited the states once, but she could only afford to buy one box of Ziploc bags. So, I thought it would be neat to send

Asked if she would go back to Crimea, Collier doesn't hesitate with her answer.

"I can't imagine not going back," she said. "I'm a geography teacher, and that's what it's all about.



Collier selected to participate in international teaching program

illennium Middle School teacher Margaret Collier's classroom is filled with maps and posters of various countries throughout the world. They are learning tools for her sixth-grade geography students.

In a few weeks, Collier's stu-dents will begin learning about the countries of the former Soviet Union, including the Ukraine. It will be a time when the geography teacher can close her textbook and teach from

first-hand experience.
Collier traveled to the Ukraine in October as a participant in the U.S. Department of Education's Teacher of Excellence program. She was one of 29 teachers nationwide selected to travel to various destinations in eastern Europe and Central Asia.

"I got to visit places teachers teach about but never see," Collier said. "Being a geography teacher, seeing and learning about other cultures and then

teaching students about it, that's a great experience."

Culier received an application for the intermational program as a result of her selection last year to the USA Today's third Annual All-USA Teacher Team. In January, she applied for the program and, in June, she found out she had been selected to travel abroad.

out she had been selected to travel abroad.
"I was shocked, but so happy, to be selected," she said.
After the tragedy of Sept. 11, the teachers in the international program weren't sure whether they could still travel to their distinations. Several countries destinations. Several countries were closed to travelers, and sev

were closed to travelers, and several school systems prohibited international travel.

"It was real touch and go after September," Collier said. "Of the 29 teachers selected, only 17 traveled to their destinations."

On Oct. 14, Collier traveled to Washington, D. C., to be briefed by the U.S. State Department. The next day, she left for the Ukraine.

For two weeks, Collier was immersed in the Ukrainian cul-

ture, living with a host family, visiting and teaching various classes and traveling to numer-ous destinations in the Crimean Peninsula. She became a part-time ambassador to the area, representing Seminole County and the United States.

"It was like being an ambas-sador," Collier said. "But, I actually felt like a politician. I met so many wonderful people on the

trip."
Collier met seyeral high-rank-ing officials, Including Crimea Prime Minister Vladimir Tuterov and Minister of Education Galina Pekhar, during her time in the Ukraine, Nevertheless, the students, teachers and other resi-dents of Bakhchisarai — the city where she lived during her stay are her fondest memories.

Collier stayed with Vladimir and Alexandra Polupan while in Bakhchisarai. Vladimir is the principal and Alexandra is a teacher of English at the city's school, which enrolls 250 stu-
