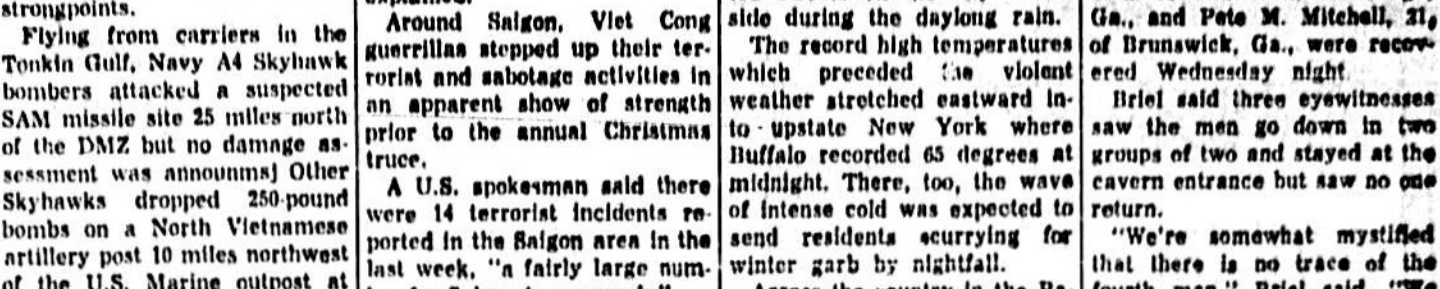
Winter Bows In, Socks Midwest

 Winter bowed in with mid-season intensity today, stinging the Midwest with subzero winds and plunging temperatures. The sharp change came in the wake of several days of rain and snow in the Midwest and was preceded by a day of tornadoes, severe thunderstorms and torrential rains. The mercury dipped from a Thursday morning reading of 61 to a low of 18 at Chicago early today. Similar drops in temperature were reported as far south as Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia. Memphis recorded a record 78 degree Thursday; within an hour it fell 18 degrees.

B52s Brave Russian SAMs

SAIGON (AP) — U.S. B-52 bombers returned to blast North Vietnamese targets in the demilitarized zone again today despite the threat of more SAM missiles like the three the B-52s were shot down in the area Wednesday night. The huge high-altitude bombers pounded troop concentrations and artillery positions in the northern half of the DMZ, seven miles north-northeast of the U.S. Marine outpost at Con Thien. Earlier in the day they blasted suspected Communist infiltration routes along the Cambodian border.

Ag Tax Legislation Explained

The latest legislation in agricultural taxation was passed in the last legislative session. House Bill 100, known as the "Ag Tax" bill, was passed on May 28, 1967 and is now in effect.

HB 100 is referred to as an agricultural taxing act, but it is actually a classification act for tax purposes and the definition of agricultural or non-agricultural has little, if any, to do with the designation on the land use.

HB 100 creates a County Agricultural Taxing Board made up of County Commissioners, with the tax assessor and county agent as ex-officio members. The purpose of the board is to classify lands in the county as agricultural or non-agricultural according to the criteria set forth in the bill.

As the bill was being drafted, there was the feeling on the part of some that a state board should be formed to classify these lands. The thought prevailed, however, that since local government, namely the Board of County Commissioners, had the best information, planning, providing services, etc., that it was best that the control of such land classification should also remain in local hands.

Thus the Board of County Commissioners were set up as the "Ag Taxing Board," setting with the advice of the county agent whose areas of responsibility are most affected, namely, the Agricultural Agent and Tax Assessor.

In brief, HB 100 states:

- The Board of County Commissioners is the Agricultural Taxing Board.
- The commissioners are voting members and the tax assessor and county agent are ex-officio, non-voting members for advice only.
- The Board chairman is chairman of the Agricultural Taxing Board and must call the necessary meetings to implement the provisions of the act of classifying (setting) all land agricultural or non-agricultural.
- The taxpayer (farmer) must make a return as required by law, stating the legal description of the land and

orderly growth of the community that the land remains in open space agriculture. Well needed at a future date.

4. Returns must be filed on or before April 1st each year. Failure to do so could mean failure to receive agricultural classification (preferential tax).

5. It is mandatory that a return be made, that the board meet and classify (set) lands as agricultural or non-agricultural.

6. On the filing of returns, the burden is on the taxpayer and not on the Board or the Tax Assessor. No class action is allowed. Any person aggrieved by the board's action may file a petition for review in the circuit court within 30 days of the date of the board's action.

7. The classification ("setting") of lands as agricultural or non-agricultural shall be on an annual basis.

8. If a return is made on land that on January 1 was being used primarily for agricultural purposes, and is not contiguous to two sides with urban development, it must be classified (set) as agricultural.

9. If the land is agricultural land, but is contiguous to two sides by urban development, the board may classify (set) the land as non-agricultural. On the other hand it may be classified (set) as agricultural.

10. The board may classify (set) land as agricultural or non-agricultural on a case-by-case basis.

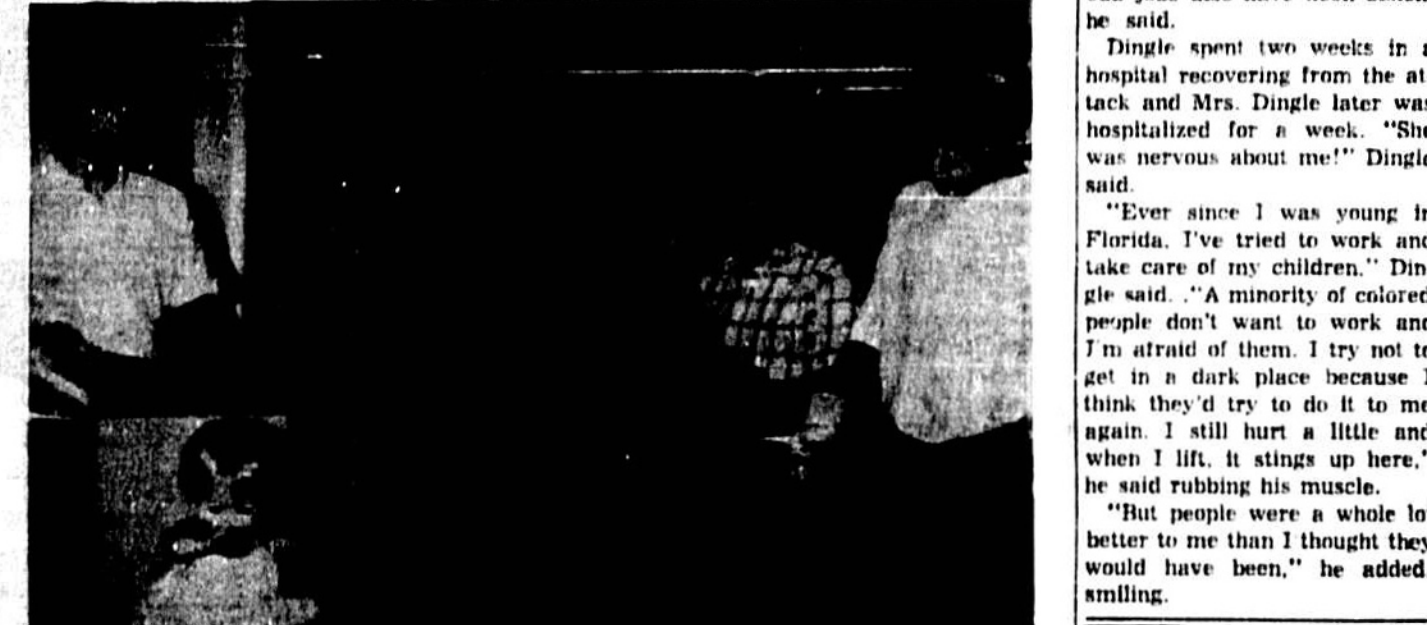

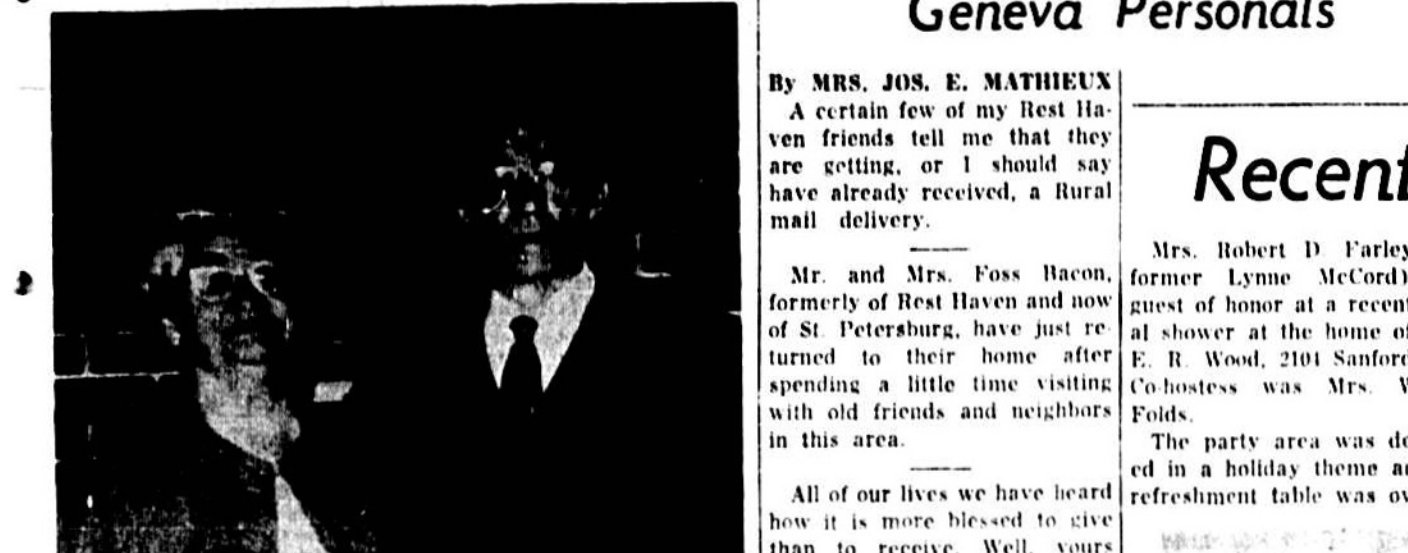
SJC Revolving Loan Fund Boosted

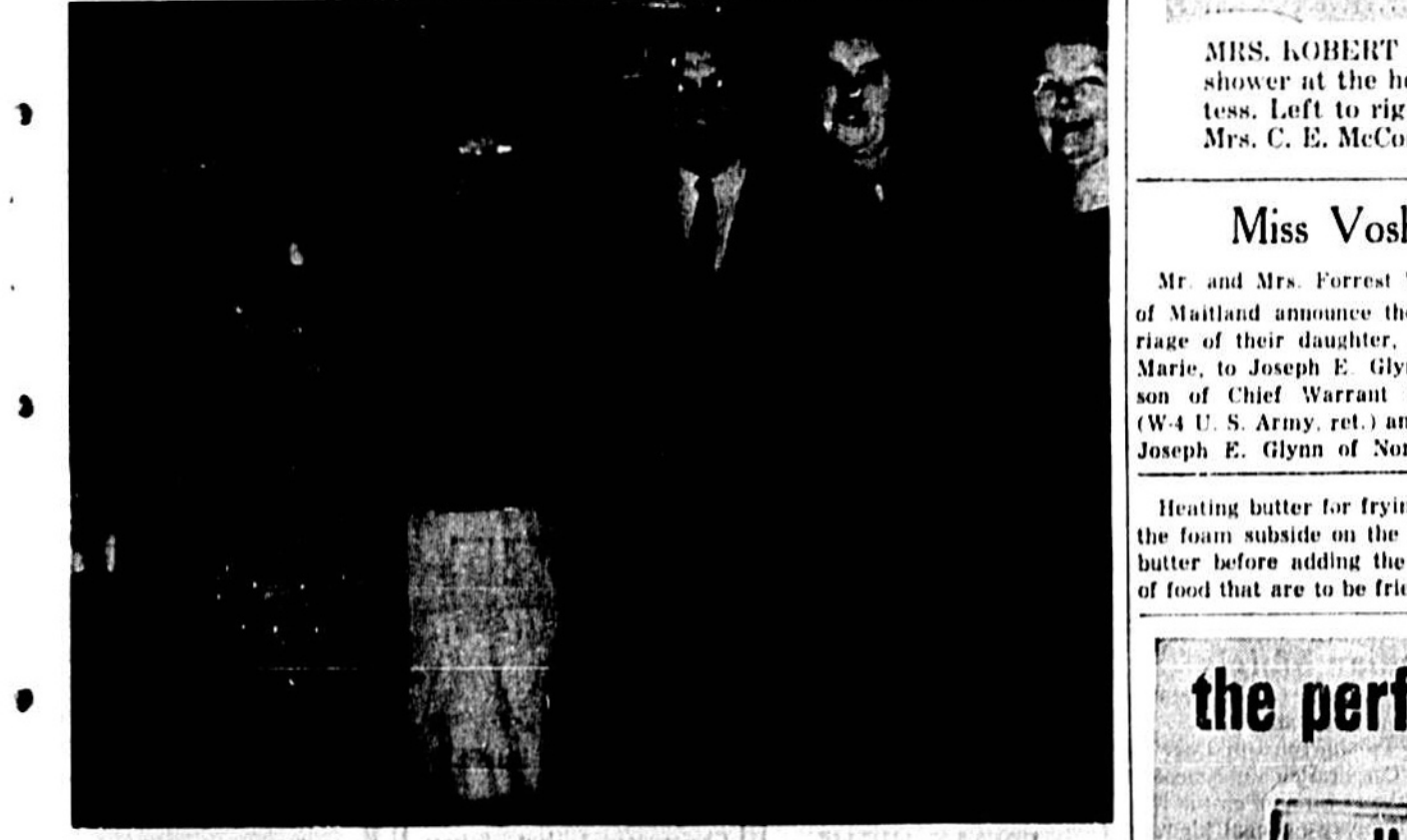
