Because he spit on the floor of the mess hall and re-fused to clean it up, Private John Habinyak has been dis-charged from the United States Army and sentenced to ten years in the penitentiary. To civilians who do not appreciate the importance of obeying orders and the necessity of military discipline, this seems like a pretty harsh sentence, and quick to take advantage of the public's reaction, a number of congressmen have called for an investigation.

A digest of the court martial conducted at Fort Bragg shows that unusual consideration was shown Private Habinyak by his immediate superiors who warned him of the seriousness of disobeying orders and gave him every opportunity to mend his ways. It was a mess sergeant who first had difficulty with this selectes from the Pennsylvania coal mines, but all of his officers up to his regimental commander had their turn at him.

Habinyak spit on the floor of the mess hall shortly after he arrived in camp and the mess sergeant told him to clean it up. What is the mess sergeant supposed to do, sit around and let all the men in the company spit on the floor until their eating quarters become a veritable cess pool of filth and disease? Or is he supposed to run around after each man and clean it up himself? When Habinyak refused to clean it up, the sergeant reported the man to his lieutenant. his lieutenant.
