



BOSTON (AP) - Recent racial violence in Boston could have created the climate for a bombing at the Suffolk County Courthouse in which 22 persons were injured, Gov. Michael Dukakis says.

"At this time - and I stress at this time - there is no evidence linking that bombing with the racial incidents which have occurred in the city during the past month," the governor said in a televised address Thursday night. "But there is no question that the violence that has plagued this city has created a climate of hatred and irrationality which could give rise to senseless acts such

as this morning's " nbing." The governor accounted creation of a special police unit made up of city, county, state and federal officers to investigate crimes of violence. He also said such cases would be taken directly to grand juries, bypassing the

Coffee Prices May Rise

NEW YORK (AP) - Consumers soon may be paying \$2 and more for a pound of coffee as a result of new increases at the wholesale level. The boost results from expectations of a coffee shortage caused by last summer's

Les Hurt of the U.S. Department of Agriculture said wholesale prices for coffee are now running at \$2.09 for a one-pound can. Read prices, he said, "are changing so fast that it's hard to keep up with them." But Hurt noted that the "retail (price) very often runs

below the wholesale level" because stores use coffee as a "loss leader" to entice customers. The difference is usually only a few cents.



Wage Trend Is Alarming

spared a lengthy strike in the trucking industry that the cost of avoiding it tended to be consigned to the fine print. Labor Secretary W. J. Usery Jr. hailed the settlement as a compromise, which it was, but its economic impact is no less worrisome Economists are estimating that the package won by the Teamsters Union - Mainly increases in wage rates and fringe benefits and a stronger cost

of-living adjustment clause — will add about 30 per

cent during the next three years to labor costs in

one of our basic transportation industries. Since the productivity of individual workers covered by Teamsters contracts is expected to increase by no more than 3 per cent a year, the settlement is obviously open to attack as "inflationary." To the extent that higher labor costs are not covered by increased output by each worker, prices must be increased. In fact, trucking companies already have filed applications with regulatory agencies for general freight-rate increases to cover the impact of the Teamsters

The trucking settlement may emerge as a pattern for other collective bargaining confrontations coming up later this year. On the plus side, the avoidance of a crippling strike that would have set back economic recovery is a welcome precedent, as Mr. Usery pointed out. The other side of the coin is not so satisfying, however.

Labor contracts based on a presumption of inflation or on the principle that a certain amount of inflationary effect is acceptable contain a hidden sting — if not for the workers covered by them then for the population as a whole. They lock the workers into an often cruel game in which the prophecy of inflation is self-fulfilling and keeps charging the value of the chips. The worker can lose the sense of economic progress, social achievement and security that once served as a measureable reward for hard work.

The report from the Labor Department that it costs \$1,200 a year more today for a family of four to maintain a living standard that could have been provided on a \$14,300 income a year ago only confirms what most middle-class Americans already know. Sociologists are reporting that many breadwinners feel they are being "double-crossed" as rising prices and taxes rob their economic gains of any tangible significance.

There was a time when a wage increase gained at the bargaining table could be hailed by union officials as a step forward for the working man. As higher freight rates seep through the economy, and as other wage settlements inspired by the trucking industry model have a similar effect on living costs, we fail to see how anyone can be highly satisfied with the direction 1976 labor negotiations are going. If the Teamsters are leading the way, are they simply starting Labor on another race around on eval track chasing the rabbit of in-

with small nations are stronger when we do not seek to impose our will on them. Then both sides can see more clearly where mutual self-interest lies.

There are some important unanswered questions concerning the Central Florida Drug Enforcement Administration task force that Sheriff John Polk is attempting to have underwritten by the

For starters I'd ask why the Orange County Sheriff's Department, the Brevard County Sheriff's Department and the Orlando Police Department have withdrawn support from the federal task

Also, I'd like to know if it wouldn't be possible to wait until U.S. Atty. Gen. Edward H. Levi responds to a request for an investigation into task force activities before Seminole County jumps in to fill the vacuum left when other law enforcement agencies pulled out.

In a letter to Levi, Orlando Police Chief James W. York strongly hinted that federal agents working for the task force have violated the civil rights of private citizens, and others.

"The civil rights set forth in the United States Constitution apply to all citizens, be they bank presidents, police officers, cocktail waitresses or alleged narcotics dealers," York's letter to Levi

In his letter York recounts allegations of "brutality" by federal agents, York said that on Dec. 22, 1975 four federal agents "entered the apartment of two alleged drug dealers, used a knife and guns to threaten a suspect with death if he did not return \$3,900 supposedly taken from a DEA agent during a drug buy."

The next month, according to York, Seminole County Sheriff's deputies were eyewitnesses to an incident in which an "Orlando man was handcuffed and struck several times by a federal agent." Also there are reports of an episode involving former Task Force Chief John Lepore and two other federal agents and their conduct while in at-

tendance at an Orlando night spot. Lepore and the agents, according to a Rosie O'Grady's waitress, posed as "Mafia" gangsters and became rowdy, refusing once to pay their tab Orlando police were called in, and the incident culminated with the arrest of Lepore and both

All three face trial on various misdemeanor charges in Orlando Municipal Court on May 18. That incident caused such a stir that Newsweek magazine became interested and instructed its Orlando correspondent to cover the Lepore trial. Nine of the 12 police agencies have indicated they want the task force to continue operations. And Polk is hoping to persuade commissioners on Monday to act as the subgrantee for the task force,

If the commission gives the sheriff the go ahead, one must wonder if the base of operations will shift from Orange to Seminole? Polk says he is unsure at this time if such a transfer would take place. Though Polk declines to comment on Lepore, the sheriff says of the task force: "I think the good is

The good probably is there, but I think Seminole County should get some answers before assuming the responsibility for a federal drug-fighting force that has already been rejected by three law enforcement agencies.

I've never met a doctor who claimed to heal anyone. I can't heal anyone. God alone can heal. He wants you to be healthy and happy and prosperous (III John2). He wants you to trust Him to heal you His way, whether through medicine, surgery, therapy, or prayer. Therefore, I think you should follow your doctor's advice and treatment, pray and ask others to pray, and follow the rules of good health and Christian living.

Sometimes healing takes place immediately, but more often it is gradual. I think a gradual healing often results in a deeper spiritual healing. As you continue to pray for your healing, your faith will grow deeper day by day. When you get close to God. He shows you He is real, He loves you and wants to help you.
