Gurney, Aides Charged With Influence Plan

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) -Sen. Edward Gurney, R-Fla., and two aides devised a plan to reap personal benefits by persuading 19 persons to invest \$20,000 each in a St. Augustine area land transaction, says television station WJXT in Jacksonville.

WJXT quoted unnamed sources in a Monday night broadcast that Gurney and aides Jim Groot and Larry Williams developed "an influence peddling plan" early in 1973.

The plan was quickly dropped, the station said, when the Watergate scandal broke and Gurney "found himself thrust into the ahla sollight on the Senate Wat regate Committee." Gurney as unavailable for omment on the report.

WJXT said a corporation -Oxnard, Inc. - formed by Gurney and the two aides was a general partner with three Jacksonville developers in a proposed \$5 million condominium project on Anastasia Island, about six miles south of St. Augustine.

The station said the plan enrisioned soliciting the \$380,000 from the 19 contributors who would be given limited partner-

"In exchange for selling the limited partnerships, Gurney and his aides would become general partners with no monetary obligation," the station

The Federal Energy Office announced Monday it was permitting retailers to raise their prices by a penny per gallon and wholesalers by a half-cent in January to "offset increased nonproduct overhead."

A week ago, the office approved similar increases totaling 2.3 cents a gallon, phased over several weeks, to compensate for higher crude oil

The office coupled its price boost with a vow by President Nixon that the administration would work vigorously to "find out if price gouging, improper allocations or hoarding is taking place and see that the penalties are strongly enforced.'

During a telephone conference with energy chief William E. Simon, Nixon also said he was pleased "at the responsible way the American people are complying with conservation requests," a spokesman said.

In a statement read to reporters by an associate, Simon said Monday's actions were aimed at easing wine of the financial hurt suffered by retailers.

"Price controls have required them to absorb rising operating costs, and allocation rules have reduced the quantity of products available for sale," the statement added.

The latest price increases are in addition to once-a-month boosts also permitted oil companies as compesation for increased product costs, if justified in advance.



Sanford city clerk Henry reports said the van hit the Tamm's office sold more pet passenger car while it was at a licenses Monday than were sold during the previous year as Local highway patrol officials citizens prepared to comply with a new leash and licensing law that takes effect today.

"We sold 78 dog and cat licenses by 4 p.m. Monday," Tamm said. "During the past year only 42 licenses were issued."

Previously only dogs had to

Railroad Pay Boost

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Employes of the Penn Central Railroad are in line today for a four per cent pay boost as requested by the line's trustees and approved by a court.

The \$37 million increase affects members of 13 unions. The unions and the Penn Central had previously reached an agreement on the hikes, but the trustees needed court permission before they could be implemented. The trustees petitioned U.S. District Court on Dec. 21 for

authority to comply with the agreements Judge John P. Fullam set a Jan, 11 hearing on the matter, but the trustees were authorized to make the pay increase effective Jan. 1, 1974.

Steel Price Hike

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Bethlehem Steel Corp. has increased prices on some of its products because of the higher cost of scrap steel, says a company spokesman. A scrap surcharge, effective with Jan. 1 shipments, will be \$11.50 per ton for reinforcing bars shipped from eastern plants, \$14 per ton for reinforcing bars shipped from the west coast, and 10 per cent hikes on most other west coast products, it was disclosed Menday.

PENDLETON, Ind. (AP) - Some "contraband homemade brew" made of oranges, other fruit mash, and some unidentified "weird stuff" was the catalyst for an impromptu New Year's Eve celebration by inmates at the Indiana State Reformatory.

An undetermined number of inmates in one cellblock became a little rowdy, officials said, after secretly downing some of the concoction.

The celebration lasted about two hours and "got out of hand" after inmates grabbed an officers' keys to their cellblocks and set a small fire in the cellhouse office officials said. Damage was reported as "quite minor." Order was restored by early evening and regular meals were served at the dinner hour, officials said.

Gas Supplies Okay, Price Hike Due

The new year meant fresh gasoline supplies today for many of the nation's motorists, but government officials say stiff price hikes may be right around the corner.

"The situation should improve considerably today and Thursday" said Anthony Ippolito, an Automobile Club of New York official. Gas allocations are delivered at the beginning of each month in most cases, and he said many

Charles Binsted, of the Washington-based National Congress of Petroleum Retailers, said he expected most stations to reopen around the nation today because they "have gotten their January allocations or will shortly."

Oil companies were given the go-ahead Monday to hike gasoline prices 1.5 cents a gallon. Federal Energy Office officials said Tuesday

Most gas station operators took New Year's Day off, even though some had gasoline.

"We asked them to close early this week to conserve fuel for the holidays," said Dan Usner, a New Orleans, La., operator and president of the state Service Station Association. "The steps we took to conserve apparently helped out." Even though stations had more gas today, he
