Death at 15 triggers difficult questions

SANFORD - Critical questions surround the events that led to the death of a 15-year-old Sanford boy buried a week ago by his family.

Why did Brandon Ealy die at such a young age? What does his family have to say about his death? Who is to blame? What will stop the cycle of crime in Sanford?

The questions have no easy answers. Without searching for solutions, however, it is likely that more young people

will meet a similar end. This in a small city booming with

potential, but some neighborhoods wallow in urban problems that cannot be ignored. Residents on both ends of the problem have complained about police and about the courts.

Earl Williams has helped raise Brandon with the boy's biological mother, Yolanda Canada. Williams spoke with The Herald recently about Brandon's life in hopes that some solutions might be found.

"I would talk with him each and every day," Williams said. He said he warned Brandon about the police tar-

geting him and about his choice of friends.

"I said, 'You need to change your tune, change your friends," Williams recalled. "I told him to slow it down and don't get with these thugs."

The thrill of breaking the law drove Brandon down the wrong path, Williams said. In 2002, his actions led to arrests and to a new school for troubled vouth.

He was arrested for grand theft auto in May 2002. In August of the same year, Brandon was arrested for aggra-

multi-purpose room for meetings, classes, workshops and events including after-dark receptions and parties.

"Gallery on First is designed to invite the public inside the artistic process through shows; events, educa-

tion and conversations with working artists, " Director Jeanine Taylor said.

Sporting a yellow "hard hat," Taylor was busy explaining the gallery concept to artists and visitors who snowed up during the reception that took place from 2 to 5 p.m.

Taylor will serve as full-time director and will provide the studio artists with concierge services, promotional and marketing support, art sales and gallery tours. An accomplished folk artist, Taylor will also be in residence displaying and working at her contemporary folk art from Florida and the Deep South.

Howard and Robin Marks, owners of the renovated historical building, envision Gallery on First to be "an eclectic environment, where passion for art is shared with a spirit of southern hospitality befitting our Historic Downtown Sanford location."

These schools include Warrington Middle School in Pensacola: Howard Middle School in Orlando; South Plantation High School in Plantation; Goldsboro Elementary Magnet School in Sanford; and Marcelino Canino Canino Middle School in Dorado, Puerto Rico.

"We look forward to working with the new schools and continuing our relationship with our existing Explorer Schools," said KSC Education Director Gregg Buckingham. "Our focal path this year will be to activate our Digital Learning Network so we can communicate electronically with all 16 of our NASA Explorer Schools."

The program debuted June 30, 2003. It sends science and mathematics teachers "back to school" at NASA Centers during the summer to acquire new teaching resources and technology tools using NASA's unique content, experts and other resources. The goal is to make learning science, mathematics and technology more appealing to students. "NASA will need a robust work force to

carry out the Vision for Space Exploration. The Explorer School Program looks to fulfill the vision by inspiring the next generation of explorers," said NASA Chief Education Officer Dr. Adena Williams Loston. "The program provides the opportunity to explore, discover and understand through educational activities. It includes fun, challenging adventures tailored to promote learning and studying science, mathematics, engineering and technology." The NASA Explorer School Program is one of four major Agency educational initiatives. Since its inauguration in 2003, the NES Program has established three-year partnerships annually with 50 schools. The partnerships include students, teachers and education administrators serving grades four through nine, from diverse communities across the country. Schools in the program are eligible to receive grants of up to \$17,500 over the three-year period to support student engagement in science and mathematics. Eighty-seven percent of all NASA Explorer Schools are in high-poverty areas, and 76 percent represent predominantly minority resident communities. Ninety-eight percent of the 2005 class is in high-poverty areas, and 82 percent is in predominantly minority resident communities; 19 are in Hispanic communities.





valed battery.

The last three years of school were spent at the Rosenwald Center in Altamonte Springs.

Rosenwald serves severely emotionally disabled students from eighth grade to age 22. The goal is to get the students on a path back to a regular classroom. Brandon attended for three years.

Williams said Brandon performed well academically. A school district official said he was a likeable student. He described Brandon as creative and as helpful to other students, but no one at the school or at the district level would discuss why Brandon remained at Rosenwald or what his progress might have been. They cited confidentiality.

When asked about what could lead a 15-year-old into criminal activities that ended up killing him, Tom McDowell of Seminole County Public Schools replied: "Sometimes they don't think through their decisions."

Williams would agree that Brandon made some bad choices. He said the young man was well mannered at home, but he was susceptible to peer pressure.

"If you tell him he couldn't do something, he's gonna do it," Williams said. Still he didn't deserve to die like he did, he added.

Williams described Brandon's actions as Tom Sawyer-like. Those led to another arrest in December 2004, this time for burglary and petty larceny.

His next and last run in with the law came earlier this month.

Brandon and three others stole an SUV from an Altamonte Springs hotel on State Road 436.

According to an Altamonte Springs police report, the boys drove down Central Parkway and turned onto Palm Springs Drive. Because of the SUV's speed and reckless driving, the Altamonte Springs police backed off, the report said. again on 436. Sheriff deputies placed stop sticks in front of a mall, but the SUV drove around them and later reached speeds near 100 mph on Interstate 4, according to the notes.

At that point, the Sheriff's dispatch notes say all the deputies broke off the chase. The vehicle was still speeding when it reached 46A in Sanford.

According to Sanford police reports, the SUV sped toward a red light at Ridgewood Avenue. A car started onto 46A from Ridgewood at the same time and the SUV steered left, then right, but lost control and flipped at least three times.

All four occupants were ejected. Brandon was taken to the hospital. The accident is still under investigation by the Sanford Police Department. Cleo Cohen, police spokeswoman, said two of the passengers told officers that Brandon was driving the car.

Williams has his own sources, however. They say Brandon was not driving the car. He has also been told that law enforcement was still chasing the SUV when it rolled over. One of those witnesses said she lives near the accident and was among the first people to arrive after the crash. She did not see the accident occur.

While she was watching the scene, some girls came up and said one of the boys, who escaped for a time, told his sister that the SUV was bumped by a police truck.

The witness does not know who these girls were or who the sister is. Williams believes there is more to the story.

He and Canada were with Brandon at the hospital when he died four days later on May 14. Williams has vowed to find out the truth.

"I just want to see justice happen," he said. He feels the boys were targeted. He has felt targeted himself in the past, he admitted.

Perhaps the most disturbing part of this story, Williams said, is that other young people are

So the search for answers continues. Williams suggests that parents sit down and somehow talk with these young people.

He also said the lack of religion in the lives of young people has hurt. There is not prayer in school, he said, and the young men have no moral background to fall back on.

Williams said the churches are failing these young people. When he was younger, they would help these children and if they had leadership skills, they would put it toward positive uses. Today, he said pastors, for the most part, live outside the community and are not visible.

Drugs take hold of many of these young lives, Williams explained, adding that crack is the most evil invention man has ever created.

For him the answer is God, he said. "God don't make any mis-

takes," Williams said. "I can't question why this happened." He said more community

answer. Police know the thugs, but they don't know the citizens, he said.

People on the other end, those who have had cars stolen, are not happy with police either.

Bill Hicks of Bill Hicks Auto Sales said his business has been broken into four times. A computer was stolen and the suspects got away in a car stolen from the lot.

He put bars on all the windows except the bathroom, Hick said. So someone broke in through the bathroom window. He assumes they were young children because very few adults could fit through that window.

"So the point I'm trying to make is that the police say they're doing things, but they're not doing anything," Hicks said. "You can sit out here at night and there's nobody here, there's nobody patrolling. We need to do something about it."

On that point, Williams and Hicks agree.

don't know which judge lets these guys out ... but whoever did it, I think is partially responsible for letting these guys out and them getting hurt. I mean he's not responsible because they're idiots, but he [the judge] should have enough sense to keep them in jail for a while."

The police counter that they are arresting suspects and the courts are not helping either by letting the young people off with probation or not getting them further help to break the cycle.

If an area of the city has more calls in a time period, the police will patrol that location more heavily. But when other emergency calls occur, the patrolling cannot be as regular as driving by every 15 minutes, said Cohen, Sanford police spokeswoman.

"We still support [the criminals] being held longer than what they are being held," Cohen said. "Generally, they are repeat offenders."

Hicks is happy with the changes Sanford has made on

the RiverWalk, with the Historic Downtown area and with First Street.

"But we're not going to keep people in this town ... if they're afraid for crime, their life," Hicks said.

"This place is a mess. We need a new police chief. We need someone who's going to do something about this. He (Chief Brian Tooley) took the job, he signed up to fix it. He ain't fixing it. Simple."

So while everyone searches for answers, a family buries a 15-year-old son and brother. Williams misses seeing Brandon in the mornings. The young man would help Williams with chores.


"He was fun-loving," Williams said, looking at a picture of the 15-year-old. "He never took a bad picture. He had dreamy eyes. Eyes that light up a room."

Now the question is whether Brandon's death will remain a simple tragedy or will it lead to answers that will light up a city.

Are you prepared?

Wednesday, June 1st, (as if you didn't know) is the start of the Atlantic Hurricane Season. It will last until November 30th. This is merely the "official" time period. Hurricanes can arrive earlier or later than that. After all, hurricanes don't care about calendars.

Except for folks who have moved into the area since last year, we should all know the drill – how to prepare – what to do – and what NOT to do. One can look almost everywhere and find listings of recommendations in preparation of a hurricane. I suggest, if you are a newcomer, talk to your neighbors and find out what they did to avoid damage – or what they didn't do which resulted in the loss of a roof, trees, or other items.

You must admit, we were very complacent about last year's hurri-

cane season. We hadn't had one hit the Sanford area in many years. Those of us who went through hurricanes Donna and Dora years ago, had practically forgotten how rough they can be and the damage they can do. No one expected we would see three major 'canes hit us in just a few short weeks. Looking ahead, no one expects we will see a repeat of that during this year's hurricane season - but it's not impossible.

Now - looking at what we possibly didn't learn during last year's preparation - did we purchase enough plywood to seal our windows or did we find ourselves going to a lumber yard at the last minute, only to find they were out of stock or doubind in price.

Did we assume our homes and property were fully covered with insurance? Or did we find out, when we applied for compensation, that certain things are NOT covered? And what about people who live near the water. Flood insurance is often a separate

matter. Int't it time we checked up on these things? Did we prepare for the hurricane by purchasing a great deal of food to hold us over during the storm? What happened when the power on the refrigerator want out for several days? Costly, wasn't it? Then there were canned goods which didn't require refrigeration. However, some folks have only an electric can-opener. Whoopal Then too, much of the food you may have purchased requires cooking. Electric ranges, ovens and microwaves don't work when the power is out. (I didn't need to tell you that, but it was intended as words of caution).

One more thing on what NOT to do. This past year, we heard of a number of people who held hurricane parties. Friends and neighbors gathered at a home during the hurricane and sat around drinking and having fun, but becoming less capable of handling problems should they arise. There was one hurricane party held last year with about 15 people in attendance. When the roof collapsed, many were severely injured. That certainly doesn't sound like a fun party to me.

I have some suggestions: Be certain to have a camera on hand. If there is damage anywhere on your property or to your home, take pictures. You may need them if you end up applying for FEMA support or with your insurance. Another thing, whether you plan to stay at home during a hurricane, go to a shelter, or take off to someplace up north, away from the storm, let others know about where you might be. If you have a cell phone – be certain they have your number. And remember to take important phone numbers with you if you leave home, especially if you are forgetful.

We had millions of dollars in damage done last year. Some folks are still in temporary facilities. Others still have those blue tarps on the roof of their home. Our local governments have conducted training to plan on what to do if a hurricane hits. Each of us should do the same. Let me add: these is a tax-free Hurricane Preparedness period in Florida from June 1st. through 12th, when you can buy many items method to prepare for the sameon, without paying a sales tax. Take

Another plane that Wells built was attached to a pole which he would take to Jacksonville Beach. There, he would set it up on the beach and sell rides to children.


George Wells was one of the earliest automobile mechanics in Sanford. He was also a machinist for Chase and Company and designed and built the first Mule Train for them.

Stetson's Corner For this is an enchanted land...

Welcome to Stetson's Corner, where weekly we hope to share a bit of what is good about the Village of Geneva. This column is dedicated to a man who did the same - Deputy Sheriff Gene "Stetson" Gregory, who was killed in the line of duty July 8, 1998 in the place he was sworn to protect, but which could not protect him. Geneva will never be the same because of Deputy Gregory...it will be better.

I am no good at 'goodbyes'. I really prefer to, when faced with the finality of

a situation, say "see you later" and pretend like that will really happen. And faced with the finality of the fact that this will be the last 'Stetson's Corner' that I ever put down on paper, I am in no better shape. I have been pondering what to write for three weeks.

As I mulled over the words to carefully choose for this bittersweet occasion, I kept thinking about the book Cross Creek, written by Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings (The Yearling, Golden

Apples) Rawlings lived in rural upper-Florida in the early 1900's and was inspired to write about her surroundings in such a way as to make me wish I was her, then.

And so it was that when I came to this place. called Geneva, I felt as if I were.

It was here that I began to write again after years of helping my growing family with their words instead. It was here that 'Stetson's Corner' was born - even if it is only a bit of "fluff" as one friend teasingly points out. And it was here that my life came full circle ... child, writer, wife, mother, writer, child

Living here among the wild things touches something young and creative in me and takes me to a place to tap into when life leaves me dry. I'mnot so sure that there is a place in Indiana such as can make that happen.

But it is to Indiana that I will journey in a few. weeks, leaving behind a part of myself that I can-

Rawlings left behind some words I'd like to the always. The heavy forest thins into occasional great share, however, as my way of paying tribute to this place, its people, and what I will take with me when I go ...

"When I came to the Creek, and knew the old grove and farmhouse at once as home, there was some terror, such as one feels in the first recognition of a human love, for the joining of person to place, as of person to person, is a commitment to shaded sorrow, even as to shaded joy."

"... I think that the shabbiness of the Creek is a part of its endearing quality. I for one might admire, but never truly love, an affluent perfection. ... The Creek shabbiness was never elegant and never will be. It is merely comfortable and weatherbeaten, meeting Time halfway. I am sometimes tempted to put up a new fence across the house yard. I have always thought that a white picket fence must be a great comfort to a householder. I think of the pride I should take in seeing white paint gleaming from around the bend in the road. Then Snow the grove man becomes quietly tired of waiting for me to do something, and comes driving the farm truck into the yard over the cattle-gap with a load of fresh fatwood pine posts from the hammock. He asks You aim just to use the old gate, don't you?' I aim to use the old gate, and say so, and Snow goes ahead and replaces the rotten and sagging posts with new ones. He tightens the fence wire, Hog and cattle 4-inch mesh, and the effect is trim and eminently suitable. I tell myself that a white picket fence would interfere with the feeling one has inside the house of being a part of the grove, that the new fence would mean tearing out the coral honeysuckle vines that cling passionately to the old wire But the real objection is that an elegant fence would bring to the Creek a wanton orderliness that is out of place.

When I bought the Florida orange grove with my inheritance that represented my share of the Maryland farm, my father's sister Madeline wrote me in lament You have in you, she said, that fatal drop of Pearce blood, clamoring for change and adventure, and above all, for a farm

I do not understand how anyone can live without some small place of enchantment to turn to. In the lakeside hammock there is a constant stirring in the tree-tops, as though on the stillest days the breathing of

trees, live oaks and palms and pines."


... The jungle hammock breathed. Life went through the moss-hung forest, the swamp, the cypresses, through the wild sow and her young, through me, in its continuous chain. We were all one in the silent pulsing. This was the thing that was important, the cycle of life, with birth and death merging one into the other in an imperceptible twilight and an insubstantial dawn."

... Who owns Cross Creek? The red-birds, I think, more than I, for they will have their nests even in the face of delinquent mortgages. And after I am dead, who am childless, the human ownership of grove and field and hammock is hypothetical. But a long line of redbirds and whippoorwills and blue-jays and ground doves will descend from the present owners of nests in orange trees, and their claim will be less subject to dispute than that of any human heirs. Houses are individual and can be owned, like nests, and fought for. But what of the land? It seems to me that the earth may be borrowed but not bought. It may be used, but not owned. It gives itself in response to love and tending, offers its seasonal flowering and fruiting. But we are tenants and not possessors, lovers and not masters. Cross Creek belongs to the wind and the rain, to the sun and the seasons, to the cosmic secrecy of seed, and beyond all, to time."

I wonder what she thinks of the mysterious business that is my writing. Once in the midst of creative difficulties, I said facetiously, 'Martha, I'm in trouble. I'll do the washing if you'll write this chapter for me. Sugar, she said gravely, God knows I'd do it if I could 'Sugar,' she said, 'they ain't nobody at Cross Creek can do that".

But there is someone in Geneva who can. Next week you will hear from Karen M. Phillips, who loves this rural setting as much as I, and who will make this column hers. And I will see you later ... ·Darla



During the confusion of the phone call, the girl appeared to be crying, Sanford Police Department Spokeswoman Cleo Cohen said.

The 9-1-1 operator asked the girl if the intruders were still in the house, and the girl told the operator, yes they are still in the house and they are wearing black masks.

"They don't know I'm calling," the girl said.

Three minutes after the phone call was made, units responded to 1808 Washington Ave., because there was also no listing for an 1808 Washington Court.

Thirty-seven officers were dispatched including patrol units, emergency service units, the crisis negotiation team, criminal investigation team, command personnel, a public information officer, and even the Seminole County Sheriff's Office helicopter responded.

The officers created a perimeter around the house and waited. When officers finally made contact with the owner of the home, who was not in the house, they found out that no one should be inside, not even a little girl.

At that time, officers had the 9-1-1 call from the cell phone traced and found a name and address for the owners of the cell phone. When they knocked on the door, which was in a nearby location, the parents of one of the little girl's answered.

The parents told officers that their little girl had been playing down the street with

two other girls around the same age. The girls were in the neighborhood walking when one of the girls placed the call. All three were questioned separately and confirmed that one girl had made the call and concocted the whole thing up.

Cohen said that because they arrived to the location within three minutes of the 9-1-1 call they had to assume the invaders were still in the house.

"We were preparing for a possible violent situation," Cohen said. "If the call had been legitimate - suspects likely to still be in the house." Officers did not begin to clear out from the home until 6 p.m. that evening.

The little girl's prank will not go without punishment though. The police department is charging her with a misdemeanor and sending a warrant to the State Attorney's office. They will also be requesting restitution from the girl to the tune of close to \$2,600, Cohen said. That was the amount it cost taxpayers on Wednesday.

"It ties up a lot of resources at the taxpayers' expense," Cohen said.

She also said that citizens need to realize that they will pursue and prosecute prank 9-1-1 calls.

'We want kids or adults to report crimes, but people who abuse the system will be prosecuted," Cohen said.

This comes just a few days after two boys in Winter Park filed a false police report to

cover-up breaking a window.

They told the father, who in turn told Sheriff deputies, that the boys were in the front yard playing soccer. A white male, supposedly, walked up to one of the boys, and placed his hand around his face like he was covering his mouth, the incident report said.

The boy said that he managed to kick the man in his groin area and the man hunched over and began walking away quickly.

The man was described as a white male, around 30years-old, about 5-feet, 8inches tall and 180 pounds. The boys said he was wearing grey shorts and a dark shirt with dark hair and possibly a goatee. He was also wearing glasses and a blue hat, they said.

An area patrol turned up negative results, according to the incident report. After further questioning a few days later with the boys, investigators learned that the attempted abduction report was made-up.

In this case, the boys were not charged, but public information officer Steve Olson made a statement in a press release to say: "They were, however, admonished that making things up such as this could be harmful, cause fear, and is wasteful of resources."

Both the Seminole County Sheriff's Office and the Sanford Police Department want to encourage people to report crimes and incidents that have a factual basis.



Historical Society hears WWII talk

"A Tribute to Florida Heroes of World War II" was the topic of the program given by Thomas Tart at the Seminole County Historical Society meeting on April 26.

Tart is a graduate of the University of Florida School of Law and is general counsel for the Orlando Utilities Commission. He has been a Florida historian for over 30 years.

Dressed in a World War II Army uniform, Tart began his talk with background on the beginning of the war and Adolph Hitler. During the 1930's, Hitler had stated that he was going to control Europe and Great Briton, but no one but Winston Churchill believed him. He stood alone to uphold democracy and convinced the United States to provide support.

The U.S. was also unprepared on December 7th, 1941. A pilot had flown over Formosa and seen Japanese planes being loaded with bombs. When General McArthur was notified, he nixed the idea of bombing them.

After the bombing of Pearl Harbor, the United States declared war on Japan and two days later, Germany declared war on us.

The majority of the fleet was lost at Pearl Harbor, but luckily a few carriers were out at sea.

The first hero of the war, Captain Colin Kelly, was from Monticello, Florida. He flew the first American bombing mission and dropped three bombs on the Japanese fleet, destroying two ships. His plane blew up however, and he was killed.

Lt. Col. Jammy Doolittle led the Army Air Force in the first bombing raid against Japan, the pilots had been trained in Honda. On-April 16, 1942, they raided five way mission. Only 13 crewmembers made it to safety.

The pilots taking part in the Battle of Midway were trained in Sanford. This was a pivotal win, as the island was needed for refueling planes.

Two of the three divisions landing on Omaha and Utah Beaches during D-Day, June 6, 1944, had been trained in Florida.

James VanFleet from Bartow was the first colonel to land on Utah Beach. General George Patton called him one of the best generals he ever had.

General Daniel "Chappy" Jones, the first African-American general to receive four stars, had trained in Tallahassee. He was a member of the Tuskegee Airmen.

There were 240,000 Florida men who served in World War II, and 18,000 British pilots trained in Florida.

The battle of Iwo Jima took place in February, 1945. This was one of the bloodiest battles of the war. Sgt. Ernest "Boots" Thomas of Monticello was one of those who raised the flag on Mount Suribachi. Unfortunately, he was killed six days later.

Brig. Gen. Paul Tibbets attended the University of Florida and trained to fly at the Gainesville field. He piloted the Enola Gay (named after his mother), which dropped the single atomic bomb over Hiroshima. That and the bomb over Nagasaki effectively ended the war. VJ Day was celebrated on Aug. 15, 1945. Germany had already sumendered the previous June.

Following tart's presentation, Col Tanin, Army Air Corps, told of some of his war experiences. He had graduated from flying whool in September, 1941, and, with only a few days of training, he was sent to the Fig Islands. He told of his three tours of duty in-

audience member, Douglas Stenstrom suggested that Col. Jack Bolt of Sanford, an ace in both World War II and Korea, be added to future presentations.

During the business meeting presided over by Alex Dickinson, it was announced that several ways and means projects were in the planning stage. One major project is the publishing of Seminole County items that had appeared in the Florida Times Union during the late 1800's. These will be printed in five books, arranged by towns. They will possibly be published in the fall.

Funds from these projects will be used toward another building to add to the Museum of Seminole County History complex. This building is projected to be twostories with large farm machines displayed on the first floor and a meeting room with kitchen on the second floor.

Karen Jacobs, Museum coordinator, reported on historic markers recently placed by the Historic Commission for Lady Liberty and Steamboats. She was enthusiastic about the acquisition of several audio wands in English, Spanish and German which patrons can us when touring the museum. They are already being well received. She also reported that several highschool students had been in to do nesearch.

The Museum of Seminole County History, located on Bush Blvd is now open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m., and Saturday from 9 a.m.

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




you:

1) Have your motor serviced once a year,

2) Change the water pump every year or at least every 2 years,

3) If your boat is going to sit for a long period to time, pull it out in the driveway and run it with the rabbit ears for 5-10 minutes,

4) Pull the prop once a month and grease the shaft, also check for fishing line (it can eat through the seals and damage the lower unit),

5) Check the lower unit lube by slightly opening the drain plug to make sure no water is inside,

6) change the plugs and have the carburetors adjusted, 7) grease all the fittings.

If you want to extend the life of your motor you really need to do these things. When I am on the water I like to make sure I have done everything I can to avoid problems.

Motors that sit for long periods of time develop more problems than motors which are used on a regular basis. Varnish can build up in the gas tank. If you have an oil injected motor and drain the gas the oil is still there.

If you use your boat in saltwater it is important to wash it down after each trip. The car

wash works great and for \$4 you can put the boat away when you get home. Don't forget to flush the motor with freshwater. Take care of your equipment and it will take care of you.

FISHING REPORT

The trout bite continues to be solid as the fish are in the spawning season. It is really going to be going off the next couple of weeks. We are coming off a full moon and the fish should be real hungry.

Top water plugs early and Rip Tide 3 inch mullet on an 1/8 ounce Rip Tide Pro jig head. If it is real bright try a chartreuse bait. I really like jigs with a tail color of red, chartreuse or white. Soft jerk bits work well also. Try a Rip Tide Flats Chub in the early morning or throughout the day.

Big redfish continue to eat well. Some days are better than others. Live bait has been working well along with cut mullet. If you catch a lady fish, cut him into strips or chunks, that is redfish candy. Artificial baits that are hot are soft jerk baits and the Rip Tide Realistic Crab.

Some of the schools have been worked on a an everyday basis so it is important that you don't push the fish. Be patient

and you will be rewarded.

MODEST INCREASE IN MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND BOATING TRAFFIC

If the weather cooperates, the recreational boating season's traditional Memorial Day "kick-off" weekend will likely be busier than usual.

TowBoatU.S. and Vessel Assist fleets, part of BoatU.S. Towing Services, are expecting a 4% increase in requests over last year for on-the-water assistance for dead batteries, running out of fuel, groundings, and for other services this holiday weekend.

Another reason for towing assistance calls are inadvertent groundings due to shifting markers and shoals that may have moved over the winter.
