# My New York

**NEW YORK**—It had been some time since we had broken bread with Gwen Lux, the handsome dark-haired girl who is one of the nation's top sculptors, so when we finally caught up today looking her after a couple of years we discovered that, like all of us, she had problems.  
Miss Lux is the one-time Guggenheim fellow who is notable because (1) she once lived over a saloon in Second Avenue, and (2) she looks like one of the more exotically Harry Conover's models when she swaps her work smock for a dinner dress.  
It is doubtful if she would be permitted residence south of 14th street, since one of the requirements for being a woman artist in the Village is that your fingernails never be cleaned and you never are seen in public without your blue jeans.  
But Miss Lux' trouble fascinated us. It appears that a couple of years ago she moved over to West 44th into a street looking Bryant park, an unbelievably green patch of nature behind the New York Public Library—and now the panorama of the park keeps her from doing any work.  
When she lived in Second Avenue, Gwen's windows faced that whimsical street but if she took time out from working to look down at it all she saw were trucks, hammer joints and drunken newspapermen who were formerly in gin mill to gin mill. With the park, there is a difference.  
"Bryant park has its own little population," she told me today. "Some permanent, some transient. I've gotten to know virtually the whole bunch—from afar—since living here, and keeping my eye out for each one keeps me from working."  
There's the extraordinarily handsome cripple, for example, who virtually lived in the park last summer. He got around on crutches and was better looking than any movie star. He hasn't appeared this springtime, and I keep looking out my window for him and wondering where he's gone.  
Then there are the gray-haired man and woman and the younger man, evidently their son, who stroll elegantly and drunkenly through the park daily, the old man and the pale and slender gentleman, with the wide and frightened eyes of a fawn—and the pickups. The pickups are endless. Bryant park must be the hunting ground where the lonely ones come, the girls and the young men circling each other warily like dogs encountering each other in the street, until they breach the chain of etiquette and go off hand in hand.  
Thus, Miss Lux and her problems. Miss Lux, incidentally, is the artist who owns the radio because she considers it an intrusion on her privacy, and maintains a telephone reluctantly.  
The biggest intrusion on her privacy, however, is the life of the green little city within a city, outside her window. It gives her a wonderful excuse not to work. We are trying to find an apartment like it.

**IT WAS SOMEWHERE AROUND A YEAR AGO** that Mayor O'Dwyer banished the last of the trolleys from the streets of Manhattan, a gesture that must be ranked as the most worthwhile of his administration.  
However, it appears we haven't heard the last of trolleys. There has been organized a new airline, which last week began four daily scheduled flights between New York and Buffalo—under the name, "The Buffalo Trolley."  
"To convey the feeling of the late and beloved (ed. note—by whom?) trolley cars," executives of the line announced, "the Buffalo Trolley will carry card ads similar to the ones used on the one-popular street level vehicles."  
The creators of this piece of precocity any day are going after the honeymoon trade, since it appears that even in this advanced day the newlyweds still go to Niagara Falls, either for the baths or the eating of the shredded cereal, we forget which.  
We are dubious about the venture. They don't have any standing room for strapholders. How can you ride in a trolley if you don't stand, crowded between 45 other people, holding on to a strap? There isn't any other way, is there?

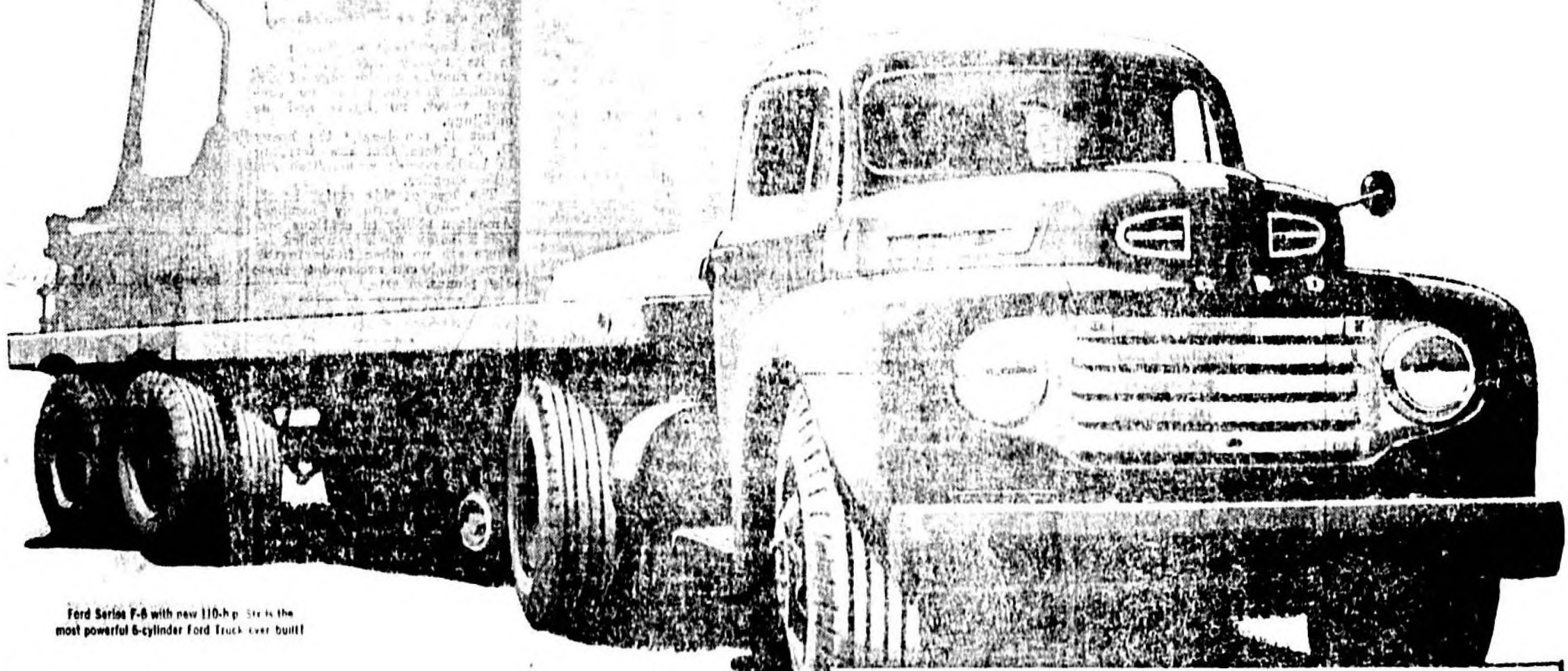

Military informants said the Han River apparently was crossed after two small advance bands of invaders had been wiped out by the South Korean defense. The Red armor apparently was farried across, as all bridges were reported destroyed.

His order came after Britain, Holland, Nationalist China, Australia and New Zealand pledged active support in the battle against the invaders. The pledges included air, sea and ground forces, the

not ordering sufficient goods far enough ahead to let the cutters turn out clothes in quantity. The fear of inventories they say, has lost many a sale in the shops. Now, they think, this restrictive policy has been relaxed.

The textile mills are happier about it, too. The garment makers have been ordering more from the mills, and textile business prospects are pretty good for months ahead.

Moreover, a lot of new ideas, new fabrics, new finishes have been produced recently to tempt the ladies into thinking their present apparel and house furnishings are obsolete.

One chemical company reports its sales of textile finishing chemicals are running 60 per cent ahead of last year. The entire industry of chemical finishes for textiles has grown by leaps and bounds since the war. New ideas pop out almost every day—new ways to make fabrics wrinkle proof or moth proof.

Substantial orders are being placed by retailers, the garment maker say much more substantial than a year ago.

The garment makers have complained for more than a year about what they call the too cautious attitude of store buyers in

Nations Security Council's request for support to the Republic of Korea in repelling the North Korean invaders and restoring peace in Korea, the President announced that he had authorized conduct of military operations on specific military targets in Northern Korea wherever militarily necessary, and had ordered a naval blockade of the entire Korean coast. General MacArthur has been authorized to use certain supporting ground units.

There was no immediate elaboration here as to what these "certain supporting ground units" might be.

Dispatches from Korea have made it plain, however, that the South Koreans are particularly in need of artillery, anti-tank weapons, and infantrymen.

MacArthur has in his Far East command an army strength of 120,000 men.

This includes four divisions.

They are the First Cavalry division—an infantry division despite its name; the seventh infantry division, the 24th infantry division and the 25th infantry division.

General J. Lawton Collins, the Army's Chief of Staff, said after a recent visit to the area that the Far Eastern troops are in a high state of readiness and training.

The U. S. ground troops are stationed in Japan, Okinawa and other islands of the Ryukyu Chain, and the Philippines.

Following the White House announcement, an Army spokesman said that all of the Army troops in the Far East command have been alerted. He said he did not know what units or what type of troops would move to Korea.

The Army also has an additional 8,000 men in Hawaii.

Mr. Truman's decisions presumably were taken on recommendations of General MacArthur. The Defense Department had disclosed that a report had been received from him covering his personal inspection of the Korean situation.
