## Suspicious fire probed

Door may have been pried before blaze at mental health center

SANFORD - Firenghters were called when witnesses saw names licking a vent at the rear o the second foor of the Seminole country
Health Center at about $10^{\circ}$ clock this morning. According to Batallion Chler Mike Hoening, the rear third of the bullding was engulfed in flame
by the tume firenghters by the time firefighters arrived moments later.
Though there was, according to Hoening Though there was, according to Hoening
"extensive" damage to the back of the building the damage in the remaining two-thirds of the bullding was limited to smoke and water damage.
Hoening sald he had been told that Christmas presents for needy clients had been stored in the presenis
bulding, but he could not confirm that this morning.
He added that fire inspectors were treating the incident as a susplcious one.
"Because of the time of day and the location of the frre we have to look at it as a suspelous fire." Hoening sald
