NEW YORK, Nov. 15.—"Watch the Chicago Cubs," comes the word from the boys who see all hear all and know nothing. "Watch the Cubs with Hornsby in there."

There's one thing you can always say for the boys. They are never any sillier than usual. With Hornsby playing second base and Joe McCarthy running the ball club, no one will have to tell baseball to watch the Cubs. It will be watching because it will be prompted by one of the most impelling of all emotions—human curiosity. No chemical laboratory ever attempted a more interesting experiment than will be sponsored in Chicago next Spring.

There is little of the "clubhouse lawyer" about Hornsby. His emotions are too honest to tolerate even a hint of surreptitious conning. He simply is impetuous, every to win. In fact, he is a ball player with only one possible liability. He prefers to do his thinking out loud.

Branch Rickey, Jack Hendricks and Jim Tierney have listened from left to right and some of his most candid thoughts without marked enthusiasm. The first two were managers of ball clubs on which Hornsby worked; the third is something of a one-man "kitchen cabinet." All three are agreed that there is one outstanding trouble with Hornsby, he isn't a deaf mute.

Will McCarthy overlook a few frank utterances from time to time? Undoubtedly. Joseph generally is credited with understanding a man of human understanding and an occasional expression of honest opinion about this and that is only part of the ball game, after all. But Joseph's family name is M. Carthy and he comes by it very honestly.

There's one thing you can bet on, no matter who you ask. The American association man told the writer recently. "Joe McCarthy will boss any ball club he is managing."

This man knew McCarthy through all of the latter's year in the association. But he doesn't know Hornsby or he wouldn't be thinking along the lines his remark called to mind. That's Hornsby, intolerant of carefree spirit, out of patience with mediocrity. He lives baseball; he breathes it. To those who don't share his enthusiasm, it becomes something of a fanatic, a pest.

Watch the Cubs? The next thing you know somebody will be telling us not to forget to breathe.

In meeting Clemson at Jacksonville Saturday in their fifth Southern Conference battle, the Gators encounter one of the outstanding defensive teams in the country. The Tigers in seven engagements have had their goal line crossed in only one game. Indications point to an attendance of 15,000 for the Jacksonville feature classic.

## JACK DEMPSEY IS SLATED TO FIGHT CHIEF CONTENDER

### Rickard Declares Contract To Be Signed In Month Of January

NEW YORK, Nov. 15.—Jack Dempsey will sign a contract in January to fight a leading world heavyweight next summer at a New York ball park, Les Rickard declared today.

"It will give me great pleasure to be at the Yankee Stadium on June 15, 1929," Pauline Franklin said today. "I may fight and I may not, depending on how I feel next year. That's a long time off, and I'm a naturally glib man," Jack Dempsey said.

Interest in the world heavyweight title reached its highest point today as a result of the above statements, and following a reference between the promoter and Dempsey, late yesterday and a dinner given by Pauline last night to metropolitan sports writers.

Dempsey, who attended the dinner, enabled the issue of his comeback. But Rickard, who has just returned from Florida, said he was convinced that he had persuaded the former champion to make an attempt to regain his lost laurels.

It was learned that Dempsey had stipulated that his opponent must be one of the following group: Uacudon, Jack Sharkey, Knute Hansen or Young Stradling. Dempsey also was quoted as saying that he must get a percentage of the receipts that will assure him half a million dollars for his effort.

While Rickard professed to be sure that the negotiations were as good as closed, Dempsey was as usual noncommittal.

"I'm not ready to make any statements right now," Dempsey said at the dinner. Then he announced that he had decided to attempt a comeback by adding, "I would never had any trouble in the past over terms and we won't have any this time."

In a speech at the dinner Dempsey referred to Pauline as "one of the greatest and greatest heavyweights in the game today."

The next speaker, the grinning, gold-toothed banker, the grinning gold-toothed banker, seized upon this opportunity to announce that he would fight the ex-champion on June 15, 1929, at the Yankee Stadium. He declined to amplify that statement.

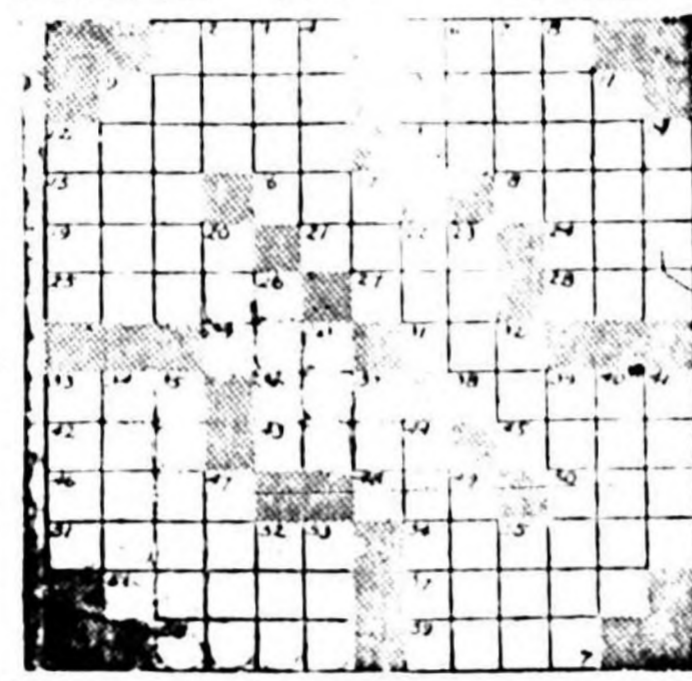
