13 Soviet Spies Expelled By Canada For Espionage

OTTAWA (UPI) — Canada has expelled 13 members of a Soviet spy ring it says attempted to infiltrate the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in the largest espionage operation uncovered in Canada in 32 years.

The government said Thursday the Soviets, using such classic spy techniques as passwords and information drops in parks, paid \$30,000 to a member of the Mounties for what they thought was top-secret information.

External Affairs Minister Don Jamieson ordered four Soviet officials to leave Canada within 48 hours. Seven others have until Feb. 23 to get out, and two diplomats, who had already left Canada, were barred from returning.

Syrians, Lebanese Clash

BERIUT, Lebanon (UPI) — Syrian peace-keeping troops and Lebanese right-wing militiamen clashed today in the fourth straight day of the world fighting since the end of the civil war 18 months ago.

Diplomatic sources estimated that up to 70 people died and many more were wounded in the past three days of clashes between the Syrians and rightist militia units and Lebanese troops.

Rightist militia sources put the casualty figure considerably higher and said many of the dead were Syrian soldiers and Lebanese civilians. The Syrian-dominated Arab peace-keeping force has issued no casualty figures.

Life in Cuba Improved?

MONTREAL, N.C. (UPI) — Cuban Premier Fidel Castro has not restricted religious activities in the island nation since his Communist regime came to power in 1959, according to a Cuban theologian.

The Rev. Sergio Arce of the Matanzas Theological Seminary in Cuba was among lay and church leaders who met this week to discuss plans of the Presbyterian Church in the United States for the coming decade.

Arce said there have been some improvements in the lives of the majority of Cubans under the Castro government.

Secret In My Laundry

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat was in West Germany today as part of his eight-nation crusade to gain support for his Middle East peace initiative. Worried Israeli leaders lobbied in Europe and the United States against American arms sales to Egypt.

Sadat, encouraged by his talks with President Carter and saying peace is possible "in a week" if the Israelis soften their negotiating stand, relaxed in the Bavarian resort town of Dachau, West Germany, for the day.

Ethiopian Troops Advance

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia (UPI) — Ethiopian troops backed by warplanes are advancing steadily in a pincer movement against the Somaliland town of Jigjiga in their week-old offensive to recapture the Ogaden Desert, diplomatic sources said today.

The Ethiopians have gained more than 15 miles and are now about halfway to the strategic former radar base captured by Somali troops late last year, the sources said.

Altamonte Plans 2nd Recreation Center

Plans are underway for the City of Altamonte Springs to acquire a recreation center on the city's west side.

The city commissioners this morning agreed to purchase the Spring Oaks Recreation Center is desirable, but held up completing the purchase until an appraisal is received on 20 acres of city land which may be traded as part of the deal.

Ray T. Dye, president of the Altamonte Park Inc., of Winter Park, which owns the 11-acre developed site at the entrance to Spring Oaks subdivision, north of SR 434 and

route of I-4, outlined his firm's proposal to the board for the facility in a letter to the city.

Dye said that, although the original asking price for the developed center was \$100,000, Mayor Norman Floyd in negotiations over the past several months rejected that price.

Noting the property's current appraised value based on its proposed use is \$100,000, Dye said that the "real value" is "not quite \$100,000."

There are also four tennis courts, two baseball diamonds complete with backstops and a basketball court. The property is entirely fenced with entrance gates and is well landscaped, Floyd said.

In addition to the 11-acres of

land, the property has 11,000 square feet of recreation building designed in use for auditorium, large model room, kitchen area for light preparation of food, office, children's room and a reading room.

There is also a workshop room completely equipped including a work bench, small motorized lift, a garage and numerous tools.

All the commissioners agreed acquisition of the property would be desirable to provide recreation for the west side of the community. The city already has a civic center and recreation property on the east side of town.

But Commissioner Dolores Vickers questioned the advisability of trading the city land. "I would prefer the cash deal," she said, noting her concern over the cost of the facilities involved in the transaction.

Vicks said the recreation property has a \$60,000 mortgage.

All the commissioners agreed acquisition of the property would be desirable to provide recreation for the west side of the community. The city already has a civic center and recreation property on the east side of town.

But Commissioner Dolores Vicks questioned the advisability of trading the city land. "I would prefer the cash deal," she said, noting her concern over the cost of the facilities involved in the transaction.

Vicks said the recreation property is currently being used by many city residents for jogging purposes. She also said she was having difficulty recovering the Bob-Alex asking price when much of the cost of the facilities have been written off by them and because the recreation center was used by them as an investment for personal use by their homes in the Spring Oaks development.

Ban TV Burger, Chips Ads, Consumer Group Asks

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A consumer group wants the government to ban television commercials for high-fat foods such as hamburgers, ice cream and potato chips, particularly those aimed at children.

The Center for Science in the Public Interest, the federal Trade Commission Thursday it would be a step backward to crack down on children's advertising for sugary foods — as FTC is considering — only to

have these commercials replaced by ones for high-fat foods.

"The evidence is abundant that in the diet contributes to cardiovascular disease, our leading cause of death," said Marion Nestle, a researcher for the center.

"International epidemiological studies show a striking association between the fat content of the diet, particularly the saturated fat content, and the risk of heart attack or the severity of atherosclerosis."

She said FTC nutritionists have "been slow to acknowledge the ill effects of high fat foods such as cheese, ice cream, hot dogs, sausages, etc., and have not even begun to consider how such products also have high concentrations of valuable nutrients such as protein, calcium and iron."

She said snack foods that contain saturated and trans fats are also cause for concern.

She added that the FTC has been investigating the safety of fast food products with low fat content as are valuable sources of nutrients.

"The problem is that the 'product' animal products are rarely advertised, while the word of the animal foods dominate the air time devoted to meat and dairy products," she said.

Encounter Of A Nuclear Kind

Fragments being dug out of the ice and snow in northern Canada are all that remain of the Cosmos 954 satellite. But its fiery plunge into the atmosphere may light up the international stage well into the future.

The Russians are in no position to ignore President Carter's call for some kind of assurance that satellites carrying "radioactive" material employ a fail-safe technique to prevent the kind of incident the world just experienced. It was just about that radioactive debris from the defective satellite landed in a remote part of Canada and not in a more populated area.

Both the United States and the Soviet Union have small nuclear reactors integrated to serve as sources of electric power, in addition or as vehicles designed to transmit scientific data from the moon. There are procedures to prevent re-entry of these reactors into the earth's atmosphere in a way that would release radioactivity. Whatever procedure the Russians may have been relying on, it obviously didn't work.

As Mr. Carter says, if there is no fail-safe technology to prevent this kind of accident, then there should be a ban on sending satellites into Earth orbit carrying potentially dangerous nuclear material. But in advancing this idea for a new kind of cooperation or agreement on space technology, Mr. Carter has touched a sensitive nerve — sensitive not just for the Russians but for our own military space program.

Cosmos 954 was a military satellite designed to track shipping and naval movements on the seas passing under it. It apparently carried a nuclear power unit, because its radar required more electricity than could be generated by solar cells, the power source for most scientific satellites. To suggest an exchange of technology on satellite power sources, or an agreement banning nuclear power in earth-orbiting satellites, opens the door on an area of space technology that both the Soviet Union and the United States might prefer to keep closed.

Each relies on observation satellites to keep track of the other's military activities. These satellites are a seldom mentioned factor in strategic arms limitation agreements. We rely on our satellites to monitor Soviet missile deployments and weapons tests. They could detect the launching and trajectory of missiles if they were nuclear war.

Within the last few years, word has surfaced that the Russians are testing weapons designed to blind or destroy our observation satellites — a potentially destabilizing factor in SALT agreements and our deterrent strategy. Last April, Mr. Carter proposed that the United States and the Soviet Union discuss "a commitment not to destroy one another's satellite observation posts."

Cosmos 954 has done more than embarrass the Kremlin and give the rest of the world a scare. It has pulled back the veil on a neglected area of the "arms race." Whatever comes of Mr. Carter's proposals, Congress should assure that the current program to reduce the vulnerability of U.S. observation satellites is as vital to our security as our strategic arsenal.

ANGLE-WALTERS Tax Treaty Sparking Controversy

WASHINGTON — The Senate is preparing for the politically delicate task of ratifying a tax treaty with a nation that long has been a thorn in the side of the United States.

But this post has nothing whatever to do with the Panama Canal.

It's the proposed United States-United Kingdom Tax Treaty, a less publicized document, but one that probably will have a substantially greater impact on most Americans and the taxes they pay.

The leading tax official in President Carter's home state of Georgia warns the Senate committee on the treaty will constitute "a total federal cap" on the amount of compensation (corporations) at the expense of workers, small business and the states.

In a recent letter to Carter, W.E. Shultz, chairman of Georgia's Department of Revenue, predicted that approval of the treaty with Great Britain "will result in a tax avoidance bonanza to those corporations of hundreds of millions of dollars."

Rep. Al Ulmer, D-Ga., chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, with jurisdiction over all federal tax legislation, fears ratification could establish a dangerous precedent because the treaty is "the first (to) attempt to restrict the taxing authority of state and local governments."

At least 27 senators — ranging from liberal Democrats Edward M. Kennedy of Massachusetts and Wendell R. Anderson of Minnesota to conservative Republicans R.J. Dole of Kansas and Clifford P. Hansen of Wyoming — oppose the treaty on similar grounds.

Yet the document may soon be ratified because of a hydrogen bomb explosion last week by the Treasury Department and a condition of many of the world's largest and most influential multinationals corporations.

The controversy centers around one section of the treaty that would prohibit states from taxing the "military method" of assessing corporate taxes and would require instead an approach known as the "arm's-length method."

Under the "military method," revenue officials examine a corporation's worldwide sales, property and payroll, then levy a tax based on the proportionate share of business attributable to that state.

The "arm's-length method," however, allows only examination of the finances of corporations' shareholders or affiliates within the particular state. Then, a company can avoid taxes by keeping transfers of profits to foreign units.

Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, says his committee has "had the opportunity to look at the treaty's future implementation in light of the needs of the American people."

The three states that most aggressively utilize the "military method" — and thus stand to lose the most revenue — are California, Alaska and Oregon.

Romance Of The Marshal And Jurors

WASHINGTON — U.S. marshals are supposed to remove jurors from outside influences that might interfere with a defendant's constitutional right to a fair trial.

But shooting, secret evidence has been developed that several federal marshals seriously compromised the jurors who returned a guilty verdict against a leading New Jersey political figure. The incident raises questions about the conduct of U.S. marshals in other cases.

The secret evidence has been laid before Federal Judge Lawrence Whipple in his chambers. He has issued stern orders to everyone involved in the scandal not to talk to the press. We have been able nevertheless, to dig out the details.

The story grew out of the 1974 conviction of New Jersey's former Republican Party leader, Nelson Green, for tax fraud. He was sentenced to two years in prison and was paroled after five months.

But last February the marshal who had been assigned to oversee the criminal Grand Jury, Leon Howell, told the FBI that he and other marshals had harassed some of the jurors during the trial.

Howell agreed that he wound up having secret meetings with the jury "for the convenience of wanting to cover and make out with her."

He has expanded upon his affidavit during five days of closed hearings before Judge

Anderson.

Along the way, I continue to hear words in the affidavit and judge's secret panel have walked in. No members of the grand jury were present.

Anderson got underway on April 10.





Heat Pump Cools, Heats And Saves Energy Too

In these days we need to do everything possible to conserve energy. We use, yet still live comfortably, such as having adequate heating and cooling in the home.

There is one device — the heat pump — that meets these requirements by providing maximum heating comfort in the winter and cooling in the summer and at the same time saving energy, according to the Union Electric Gasoline Co.

When it is heated, the heat pump takes the heat from the outside air and pumps it into the home. For cooling the unit does just the reverse — it removes the heat from the inside air and pumps it outside just like any air conditioner.

At the same time it filters the air of impurities, thereby reducing your cleaning chores. During the summer, though, even the most heat-dissipating air conditioners become less efficient, and since windows are kept closed, summer dirt, dust and noise are greatly reduced.

Because windows and doors can be the chief culprit is kept out of the home — welcome news for allergy sufferers.

The same compressor, fan and refrigerant coils that provide cooling also provide heating. This means you can install one coil for your central air conditioning system — one for heating and one for cooling.

The air, whether warmed or cooled, is distributed through

central system and circulated through ductwork into every room.

Electric duct heaters are usually added to provide supplemental heat in very cold weather and are automatically controlled.

A more recent development heating-cooling thermal control is the operation of the heat pump. This thermostat senses the need for heating or cooling and switches back and forth automatically, according to the temperature inside your home.

When it comes to saving energy this comfort-conditioning system uses energy as efficiently that on an average heat cycle it saves 1½ to 3 times as much as ordinary electric heaters.

That is, the unit produces more units of heat for each unit of electricity needed to operate it, thus saving both money and energy.

What's more, you pay for kilowatt-hours of elec-

tricity. So the more heat you get for each kilowatt-hour the less costs you to warm your home.

And because it delivers more units of heat for each unit of electricity, the heat pump helps to conserve electric power by cutting down on electric heat pump usage too. Some units are completely self-contained.

Others, which are called split-systems, have part of the equipment indoors and part outdoors. Part of the system inside the house includes a cabinet, coil and blower and can be located about anywhere — in a basement, attic, or closet, or even inside a crawl space.

The other part, including compressor and coil, is located next to the house and can blend inconspicuously with your landscaping.

Properly installed and maintained, an electric heat pump will provide all the comfort you'll need throughout the year. The increase in the commercial market has also been great.

Properly installed and maintained, an electric heat pump goes back to 1982 when Ward Kevin, a Scottish physician, first invented the device for his work in the

applied field of electricity.

He used a compressor as a "heat pump" and as a means of heating buildings to replace equipment for direct burning of fuels.

Several working models were built but the heat pump remained largely idle until production of pilot models in the 1960's.

These pilot models led to field testing of experimental models in the 1960's and then to the introduction of the heat pump in a commercial area of the country in the early 1960's.

On Medicare Fraud

Altamonte Business Couple To Federal Prison

After calculating legal expenses, the co-owners of an Altamonte Springs company that rents respirators to Medicare patients have begun serving federal prison terms for Medicare fraud.

The two are Lois and Boyd Evans, owners of Complete Breathing Care Inc., 791 State Road 434. Mr. and Mrs. Evans were indicted by an Orlando grand jury in August 1975 for making false statements to the Federal Department of Health, Education and Welfare concerning their company's efforts to recruit Medicare patients to begin using their equipment.

Mr. and Mrs. Evans were sentenced by Federal District Court Judge John A. Reed Jr. Complete Breathing Care has said 19 senior citizens, who live all over Florida, requested the circuit court to give the company a respite from the law.

advised its services in signing her to a lease for a respirator and that the company would remove the respirator from her home after three months as she requested.

The woman, Gertie Chaudoin, of Altamonte, had a respirator in her Feb. 3 contract and agreed to Complete Breathing Care's November 1977 suit demanding \$8,138 plus interest from her, that the company violated Florida's Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act, the state's commercial code and federal Medicare regulations.

Mrs. Chaudoin asks circuit court to order Complete Breathing Care to pay her a total of \$24,500 in punitive and general damages, court costs, attorney fees and reasonable expenses for the machine at her home after she requested the company to remove the machine.

Mrs. Chaudoin is represented by Donna Erlich, staff attorney for the Sanford office of Central Florida Legal Services, which provides legal assistance in non-criminal matters to those who can't afford an attorney.



Crowds Dwindle, But 'They Still Come'

MINNEAPOLIS (UPI) — The little boy gripped his father's knuckles, walked wonderingly toward the artificial grass and dropped a rosebud which would freeze and turn brown in hours. Only a temporary marker distinguishes the grave of Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey, who died of cancer at his lake front home in Waverly, Minn., a month ago Monday.

The huge crowds that passed his grave at Lakewood Cemetery in the early days have dwindled to a trickle. Traffic control no longer is necessary.

"But they still come," said David Hatlestad, executive secretary of the Minnesota Cemetery Association. "A few drop flowers, like the child with the rosebud. The flowers die quickly, but we remove them regularly."

Humphrey's death created a vacuum — and led to, perhaps, the most tumultuous period in Minnesota's political history.

Muriel Humphrey was named to take her husband's place in the Senate, supposedly as a "caretaker." But she threw the political scene into deeper chaos, hinting she may run for the four unexpired years of his term.

Others who long had coveted the seat were thrown into disarray.

"No one can run against the Humphrey name in Minnesota,"

"We've sold out three shipments already," said Brenda Bergquist, book buyer for Powers, Minneapolis. "It's selling steadily all the time."

Hatlestad said there had been a number of inquiries from people wanting to buy or about buying a cemetery lot in the area where Humphrey is buried.

The Rev. Calvin Didier, 56, pastor of the House of Hope Presbyterian Church who conducted Humphrey's funeral service,

has become a minor clerical celebrity.

"We've received hundreds of letters, well over a thousand," Kathleen Bovey, Didier's secretary, said. "They were very complimentary. Many asked for a transcript of the service. Many said they had been away from the church for a long time, and said they thought it might be time to try it again."

The church is crowded with visitors, especially on Sunday, Miss Bovey said.

One visitor during the funeral period stole an antique cross made in Germany more than 150 years ago. It hasn't been returned, Miss Bovey said.

Humphrey's favorite granddaughter was Vicki Solomonson, a retarded child of 17, suffering from Down's Syndrome. Humphrey had explained his terminal cancer to her and told her he was going to die.

Vicki lives at the Louise Whittbeck Fraser School for the Retarded in Richfield, and, according to the director, is doing well.

"She talks about her grandmother's death and has kept a scrapbook of everything she can lay her hands on about him," Robert Kowalczyk, the school's director, said. "At times she gets sad, but we're really proud of her."

CPers Get A Chance

Courage. That's what it's all about. Michael Wesley has a king-sized helping of it.

So does Wilma DeBush, 20, who is Michael's wife.

Both are students at Crooms High School.

Both have cerebral palsy.

Michael and Wilma are getting the chance to find out just how far they can go. Apparently that's going to be a very long distance.

Wilma, her eyes studiously closed to the hoop in her hands, does delicately detailed embroidery in brilliant colors, and shyly allows it to be seen and praised by teachers and visitors at the school.

Michael spends a lot of time at a loom, weaving, making hangings to sell to faculty and students.

Both participate in the vocational-educational program at Crooms, and both have regular contact with the CP Center in Orlando.

All the CP literature and personnel take care to point out that, despite the handicaps CP can cause, it does not necessarily result in damage to intelligence.

A few minutes with either Wilma or Michael affirms that fact. While Wilma is shy and Michael aggressive, both are able to communicate their thoughts and needs.

But such abilities are not always recognized, even by attending physicians.

"Michael was a patient at Sunland in Gainesville before he came to us," says John Dimitry, work-study coordinator for exceptional children at Crooms.

But Sunland was providing little, if anything, beyond institutionalized apathy to Michael, and one day, "his mother went and picked him up and brought him here to us and said, 'I want him to go to school,'" Dimitry remembers.

Dimitry's program, which includes Michael, Wilma, two other CP victims and 123 other students, provides job training in a variety of areas for handicapped students.

"We have body repair, industrial arts, carpentry, painting, automobile repair, business education including use of bookbinding, printing and other electric equipment," Dimitry points out with pride.

"We also have a complete institutional kitchen and the students have received two contracts in the past to provide hot meals to the elderly in Sanford. We hope to
