

Jap Reserves Advance For All-Out Assault On British In Burma

Bataan Defenders Repulse New Attack, Frustrate Landing Attempt By Enemy

The Japanese continued the offensive in Burma, bringing up new reinforcements for an all-out attack; the invaders pushed 16 miles north of Prome, and Japanese planes bombed British positions on the western side of the front. The Japanese continued land and air attacks on the Chinese defenses to the east.

The War Department announced that American and Filipino forces in Bataan repulsed another heavy attack yesterday and frustrated a new attempt to land Japanese troops on the east coast of the peninsula.

"Some small gains" were reported yesterday for the Japanese forces in the right center of Lieutenant General Jonathan M. Wainwright's line.

The fighting raged all day Saturday, a communique said. It was the fifth major assault by the invaders in less than two weeks and appeared to be the most intense thus far.

A new attack was made on the eastern shore of the peninsula from Manila Bay, which enemy warships were not entering because of the island fortifications at the entrance.

Barges, which officials believed to have been improvised, landed and several were sunk by American-Filipino artillery before the rest turned back to the main beach.

No estimate was given on the number of Japanese casualties in the sinking of the invasion barges, but since the communique mentioned the sinking of "several," it was believed that as many as 1000 of the enemy may have been wiped out in this manner—either drowned or blown to bits by the American-Filipino guns. The barges carry an average of about 160 men each.

Yankees Escape Bombs Placed In Ireland Theater

BELFAST, Northern Ireland, Apr. 6.—The Harbinger explosion of three incendiary bombs and discovery of others hidden in a theater used by United States and British troops, and a subsequent running gun battle between police and armed band members of the Belfast Easter rebellion.

There was no ostensible connection between the two incidents, which occurred on the same day, according to police officials.

The outburst followed a recent series of arrests among alleged members of the Irish republican army in northern Ireland. Hundreds of extra police had been turned out here Sunday in anticipation of just such incidents to commemorate the 1916 Easter rebellion.

Examination of four unexploded bombs found in the theater showed them to be incendiary in nature, officials said, in a type used by the Germans.

After a thorough search of the place a special guard was posted until tonight as 1500 troops and members of women's auxiliary services attended a concert.

The time bombs started exploding shortly after midnight and after the theater had been emptied of its Saturday night audience of soldiers.

The all-India radio today broadcast Sydney dispatches reporting additional small Japanese landings on the Solomon Islands, including New Caledonia and New Hebrides.

Tokyo reported Japanese land units were shelling and heavily damaging Colombo, Ceylon.

While the Tokyo government spoke of attacking the British Forces in India, along with the whole British Empire, the United States government today said it was not sending warships west to the Pacific, the Indian Ocean, or the Bay of Bengal.




