SCC funding a top priority

Dead last in state funding, college officials lobby state legislators

SANPORD - Like a rock group touring the nation peddling its newest album release, Seminole Community College (SCC) President E. Ann McGee and other college officials have been on the dircult of local governments and organ-Izations the past months.

At stake is much more than a hit single, but the future of the Sanfordbased education institution and its 35,000 students. From the Lake Mary City Commission meeting Dec. 4 to the Seminole County Legislative Delegation Monday, SCC officials are asking for more state funding and, more importantly,

The college has plenty of facts to

support its case as it often passes out a 10-question "pop quiz" to the audience as it makes it presentation on its dire fiscal situation. The most glaring two facts are SCC is the fastest-growing community college in Florida the past five years, but it ranks last out of 28 community colleges in the state for funding.

"It's not a good situation," McGee said. "It's at the critical point."



Iraqi Diary: Familiar road turns deadly


Editor's note: Staff Sgt. Charlie C. Carlson III, son of Sanford historian Charlie C. Carlson II, is deployed in Baghdad as part of the 549th Military Police Company. He is providing the Herald with a journal of his experiences.

30 Nov. 2003 Tonight we came down Route Aeros to base camp. About 30 minutes after getting here, we heard a loud explosion and I was informed that another patrol had been hit with an IED at the same location on Route Aeros that we had passed just 30 minutes earlier. We went back out there with medics to take care of any injuries. It turned out that no US forces were involved, but

three innocent local Iraqis in a small white car were injured.

We searched the area still wary of any secondary devices because insurgents usually blow one IED which causes U.S. Forces to show up, then detonate a second one. This is the third time I came

close to buying the farm. It even blew up on the right side of the road — which is the side I would have been sitting on in the vehicle — on the same road we came back to Camp Mariboro on. Maybe I have nine lives like a bazoon (Iraci for cat). If so, I have about six



There was a small shack about 100 meters off the road. so we went up there with weapons drawn to ask the occupant if he saw anything. We saw a small light on inside and had the interpreter call for him. The man came out with his hands up, and we asked

in the mud every-

During our search

him questions to see what he knew. He did not know anything. Then I saw movement behind the curtain. We were at the ready, but it turned out to be his wife and two kids. I then saw movement by the corner of his house. Again we were on edge, but it was a donkey. The donkey had noth-

ing to say. Yesterday, we were lead patrol and received a call about a fire fight in the northwest corner of Sadir City. We headed up that way but found nothing. Then we were informed the assailants were in a green BMW with the back window shot out. We moved

Cities, county eye state money

SANFORD - More than two dozen cities, elected officials, schools, organizations and groups converged on the county commission chambers Monday to direct their concerns to the Seminole County Legislative

Delegation. The annual public meeting is not only an opportunity for the delegation to hear presenters sound off on legislative affairs, but provides local governments a chance to lobby state leaders to fund hometown projects. Citles and counties have seen few state dollars during two lean budget years, but Tallahassee could be ready to resume funding some local needs.
"With \$1 billion in sales

tax revenues that weren't expected, they (state legislature) feel like number of projects doable this year," said

Ces Lawton, a lobbyist for Oviedo and possibly Longwood in the near future. Which projects will survive the budget axe may be determined by how the county's state representatives, such as Dayld Simmons (R-Longwood) and Dayld Mealor (R-Lake Mary) and state senators including and state senators, including Lee Constantine Altamonte Springs) and Anna Cowin (R-Leesburg), perceive the need.

Tops on Seminole County's list is for the state to share the financial burden of Article V, Revision 7. The voter-approved referendum in 1998 turns the county's court systems over to the state, but will cost Seminole about \$1 million annually, said County Comm-McLain. issioner Daryi Implementation of Revision 7 will take effect on July 1,

Similar to the other six cities in the county, the city of Sanford has projects it would like the state to fund. City Manager Al Grieshaber cited four stormwater projects; in the area behind the new Farmers' Market at 13th Street and Elm Avenue, which will allow the city to develop a public safety com-plex; in the area of First Street in the city's down-town; and Fort Mellon Park; and the fourth is near Lake Monroe where the city has a sewer infiltration problem.

"Stormwater -- being that Sanford is a low-level lying area — la a major problem and it impacts our development in the area," Grieshaber

Not all local projects are considered a top priority by the state legislature or the governor's office, and in the past, Sanford has submitted about four items they would like to see state funded. The


city is often lucky to have but one project considered. "I don't think I have to tell you or anyone else here, but when it comes to things people refer to as local projects the governor's office has a different view if whether the


Routine traffic stop for Casselberry police nets three arrests of teen-age suspected burglars

County Sheriff's Office started receiving calls from the Deer Run area about vehicle burglaries - 16 total. Many of the vehicles had been left unsecured, and thieves used the opportunity to take items from inside.

Deputies were able to match some

items, found in the vehicle that Casselberry authorities stopped, to missing items reported in the burglaries.

Manis, Hudson, and the juvenile, 17year old LeRoy Machuca, were arrested as suspects in the 16 burglaries on Thursday, Authorities also expect to arrest the other juvenile, who was let go after the traffic stop. The charges are third degree felonies.

In addition, it's believed Manis is linked to nine other vehicle burglaries that were reported in the Trinity Bay subdivision on Tuesday, Dec. 2. An unnamed suspect and the juvenile that is being sought, may have also had a hand in those cases. It's also possible the group may be responsible for vehicle burglaries in the District 4 (unincorporated Oviedo) area.



NASA assists Sanford firm in production capabilities

The NASA-funded Space Alliance Technology Outreach Program (SATOP) has helped Seminole County manufacturer R. L Best Company improve its production capa-

SATOP provides free engineering assistance to small businesses with technical challenges through the donations of time and expertise from 40 Space Alliance Partners throughout the country.

Founded in 1967, R. L. Best manufactures large tonnage hydraulic presses that extrude aluminum billets, which produce items such as windows, doors and screened patio enclosures for the construction industry.

The need arose for R.L. Best to design a container assembly, which would maintain a specified temperature gradient along the length of the billet that is inserted during extrusion. However, the company was having difficulty attaining the correct tempera-ture gradient throughout the

container. "We needed zoned heat that would gradually increase toward the center of the container. What we didn't know was how to obtain that temperature gradient, what radial diameter to put the heaters on and what wattage to use,"

explained Ted Best, R. L. Best vice-president. "After trying some hand calculations on our own, we took the problem to one of our vendors, but the challenge proved to be outside their technical realm as well."

Best then heard about SATOP through the Metro Economic Orlando Development Commission. After Best completed a Request for Technical Assistance (RTA), the project was assigned to Jim Jones, a senior analyst with Design By Analysis, Inc. (DBA), a new Alliance Partner based in New Britain, Conn.

R. L. Best provided DBA with drawings of the container, a description of the prob-lem and what attempts had been made to find a solution. Armed with this information, Jones employed the use of specialized software to build a transient thermal analysis.

Jones quickly analyzed the container until he was able to identify the approximate desired thermal gradient.

"I modeled the components using advanced simulation software and gave the results to R. L. Best," said Jones. "After confirming that they correlated with the test results, I identified a method for R. L. Best to use their own in-house software to make future

they have the methodology to predict the temperature gradients and to make accurate design decisions themselves."

"Thanks to SATOP and DBA, we have designed a new container that is currently being tested," said Best. "Their model has given us a technical advantage and allowed us to see what's happening with the heat transfer inside the container. We could not do this without DBA's analysis."

The entire request for technical assistance took less than two months to complete from start to finish, at no cost to the R. L. Best Company.

"All of us at R. L. Best think SATOP is a fantastic program and hope to use them again for future technical challenges," said Mr. Best. "We are very pleased with how quickly everyone was able to respond and get the job done."





through the area in search of the vehicle. Never found it.

We headed back to Camp Marlboro, with my vehicle in the lead, when I saw a teenage boy waving his arms in front of my truck. The boy then lifts his shirt up and pretends he is drawing a weapon. Then he waves his arms as if to say he was only joking. My gunner yelled at him "Don't [deleted] play that crap with me.'

Needless to say this kid came near losing his life, and would have if Raymaker had fired the M249. That was stupid to play that kind of joke on us, espedally with a patrol on the lookout for someone trying to shoot at us or blow us up.

1 Dec. 2003 We have been alerted to take part in a special operation coming up, but I cannot talk about it other than it will be a big time raid to mot out insurgents. Actually, I don't even know much about it at

this point, but I don't like the sound of it. Until then there will be a blackout of communications. When we finish I will let you know what we did.

6 Dec. 2003 The raid went well and I'm still alive. We had no casualties. You won't get this one on the regular news, as they have really kept a lid on it. It was a big event involving arms dealers suspected of being in a rural area, a village in northeastern Baghdad.

We got up at 0400 and moved in on the objective at 0730 with Kiowa choppers flying aerial support. We moved in chalks. I was chalk leader of six soldiers, four Iraqi police and an interpreter. We stormed in on one house then leapfrogged from house to house, busting down doors and searching houses. We were scared and they were scared. We were part of a larger group made up of 80 Iraqi police, the

I got one AK-47, some grenades and a magazine out of one house. During the search of one house, I went into the bedroom, which was the only room in this house, that had only a dirt floor. The first thing I saw was a chicken standing in the middle of the bed.

In another house, there was a covered area with cows standing around, and two little rooms. We had to search those places but first we had to make our way through the cows to get in there. It looked like a living Nativity scene.

I moved in to search the first room and one of the cows started urinating like Niagra Falls. As I turned to see what was going on and to keep from get-

ting splashed, another cow charged at me "full steam." All this was while the other one was still in "full stream." My soldiers all jumped back and laughed. We finally got the cows occupied and proceeded to search the room. One of the Iraqi police went into the other room and a bunch of chickens exited the room through a little opening. We tried to look into the opening with a flashlight but chickens kept coming out of it so it was hard to see anything. Every time I looked in a squawking chicken would come out.

The operation was a success, not because we found anything of significance but because none of us were hurt or killed, and that is the only thing that really counts in this war. In our book, progress means just staying alive here or not having your body parts blown off. None of it has anything to do with the popular notion that we are defending the U.S., it has to do with defending ourselves until we can get out of

We were surprised upon returning to camp when we found the first care package box had arrived from The Seminole Herald. The troops decided to dive into it and not wait for Christmas. This was the box marked "Number 1."

They devoured the contents in a half an hour. It was a great way to cap off the end of a high-risk mission. Now everyone is excited about the other boxes arriving, which should not be far behind.

8 Dec. 2003 Today we escorted some Iraqi workers and kept control over them in a small area of abandoned buildings which used to be a training ground for the old Iraqi army. There were 83 Iraqi workers with 30 MPs watching over them. We could not watch them all so we just kept the area they were working in boxed-in with roving patrols.

I got to explore the old buildings and found some old land mines and a sand table (a table with a sand top used for planning military operations) and a leg from a mannequin. The mannequin leg is now in

Almost all the soldiers in my squad, who were eligible, have had some leave time or some form of R&R. I'm the only squad leader in the company that has not had any leave or time off for nearly nine months. Now they say they are terminating the 15-day leave program for our unit beginning in

that may soon change. Longwood city commissioners met Tuesday evening and tentatively agreed to move forward with a contract for Lawton's services. Hired two years ago by Oviedo, Lawton, of Casselberry-based Harbour Communications, is confident he will bring home funding to both cities this

Year.
"The mood right now in Tallahassee is a matching fund type mood," he said. "When you get into local projects the governor's office has trouble. They want them to cross city, county boundaries, however, when you're matching they feel they're getting the bang for their buck."

Several conditions are working in both citi to receive state funding this year, he said. Although he has been unable to secure state monies for Oviedo since he has been hired, he feels he has laid the groundwork for the city to snag a \$250,000 weatherization grant in 2004. The item was slashed from last year's budget as were all other member sponsored projects.

As for Longwood, the city could be looking for partial state funding for its proposed fire station on the east side of town. It is an ideal project because of the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001 and the emphasis it left on the country for public sai and homeland secu according to Lawton.

"(Sanford) was going after stormwaler, which is not a very sexy thing right now," he said. "But matching funds are the key.

"The city of Longwood has never made application under a member project. The case can be made that we are due, and that's my job."

A variable that might work in all the local governments favor during the upcoming legislative session that starts the first week in March is the power of Seminole County's state leaders.

Representatives Mealor and Simmons sit on a horde of committees, including Mealor as chair of Subcommittee on Higher Education and Simmons as chair of the Education Appropriations Subcommittee. State senators representing Seminole. County also carry a lot of weight in Tallahassee as Constantine is chair of Education and Cowin is chair of Election and Ethics.

"And let's face it, next year is an election (year), which works in our favor," Lawton said.

expecting, is some equity and lairness of how SCC is treated in comparison to other community colleges," said Debbie Clements, a member of the SCC Foundation. "We don't think it is a good thing that we are the 10th largest, the fastest growing in the last five years and yet we are dead last in funding. It is not something that we are terribly proud for a county that supposedly values education in such a

huge way."

The college has offset some of the state financial shortcomings by augmenting its own budget with local dollars. SCC raised \$2.8 million in the local construction industry to build a new construction trade building, \$16 million from federal grants and awards, and the SCC Foundation has collected more than \$6 million in donations.

This year, SCC has secured a \$2.5 million donation from the Central Florida's Auto Dealers Association to construct an auto technology center. In attendance at Seminole County Legislative Delegation were the leaders from the auto dealers association, who hoisted a green sign that read "match our local funds."

We have every reason to believe that the match will be otally funded," said Rep. David Mealor (R-Lake Mary). The K-20 system is to promote, recognize and reward excellence. We need to do a better job

of rewarding it." Rewarding SCC with more dollars in 2004 may not be enough for some local governmental leaders who want to see more equitable funding for the

college every year.

This is a classic case, in my opinion, of being penalized for success," said Lake Mary Commissioner Mike McLean. "It's an embarrassment for the folks that are handling the dol-

lars in Tallahassee. However, state leaders representing Seminole County are battling several fronts in an effort to furnel more money to SCC. According to McGee, it is the growth in Central Florida that is hurting the community colleges and the University of Central Florida. In Seminole County alone it is estimated that population by 2020 will increase by more than 40 percent, which could translate into an additional 26,000 students for SCC.

"The reality is the system is growing and the entire system s under funded," McGee said.

Valencia Community College is in a similar financial situation as it is ranked only one spot ahead of SCC in state funding. The Orange Countybased college chose not to grow this year because of fiscal restraints and turned away

about 3,000 students.

SCC's enrollment increased this year, but the college couldn't enroll about 1,000 students. The new growth was funded by raising funds from the community, tapping into reserves and forcing students to underwrite the increase. Florida community colleges are typically funded 75 percent from the state and 25 percent from student fees. At SCC, students shoulder about 34 percent of the school's

Another problem is that not all SCC students are contributing. As the designated area vucational technology college, about 33 percent of SCCs students do not pay fees that help fund the school. By law, workforce programs such as the law enforcement academy, construction trades and adult basic education, are not required to pay student activity fees.

The college has increased its capacity by building new facili-ties. Its Oviedo campus opened three years ago with a student population of 1,200. This year the campus is serving more than 8,000 students. Two more campuses are planned in Altamonte Springs and Heathnow and are projected to

be open in spring of 2006. "We can get the money to build from the state, we can't get the money to operate. That's our problem," McGee said.

The two future campuses are estimated to cost more than \$35 million and SCC needs about \$10 million more from the state to finish construction, but new buildings don't help much

without any new teachers to staff them, McGee said.

The proposed Altamonte Springs campus at Maitland Boulevard and State Road 434 is a seven-story building that would help overcrowding at the current. Hunt. Club. mini-campus and better serve the southwest corner of Seminole County. The Heathrow campus is more of an economic development campus, which is an important aspect of SCC, Miller said.

The college is the third largest employer in Seminole County with more than 1,600 workers and a payroll of more than \$31 million. It also purchases about \$15 million annually in goods and services from local businesses, he said.

"We are a pretty important business element of Seminole County and the community,"

Miller said. The Seminole County Legislative Delegation understands SCC's plight and value to the community, but are faced with an inadequate funding formula for all community colleges. Crafted three years ago, the formula allows underfunded colleges to share new monies put toward community colleges.

The problem is no new funds have been appropriated for community colleges in the last several years, and the legisla-ture hasn't exactly followed the formula, McGee sald. Smaller community colleges from "more powerful" areas of the state have had funds shifted their way.

"One of the things, by defini-

tion, that has been a concern is that there really hasn't been a coordinated effort and plan from the community colleges to come up with this equitable funding," said Sen. Lee Constantine (R-Altamonte Springs). "And we would really like to see that come from that end of it. As you know it has been a number of them fighting among themselves and that has caused us some grave

At the forefront of the funding formula problem, is McGee. As president of Florida Association of Community Colleges, she's in the position to unite community colleges on the funding dilemma. It's a task, however, that is easier said than

"I can't get a 36-member leg-

islative delegation to pull money away from Dade County," she said.

Rep. David Simmons (R-Longwood) took exception to SCC's funding cry, saying it was "not fair to this delegation." He said the Seminole County Legislative Delegation did a "tremendous job" for funding community colleges in the state last year - more than that was proposed by the governor.

"I think what community colleges need to do is get their houses in order of how they want their funding formula," he said. "I suggest to SCC is that they stand up to community colleges saying this is not fair and we're not going to live

Simmons suggested that he

head up redrafting the funding formula if community colleges can't come together with its own plan. It's a plan that McGee can't necessarily support because of her position on the community colleges association.

'In all fairness, Simmons said last year 'Why don't I just pull out some dollars and give it to you," McGee said.

It was an offer that was tempting, but not doable with her visible position.

"I don't want her to have to answer questions like this because she's made an agreement with 27 other community colleges," Miller sald.

"I need to be a team player, but the reality is over the years we have been hurt," McGee

The game featured Central Florida's most outior football players and cheerleaders and the game again raised a lot of money for Special Olympics


Florida. Trailing 6-0 at halftime, Sloan put the East ahead when he scored from four-yards out early in the third






